BACKGROUND

Globally the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) partners with people at all levels of society to help build nations that can withstand crisis, and drive and sustain growth that improves the quality of life for everyone. On the ground in more than 170 countries and territories, UNDP offers a global perspective, as well as local insights to help empower lives and build resilient nations.

UNDP in Asia and the Pacific has 24 Country Offices and works regionally from the Bangkok Regional Hub. Our work covers 36 countries and territories, from the world's most populous nation to the smallest island territory. Guided by the UNDP's Strategic Plan, the Bangkok Regional Hub supports governments in the region by providing policy and technical expertise on sustainable development, democratic governance and peacebuilding, and climate and disaster resilience in countries across the region with an overarching effort on achieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

The Regional Communications team at the UNDP Bangkok Regional Hub is responsible for producing a variety of content including video production both for its Headquarter, the Bangkok Regional Hub and Country Offices. The Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) Team is implementing a regional project funded by the Government of Japan that requires producing videos of tsunami awareness drills in six countries in the Asia Pacific region. The DRR team, working closely with the Regional Communications team, therefore intends to hire two Individual Contractors for this purpose.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Scope of Work

Two positions of Videographer/ Editor will provide end to end multi-media support to the Regional Communications team and the DRR team that includes communications plan development, video production, training and editing.

Together, both consultants are expected to deliver nine videos across six countries. These are:

- Two 3-5 minute videos on Tsunami drills in Solomon Islands (SI) in September and Indonesia in October to be presented at a high-level event in Geneva in October 2017.
- Two generic videos (one each for SI and Indonesia) that visualize the tsunami threat and need for preparedness, using material already filmed.
- In Fiji, Samoa, Maldives and Viet Nam, the consultants will train students to develop storylines and film the drills, and produce four short videos (60-90 seconds). The consultants will act as the trainer and director, overseeing the production of the students' videos. Upon the completion of the training and filming with the students, the consultants will edit together one consolidated video combining the stories from the four countries. These videos (along with

those presented in Geneva) will be presented at a high-level event in New York in early November 2017 to mark World Tsunami Awareness Day.

The drills will be scheduled between August and October 2017, and some will occur simultaneously.

All videos will be produced as separate versions with English-language sub-titles, Japanese-language sub-titles, and a Clean version without subtitles, music or logos.

Expected Outputs

The consultants are	required to	perform the	following tasks:
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- Work with the UNDP teams on developing storylines for all videos;
- Liaise with the relevant COs in developing a communications plan;
- Develop storylines, film and edit the videos for SI and Indonesia (2+2 Videos);
- Develop storylines, train and assist students with film and audio, and edit footage in Fiji, Samoa, Maldives and Viet Nam (4+1 video);
- Incorporate sub-titles, logos etc.; and
- Finalize videos after feedback and approval.

The final products must be tailored to UNDP specifications.

The consultants under this contract are required to:

- Possess ability to shoot broadcast quality video
- Possess ability to shoot using smartphones
- Possess ability to record high quality audio
- Be able to perform editing and logging of footage linked to UNDP work
- Own or have access to filming and editing equipment
- Be able to craft productions based on UNDP needs and feedback
- Be able to train on video and audio recording
- Be able to deliver end to end multimedia support

The deliverables are:

- 1. 9 professional videos in HD (varying lengths)
- 2. Professional Japanese and English sub-title text
- 3. 1 HDD with all relevant usable footage logged by country and location

Intellectual Property:

All information and production of video pertaining to the assignments as well as outputs produced under this contract shall remain the property of the UNDP who shall have exclusive rights over their use. The products shall not be disclosed to the public nor used in whatever format without written permission of UNDP in line with the national and International Copyright Laws applicable.

Institutional Arrangement

Under the overall guidance of the Regional Communications team, the Videographer/Editor will report to the Communications Unit and the DRR teams in the UNDP Country Offices where relevant to the assignment. The assigned UNDP staff member(s) will work closely with the Videographer/Editor to ensure timely delivery of expected outputs for each assignment.

The successful candidates will provide technical support to the Communications and DRR teams and ensure that all deliverables follow UNDP relevant communications guidelines, provide the best possible functionality and usability to UNDP partners.

Duration of the Assignment

This assignment is expected to be intermittently at a maximum of 74 working days, over a duration of 6 months from July to December 2017. Since several activities are likely to occur simultaneously, the number of days will be divided between the two consultants depending on their availability and as agreed to by the UNDP teams during the finalizing of the work plan and timelines.

Duty Station

The consultants will work home-based with travel to the 6 countries for filming and training.

Price Proposal and Schedule of Payments

Daily Fee. Consultant shall quote an all-inclusive Daily Fee for the contract period. The term "all-inclusive" implies that all costs (professional fees, communications, consumables, etc.) that could be incurred by the IC in completing the assignment are already factored into the daily fee submitted in the proposal. If applicable, travel or daily allowance cost (if any work is to be done outside the IC's duty station) should be identified separately. Payments shall be done on a monthly basis based on actual days worked, upon verification of completion of deliverables and approval by the IC's supervisor of a Time Sheet indicating the days worked in the period.

In general, UNDP shall not accept travel costs exceeding those of an economy class ticket. Should the IC wish to travel on a higher class he/she should do so using their own resources

In the event of unforeseeable travel not anticipated in this TOR, payment of travel costs including tickets, lodging and terminal expenses should be agreed upon, between the respective business unit and the Individual Consultant, prior to travel and will be reimbursed.

Travel costs shall be reimbursed at actual but not exceeding the quotation from UNDP approved travel agent. The provided living allowance will not be exceeding UNDP DSA rates. Repatriation travel cost from home to duty station in Bangkok and return shall not be covered by UNDP.

Payments shall be made based on approved work plan indicating number of working days spent for each specific assignment, upon verification of completion of deliverables and approval by the IC's supervisor.

For this position, interested applicants should submit financial proposal that includes their professional daily fee and travel cost to all the six countries in the ToR. Payment will be made based on actual travel undertaken.

Evaluation Method and Criteria

Individual consultants will be evaluated based on the following methodology:

Cumulative analysis

The award of the contract shall be made to the individual consultant whose offer has been evaluated and determined as a) responsive/compliant/acceptable; and b) having received the highest score out of set of weighted technical criteria (70%) and financial criteria (30%). Financial score shall be computed as a ratio of the proposal being evaluated and the lowest priced proposal received by UNDP for the assignment.

Technical Criteria for Evaluation (Maximum 70 points)

Criteria 1: Relevance of Education (max 10 points)
 Criteria 2: Experience working filming, video production and editing (max 15 points)
 Criteria 3: Experience with the United Nations, governments or international non-profits or advocacy campaigns (max 15 points)
 Criteria 4: Experience with video productions on development issues or the SDGs (max 10 points)
 Criteria 5: Strength of the submitted design portfolio (max 20 points)

Only candidates obtaining a minimum of 49 points (70% of the total technical points) would be considered for the Financial Evaluation.
