I. BACKGROUND

The Democratic Governance and Poverty Reduction Unit (DGPRU) at UNDP Indonesia works with the government and other stakeholders to ensure inclusive and sustainable development across Indonesia. DGPRU provides policy advice and tools to fight exclusion and marginalization in rural and urban areas in an effort to reduce poverty. Moreover, DGPRU works to develop the capacity of local governments to formulate strategies and public policies that promote democratic values, human development, and achieve the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

Given rapid urbanization across Indonesia, DGPRU is looking to enhance engagement in urban areas by using UNDP's comparative advantage and experience to support capacity building and offer technical assistance to city governments. This vision is aligned with the 2030 Agenda as well as poverty reduction and human development efforts that look to improve the livelihoods of the poor and vulnerable groups. Furthermore, the unit is seeking to fulfill this goal by improving the quality of basic services and ensuring better access to public services for urban dwellers.

Objective

Under the overall supervision of the Head of DGPRU, the individual consultant will work with another consultant to develop a social mapping of the main urban stakeholders and initiatives in Indonesia which can present UNDP with an entry point to become engaged by addressing existing gaps in the system. To this end the following questions/areas must be addressed by the individual consultant (IC):

- Identify the biggest actors and stakeholders initiating urban-related projects in Indonesia;
- 2. Identify the top 10 largest urban-related projects in Indonesia;
- 3. Identify the top 10 global donors of urban initiatives and specify the thematic areas of the projects;
- 4. Identify the top 10 donors of urban initiatives in Indonesia and specify the thematic areas of the projects;
- 5. Identify the top 10 private sector donors for urban-related projects in Indonesia and the thematic areas of their projects; and
- 6. What are the main gaps in government, private, and non-profit urban initiatives?

II. SCOPE OF WORK, ACTIVITIES, AND DELIVERABLES

Scope of Work

The consultant is expected to have a comprehensive understanding of the political landscape in Indonesia regarding current urban policies and infrastructures, and be able to pinpoint key opportunities for UNDP to collaborate with relevant stakeholders and partners. To this end, the expected tasks that are to be undertaken by consultant include:

- liaising with the public, private, and non-profit sectors;
- mapping out key experts, partners, and stakeholders that have direct relevance to urban development in Indonesia;
- drafting and editing white paper and several concept notes;
- developing a strategy in response to existing gaps;
- conducting desk research.
