Definitions

- a) "Bid" refers to the Bidder's response to the Invitation to Bid, including the Bid Submission Form, Technical Bid and Price Schedule and all other documentation attached thereto as required by the ITB.
- b) "Bidder" refers to any legal entity that may submit, or has submitted, a Bid for the supply of goods and provision of related services requested by UNDP.
- c) "Contract" refers to the signed Purchase Order between the UNDP and the successful Bidder together with all Contract Documents thereto.
- d) "Contract Documents" refers to the documents listed in the LTA, this letter and the Purchase Order, including any amendments and attachments thereto.
- e) "Contract Price" refers to the sum agreed in the Contract as payable to the Contractor for the execution and completion of the Contractor's obligations and for remedying of any defects therein in accordance with the Contract
- f) "Contractor" refers to the entity whose bid has been accepted and with whom a Contract has been entered into under this LTA
- g) "Country" refers to the country indicated in the Data Sheet.
- h) "Data Sheet" refers to such part of the Instructions to Bidders used to reflect conditions of the tendering process that are specific for the requirements of the ITB.
- i) "Day" refers to calendar day.
- j) "Employer" means the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP)
- k) "Goods" refer to any tangible product, commodity, article, material, wares, equipment, assets or merchandise that UNDP requires under this ITB.
- I) "Government" refers to the Government of the country where the goods and related services provided/rendered specified under the Contract will be delivered or undertaken.
- m) "Instructions to Bidders" refers to the complete set of documents which provides Bidders with all information needed and procedures to be followed in the course of preparing their Bid
- n) "ITB" refers to the Invitation to Bid consisting of instructions and references prepared by UNDP for purposes of selecting the best supplier or service provider to fulfil the requirement indicated in the Schedule of Requirements and Technical Specifications.
- o) "LOI" (Section 1 of the ITB) refers to the Letter of Invitation sent by UNDP to Bidders.
- p) "LTA" refers to a Long Term Agreement signed between the Contracting Authority and the Supplier, together with the LTA Documents referred to therein, including all attachments, appendices, and all documents incorporated by reference therein

- q) "Material Deviation" refers to any contents or characteristics of the bid that is significantly different from an essential aspect or requirement of the ITB, and (i) substantially alters the scope and quality of the requirements; (ii) limits the rights of UNDP and/or the obligations of the offeror; and (iii) adversely impacts the fairness and principles of the procurement process, such as those that compromise the competitive position of other offerors.
- r) "Project Manager" means the person whose services have been engaged by UNDP to administer any Contracts under the LTA as provided therein, as will be notified by writing to the Contractor
- s) "Purchase Order" refers to a legal instrument that is one of the Contract Documents
- t) "Schedule of Requirements and Technical Specifications" refers to the document included in this ITB as Section 3 which lists the goods required by UNDP, their specifications, the related services, activities, tasks to be performed, and other information pertinent to UNDP's receipt and acceptance of the goods.
- u) "Services" refers to the entire scope of tasks related or ancillary to the completion or delivery of the goods required by UNDP under the ITB.
- v) "Supplemental Information to the ITB" refers to a written communication issued by UNDP to prospective Bidders containing clarifications, responses to queries received from prospective Bidders, or changes to be made in the ITB, at any time after the release of the ITB but before the deadline for the submission of Bid.

A. GENERAL

- 1 UNDP hereby solicits Bids as a response to this Invitation to Bid (ITB). Bidders must strictly adhere to all the requirements of this ITB. No changes, substitutions or other alterations to the rules and provisions stipulated in this ITB may be made or assumed unless it is instructed or approved in writing by UNDP in the form of Supplemental Information to the ITB.
- 2 Being a signatory to the LTA is a condition precedent for an award of a Contract pursuant to his LTA for the supply of goods and related services as specified in these documents.
- 3 Submission of a Bid shall be deemed as an acknowledgement by the Bidder that all obligations stipulated by this ITB will be met and, unless specified otherwise, the Bidder has read, understood and agreed to all the instructions in this ITB.
- 4 Any Bid submitted will be regarded as an offer by the Bidder and does not constitute or imply the acceptance of any Bid by UNDP. UNDP is under no obligation to award an LTA or a Contract under this LTA to any Bidder as a result of an ITB.
- UNDP implements a policy of zero tolerance on proscribed practices, including fraud, corruption, collusion, unethical practices, and obstruction. UNDP is committed to preventing, identifying and addressing all acts of fraud and corrupt practices against UNDP as well as third parties involved in UNDP activities. - In responding to this ITB, UNDP requires all Bidders to conduct themselves in a professional, objective and impartial manner, and they must at all times hold UNDP's interests paramount. Bidders must strictly avoid conflicts with other assignments or their own interests, and act without consideration for future work. All Bidders found to have a conflict of interest shall be disqualified. Without limitation on the generality of the above, Bidders, and any of their affiliates, shall be considered to have a conflict of interest with one or more parties in this solicitation process, if they:
 - Are, or have been associated in the past, with a firm or any of its affiliates which have been engaged by UNDP to provide services for the preparation of the design, Schedule of Requirements and Technical Specifications, cost analysis/estimation, and other documents to be used for the procurement of the goods and related services in this selection process;
 - Were involved in the preparation and/or design of the programme/project related to the goods and related services requested under this ITB; or
 - 6.3 Are found to be in conflict for any other reason, as may be established by, or at the discretion of, UNDP.

In the event of any uncertainty in the interpretation of what is potentially a conflict of interest, Bidders must disclose the condition to UNDP and seek UNDP's confirmation on whether or not such conflict exists.

- 7 Similarly, the following must be disclosed in the Bid:
 - 7.1 Bidders who are owners, part-owners, officers, directors, controlling shareholders, or key personnel who are family of UNDP staff involved in the procurement functions and/or the Government of the country or any Implementing Partner receiving the goods and related services under this ITB; and
 - 7.2 Others that could potentially lead to actual or perceived conflict of interest, collusion or unfair competition practices.

8 Failure of such disclosure may result in the rejection of the Bid.

8.1 The eligibility of Bidders that are wholly or partly owned by the Government shall be

subject to UNDP's further evaluation and review of various factors such as being registered as an independent entity, the extent of Government ownership/share, receipt of subsidies, mandate, access to information in relation to this ITB, and others that may lead to undue advantage against other Bidders, and the eventual rejection of the Bid.

B. CONTENTS OF BID

9 Sections of Bid

Bidders to join an LTA are required to complete, sign and submit the following documents:

- 9.1 Bid Submission Cover Letter Form (see ITB Section 4);
- 9.2 Documents Establishing the Eligibility and Qualifications of the Bidder (see ITB Section 5):
- 9.3 Technical Bid (see prescribed form in ITB Section 6);
- 9.4 Price Schedule (see prescribed form in ITB Section 7);
- 9.5 Bid Security, if applicable (if required and as stated in the DS nos. 10-12, see prescribed Form in ITB Section 8);
- 9.6 Any attachments and/or appendices to the Bid (including all those specified under the Data Sheet)

10 Clarification of Bid

- 10.1 Bidders may request clarification of any of the ITB documents no later than the number of days indicated in the Data Sheet (DS no. 19) prior to the Bid submission date. Any request for clarification must be sent in writing via courier or through electronic means to the UNDP address indicated in the Data Sheet (DS no. 20). UNDP will respond in writing, transmitted by electronic means and will transmit copies of the response (including an explanation of the query but without identifying the source of inquiry) to all Bidders who have provided confirmation of their intention to submit a Bid.
- 10.2 UNDP shall endeavor to provide such responses to clarifications in an expeditious manner. but, any delay in such response shall not cause an obligation on the part of UNDP to extend the submission date of the Bid, unless UNDP deems that such an extension is justified and necessary.

11 Amendment of Bid

- 11.1 At any time prior to the deadline for submission of Bid, UNDP may modify the ITB in the form of Supplemental Information to the ITB. Prospective Bidders will be notified of all changes/amendments and additional instructions through Supplemental Information to the ITB and through the method specified in the Data Sheet (DS no. 21).
- 11.2 In order to afford prospective Bidders reasonable time to consider the amendments in preparing their Bid, UNDP may, at its discretion, extend the deadline for submission of Bid.

C. PREPARATION OF BID

12 Cost

The Bidder shall bear any and all costs related to the preparation and/or submission of the Bid,

regardless of whether its Bid was selected or not. UNDP shall be in no case responsible or liable for those costs, regardless of the conduct or outcome of the procurement process.

13 Language

The Bid, as well as any and all related correspondence exchanged by the Bidder and UNDP, shall be written in the language(s) specified in the Data Sheet (DS no. 5). Any printed literature furnished by the Bidder written in a language other than the language indicated in the Data Sheet, must be accompanied by a translation in the preferred language indicated in the Data Sheet. For purposes of interpretation of the Bid, and in the event of discrepancy or inconsistency in meaning, the version translated into the preferred language shall govern. Upon conclusion of an LTA, the language of the LTA shall govern the relationship between the Supplier and UNDP.

14 Bid Submission Form

The Bidder shall submit the Bid Submission Form using the form provided in Section 4 of this ITB.

15 Technical Bid Format and Content

Unless otherwise stated in the Data Sheet (DS no. 33), the Bidder shall structure the Technical Bid as follows:

- 15.1 Expertise of Firm/Organization. This section should provide details regarding:
 - a) Management structure of the organization
 - b) Organizational capability/resources, and experience of organization/firm
 - c) The list of projects/Contracts (both completed and on-going, both domestic and international) which are related or similar in nature to the requirements of the ITB
 - d) Manufacturing capacity of plant if Bidder is a manufacturer
 - e) Authorization from the manufacturer of the goods if Bidder is not a manufacturer
 - f) Proof of financial stability and adequacy of resources to complete the delivery of goods and provision of related services required by the ITB

(See ITB Clause 17 and DS no. 30 for further details). The same shall apply to any other entity participating in the ITB as a Joint Venture or Consortium.

- 15.2 Technical Specifications and Implementation Plan. This section should demonstrate the Bidder's response to the Schedule of Requirements and Technical Specifications by
 - a) Identifying the specific components proposed;
 - b) Explaining how each of the requirements shall be met point by point;
 - c) Providing a detailed specification and description of the goods required, plans and drawings where needed:
 - d) The essential performance characteristics, identifying the works/portions of the work that will be Subcontracted;
 - e) A list of the major Subcontractors, and demonstrating how the bid meets or exceeds the requirements, while ensuring appropriateness of the bid to the local conditions and the-rest of the project operating environment during the entire life of the goods provided;
 - f) Details of technical bid must be laid out and supported by an Implementation Timetable, including a Transportation and Delivery Schedule where appropriate within the duration of the Contract as specified in the Data Sheet (DS no. 34 and 35).

Bidders must be fully aware that the goods and related services that UNDP require may be transferred, immediately or eventually, by UNDP to Government partners, or to an entity nominated by the latter, in accordance with UNDP's policies and procedures. All bidders are, therefore, required to submit the following in their bids:

 A statement of whether any import or export licenses are required in respect of the goods to be purchased or services to be rendered, including any restrictions in the country of origin, use or dual use nature of the goods or services, including any

- disposition to end users;
- b) Confirmation that the Bidder has obtained license of this nature in the past, and have an expectation of obtaining all the necessary licenses, should their bid be rendered the most responsive; and
- c) Complete documentation, information and declaration of any goods classified or may be classified as "Dangerous Goods".
- 15.3 Management Structure and Key Personnel. This section should include the comprehensive curriculum vitae (CVs) of key personnel that will be assigned to support the implementation of the technical bid, clearly defining their roles and responsibilities. CVs should establish competence and demonstrate qualifications in areas relevant to the requirements of this ITB.

In complying with this section, the Bidder assures and confirms to UNDP that the personnel being nominated are available to fulfil the demands of the Contracts pursuant to the LTA during the LTA's stated full term. If any of the key personnel later becomes unavailable, except for unavoidable reasons such as death or medical incapacity, among other possibilities, UNDP reserves the right to render the Bid non-responsive. Any deliberate substitution of personnel arising from unavoidable reasons, including delay in the implementation of the project of programme through no fault of the Bidder, shall be made only with UNDP's acceptance of the justification for substitution, and UNDP's approval of the qualification of the replacement who shall be either of equal or superior credentials as the one being replaced.

- Where the Data Sheet or Purchase Order requires the submission of a Bid Security, the Bid Security shall be included along with the Technical Bid. The Bid Security may be forfeited by UNDP, and reject the Bid, in the event of any or any combination of the following conditions:
 - a) If the Bidder withdraws its offer during the period of the Bid Validity specified in the Data Sheet (DS no. 9), or:
 - b) If the Bid Security amount is found to be less than what is required by UNDP as indicated in the Data Sheet (DS no. 10), or;
 - c) In the case the successful Bidder fails:
 - (i) to sign the Contract after UNDP has awarded it;
 - (ii) to comply with UNDP's variation of requirement, as per ITB Clause 34; or
 - (iii) to furnish Performance Security, insurances, or other documents that UNDP may require as a condition to rendering effective the Contract that may be awarded to the Bidder.

16 Price Schedule

The Price Schedule shall be prepared using the attached standard form (SECTION 7). It shall list all major cost components associated with the goods and related services, and the detailed breakdown of such costs. All goods and services described in the Technical Bid must be priced separately with a one-to-one correspondence. Any output and activities described in the Technical Bid but not priced in the Price Schedule, shall be assumed to be included in the prices of the items or activities, as well as in the final total price of the bid.

17 Currencies

All prices shall be quoted in the currency indicated in the Data Sheet (DS no. 16). However, where Bids are quoted in different currencies, for the purposes of comparison of all Bid:

- 17.1 UNDP will convert the currency quoted in the Bid into the UNDP preferred currency, in accordance with the prevailing UN operational rate of exchange on the last day of submission of Bid; and
- 17.2 In the event that the Bid found to be the most responsive is quoted in another currency different from the preferred currency as per Data Sheet (DS no. 16), then UNDP shall reserve the right to award any Contract in the currency of UNDP's preference, using the

conversion method specified above.

18 Documents Establishing the Eligibility and Qualifications of the Bidder

- 18.1 The Bidder shall furnish documentary evidence of its status as an eligible and qualified vendor, using the forms provided under Section 5, Bidder Information Forms. Eligibility requires, but is not limited to the following:
 - a) That, in the case of a Bidder offering to supply goods under the LTA which the Bidder did not manufacture or otherwise produce, the Bidder has been duly authorized by the goods' manufacturer or producer to supply the goods in the country of final destination;
 - b) That the Bidder has the financial, technical, and production capability necessary to perform Contracts arising from the LTA; and
 - c) That, to the best of the Bidder's knowledge, it is not included in the UN 1267 List or the UN Ineligibility List, nor in any and all of UNDP's list of suspended and removed vendors.
- 18.2 Bids submitted by two (2) or more Bidders shall all be rejected by UNDP if they are found to have any of the following:
 - a) they have at least one controlling partner, director or shareholder in common; or any-one of them may receive any direct or indirect subsidy from the other/s; or
 - b) they have the same legal representative for purposes of this ITB; or
 - they have a relationship with each other, directly or through common third parties, that puts them in a position to have access to information about, or influence on the Bid of, another Bidder regarding this ITB process;
 - d) they are Subcontractors to each other's bid, or a Subcontractor to one Bid also submits another Bid under its name as lead Bidder; or
 - e) an expert proposed to be in the Bid of one Bidder participates in more than one Bid received for this ITB process. This condition does not apply to Subcontractors being included in more than one Bid.

19 Joint Venture, Consortium or Association

If the Bidder is a group of legal entities that will form or have formed a joint venture, consortium or association at the time of the submission of the Bid, they shall confirm in their Bid that: (i) they have designated one party to act as a lead entity, duly vested with authority to legally bind the members of the joint venture jointly and severally, and this shall be duly evidenced by a duly notarized Agreement among the legal entities, which shall be submitted along with the Bid; and (ii) if they are awarded the LTA, the LTA shall be entered into, by and between UNDP and the designated lead entity, who shall be acting for and on behalf of all entities that comprise the joint venture.

After the bid has been submitted to UNDP, the lead entity identified to represent the joint venture shall not be altered without the prior written consent of UNDP. Furthermore, neither the lead entity nor the member entities of the joint venture can:

- a) Submit another Bid, either in its own capacity; nor
- b) As a lead entity or a member entity for another joint venture submitting another Bid.

The description of the organization of the joint venture/consortium/association must clearly define the expected role of each of the entity in the joint venture in delivering the requirements of the ITB, both in the bid and in the Joint Venture Agreement. All entities that comprise the joint venture shall be subject to the eligibility and qualification assessment by UNDP.

Where a joint venture is presenting its track record and experience in a similar undertaking as those required in the ITB, it should present such information in the following manner:

- a) Those that were undertaken together by the joint venture; and
- b) Those that were undertaken by the individual entities of the joint venture expected to be involved in the performance of the services defined in the ITB.

Previous Contracts completed by individual experts working privately but who are permanently or were temporarily associated with any of the member firms cannot be claimed as the experience of the joint venture or those of its members, but should only be claimed by the individual experts themselves in their presentation of their individual credentials.

If the Bid of a joint venture is determined by UNDP as the most responsive Bid that offers the best value for money for a Contract arising from the LTA, UNDP shall award the Contract to the joint venture, in the name of its designated lead entity, who shall sign the Contract for and on behalf of all the member entities.

20 Alternative Bid

Unless otherwise specified in the Data Sheet (DS nos. 6 and 7), alternative bid shall not be considered. Where the conditions for its acceptance are met, or justifications are clearly established, UNDP reserves the right to award a Contract based on an alternative bid.

21 Validity Period

- 21.1 A Bid shall remain valid for the period specified in the Data Sheet (DS no. 9), commencing on the submission deadline date also indicated in the Data Sheet (DS no. 24). A Bid valid for a shorter period shall be immediately rejected by UNDP and rendered non-responsive.
- 21.2 In exceptional circumstances, prior to the expiration of the Bid validity period, UNDP may request Bidders to extend the period of validity of their Bid. The request and the responses shall be made in writing, and shall be considered integral to the Bid.

22 Bidder's Conference

When appropriate, a Bidder's conference will be conducted at the date, time and location specified in the Data Sheet (DS no. 8). All Bidders are encouraged to attend. Non-attendance, however, shall not result in disqualification of an interested Bidder. Minutes of the Bidder's conference will be either posted on the UNDP website, or disseminated to the individual firms who have registered or expressed interest in the LTA, whether or not they attended the conference. No verbal statement made during the conference shall modify the terms and conditions of the ITB unless such statement is specifically written in the Minutes of the Conference, or issued/posted as an amendment in the form of a Supplemental Information to the ITB.

D. SUBMISSION AND OPENING OF BID

23 Submission

- 23.1 The Technical Bid and the Price Schedule must be submitted and sealed together in one and the same envelope, delivered either personally, by courier, or by electronic method of transmission. If the submission will not be through electronic means, the Technical Bid and Price Schedule must be sealed together in an envelope whose external side must:
 - a) Bear the name of the Bidder;
 - b) Be addressed to UNDP as specified in the Data Sheet (DS no. 23); and
 - c) Bear a warning not to open before the time and date for Bid opening as specified in the Data Sheet (DS no. 28).

It is responsibility of the Bidder to assure that the envelope is adequately sealed and labeled as required to prevent misplacement or premature opening.

23.2 Bidders must submit their Bid in the manner specified in the Data Sheet (DS nos. 25 and 26). When sending the Bid, the Bidder must ensure that sufficient lead-time has been provided in order to comply with UNDP's deadline for submission. UNDP shall indicate for its record that the official date and time of receiving the Bid is the actual date and

time when the said Bid has physically arrived at the UNDP premises indicated in the Data Sheet (DS no. 23).

23.3 Bidders submitting by mail or by hand shall:

- a) Enclose the original and each copy of the Bid, in separate sealed envelopes, duly marking each of the envelopes as "Original Bid" and the others as "Copy of Bid". The number of copies required shall be as specified in the Data Sheet (DS no. 26). Additionally, the original version of the "Original Bid" shall be signed or initialed by the Bidder or person(s) duly authorized to commit the Bidder on every page. The authority of the signing officials or a Power of Attorney to commit the Bidder shall be demonstrated to the satisfaction of UNDP.
- b) The envelopes, consisting of original and copies, shall then be sealed in an outer envelope.

Bidders must be aware that the mere act of submission of a Bid, in and of itself, implies that the Bidder accepts the General Contract Terms and Conditions of UNDP as attached hereto as ANNEX I

24 Deadline for Submission of Bid and Late Bids

Bid must be received by UNDP at the address and no later than the date and time specified in the Data Sheet (DS no. 23 and 24)

UNDP shall not consider any Bid that arrives after the deadline for submission of Bid. Any Bid received by UNDP after the deadline for submission of Bid shall be declared late, rejected, and returned unopened to the Bidder.

25 Withdrawal, Substitution, and Modification of Bid

- 25.1 Bidders are expected to have sole responsibility for taking steps to carefully examine in detail the full consistency of its Bid to the requirements of the ITB, keeping in mind that material deficiencies in providing information requested by UNDP, or lack clarity in the description of goods and related services to be provided, may result in the rejection of the Bid. The Bidder shall assume any responsibility regarding erroneous interpretations or conclusions made by the Bidder in the course of understanding the ITB out of the set of information furnished by UNDP.
- A Bidder may withdraw, substitute or modify its Bid after it has been submitted by sending a written notice in accordance with ITB Clause 22, duly signed by an authorized representative, and shall include a copy of the authorization (or a Power of Attorney). The corresponding substitution or modification of the Bid must accompany the respective written notice. All notices must be received by UNDP prior to the deadline for submission and submitted in accordance with ITB Clause 22 (except that withdrawal notices do not require copies). The respective envelopes shall be clearly marked "WITHDRAWAL," "SUBSTITUTION," or MODIFICATION".
- 25.3 Bid requested to be withdrawn shall be returned unopened to the Bidders.
- 25.4 No Bid may be withdrawn, substituted, or modified in the interval between the deadline for submission of Bid and the expiration of the period of Bid validity specified by the Bidder on the Bid Submission Form or any extension thereof.

26 Bid Opening

UNDP will open the Bid in the presence of an ad-hoc committee formed by UNDP of at least two (2) members. If electronic submission is permitted, any specific electronic Bid opening procedures shall be as specified in the Data Sheet (DS no. 27).

No Bid shall be rejected at the opening stage, except for late submission, for which the Bid shall be returned unopened to the Bidder.

27 Confidentiality

Information relating to the examination, evaluation, and comparison of Bid, and the recommendation of Contract award, shall not be disclosed to Bidders or any other persons not officially concerned with such process, even after publication of the LTA or subsequent Contract award.

Any effort by a Bidder to influence UNDP in the examination, evaluation and comparison of the Bid or LTA or Contract award decisions may, at UNDP's decision, result in the rejection of its Bid.

In the event that a Bidder is unsuccessful, the Bidder may seek a meeting with UNDP for a debriefing. The purpose of the debriefing is discussing the strengths and weaknesses of the Bidder's submission, in order to assist the Bidder in improving the bid presented to UNDP. The content of other bids and how they compare to the Bidder's submission shall not be discussed.

E. EVALUATION OF BID

28 Preliminary Examination of Bid

UNDP shall examine the Bid to determine whether they are complete with respect to minimum documentary requirements, whether the documents have been properly signed, whether or not the Bidder is in the UN Security Council 1267/1989 Committee's list of terrorists and terrorist financiers, and in UNDP's list of suspended and removed vendors, and whether the Bid are generally in order, among other indicators that may be used at this stage. UNDP may reject any Bid at this stage.

29 Evaluation of Bid

- 29.1 UNDP shall examine the Bid to confirm that all terms and conditions under the UNDP General Conditions of Contract and Special Conditions have been accepted by the Bidder without any deviation or reservation.
- 29.2 The evaluation team shall review and evaluate the Bids on the basis of their responsiveness to the Schedule of Requirements and Technical Specifications and other documentation provided, applying the procedure indicated in the Data Sheet (DS no. 29). Absolutely no changes may be made by UNDP in the criteria after all Bids have been received.
- 29.3 UNDP reserves the right to undertake a post-qualification exercise, aimed at determining, to its satisfaction the validity of the information provided by the Bidder. Such post-qualification shall be fully documented and, among those that may be listed in the Data Sheet (DS no. 38), may include, but need not be limited to, all or any combination of the following:
 - a) Verification of accuracy, correctness and authenticity of the information provided by the bidder on the legal, technical and financial documents submitted;
 - b) Validation of extent of compliance to the ITB requirements and evaluation criteria based on what has so far been found by the evaluation team;
 - c) Inquiry and reference checking with Government entities with jurisdiction on the bidder, or any other entity that may have done business with the bidder;
 - d) Inquiry and reference checking with other previous clients on the quality of performance on on-going or previous Contracts completed;
 - e) Physical inspection of the bidder's plant, factory, branches or other places where business transpires, with or without notice to the bidder;
 - f) Testing and sampling of completed goods similar to the requirements of UNDP,

where available; and

g) Other means that UNDP may deem appropriate, at any stage within the selection process, prior to awarding the Contract.

30 Clarification of Bid

To assist in the examination, evaluation and comparison of bids, UNDP may, at its discretion, ask any Bidder to clarify its Bid.

UNDP's request for clarification and the Bidder's response shall be in writing. Notwithstanding the written communication, no change in the prices or substance of the Bid shall be sought, offered, or permitted, except to provide clarification, and confirm the correction of any arithmetic errors discovered by UNDP in the evaluation of the Bid, in accordance with ITB Clause 34.

Any unsolicited clarification submitted by a Bidder in respect to its Bid, which is not a response to a request by UNDP, shall not be considered during the review and evaluation of the Bid.

31 Responsiveness of Bid

UNDP's determination of a Bid's responsiveness will be based on the contents of the Bid itself.

A substantially responsive Bid is one that conforms to all the terms, conditions, and specifications of the ITB without material deviation, reservation, or omission.

If a Bid is not substantially responsive, it shall be rejected by UNDP and may not subsequently be made responsive by the Bidder by correction of the material deviation, reservation, or omission.

32 Nonconformities, Reparable Errors and Omissions

- 32.1 Provided that a Bid is substantially responsive, UNDP may waive any non-conformities or omissions in the Bid that, in the opinion of UNDP, do not constitute a material deviation.
- 32.2 Provided that a Bid is substantially responsive, UNDP may request the Bidder to submit the necessary information or documentation, within a reasonable period of time, to rectify nonmaterial nonconformities or omissions in the Bid related to documentation requirements. Such omission shall not be related to any aspect of the price of the Bid. Failure of the Bidder to comply with the request may result in the rejection of its Bid.
- 32.3 Provided that the Bid is substantially responsive, UNDP shall correct arithmetical errors as follows:
 - a) if there is a discrepancy between the unit price and the line item total that is obtained by multiplying the unit price by the quantity, the unit price shall prevail and the line item total shall be corrected, unless in the opinion of UNDP there is an obvious misplacement of the decimal point in the unit price, in which case the line item total as quoted shall govern and the unit price shall be corrected;
 - b) if there is an error in a total corresponding to the addition or subtraction of subtotals, the subtotals shall prevail and the total shall be corrected; and
 - c) if there is a discrepancy between words and figures, the amount in words shall prevail, unless the amount expressed in words is related to an arithmetic error, in which case the amount in figures shall prevail subject to the above.
- 32.4 If the Bidder does not accept the correction of errors made by UNDP, its Bid shall be rejected.

F. AWARD

33 Right to Accept, Reject, or Render Non-Responsive Any or All Bid

UNDP reserves the right to accept or reject any Bid, to render any or all of the Bids as non-

responsive, and to reject all Bids at any time prior to award of an LTA or any Contract arising, without incurring any liability, or obligation to inform the affected Bidder(s) of the grounds for UNDP's action. Furthermore, UNDP is not obligated to award the LTA or any subsequent Contract to the lowest price offer.

UNDP shall also verify, and immediately reject their respective Bid, if the Bidders are found to appear in the UN's Consolidated List of Individuals and Entities with Association to Terrorist Organizations, in the List of Vendors Suspended or Removed from the UN Secretariat Procurement Division Vendor Roster, the UN Ineligibility List, and other such lists that as may be established or recognized by UNDP policy on Vendor Sanctions. See -

UNDP reserves the right to cancel the LTA with any or all Suppliers if it finds that bids for Contracts arising from the LTA are offering less favorable value for money than its own market research or experience has determined as reasonable.

34 Award Criteria

Prior to expiration of the period of Bid validity, UNDP shall award an LTA and subsequent Contracts to the qualified and eligible Bidders that are found to be responsive to the requirements of the Schedule of Requirements and Technical Specification, and have offered best value for money (See DS no. 37).

35 Right to Vary Requirements at the Time of Award

The LTA shall be implemented by "Purchase Orders"; i.e. whenever the Contracting Authority intends to acquire items pursuant to this LTA it may send a "Purchase Order" to the Contractor on the LTA, specifying the quantities of items to be supplied. Deliveries shall take place in accordance with the Contract Documents.

Any quantities estimated and specified in this ITB do NOT compel the contracting authority to buy any of them. The contracting authority may at its own discretion purchase fewer or more quantities that those estimated quantities per item.

At the time of award of a Contract pursuant to the LTA, UNDP reserves the right to vary the quantity of the goods and/or related services that were subject to secondary bidding, by up to a maximum twenty-five per cent (25%) of the total offer, without any change in the unit price or other terms and conditions.

The supplier shall NOT be entitled to compensation and shall NOT be allowed to claim for changes of the unit prices, in case the contracting authority decides to purchase fewer, or more quantities than the indicative ones specified per item in this ITB and/or in case the contracting authority decides NOT to purchase ANY of these quantities.

The LTA shall be concluded for a period of two (2) years with effect on the date on which it enters into force, (although the LTA may be terminated at short notice).

36 Signature

Within fifteen (15) days from the date of receipt of the LTA, the successful Bidder(s) shall sign and date the LTA and return it to UNDP.

Failure of the successful Bidder to comply with the requirement of the ITB shall constitute sufficient grounds for the annulment of the award, and forfeiture of the Bid Security if any.

37 Performance Security

A performance security, if required, shall be provided in the amount and form provided in Section 9 and by the deadline indicated in the Data Sheet (DS no. 15), as applicable. Where a Performance Security will be required, the submission of the said document, and the confirmation of its

acceptance by UNDP, shall be a condition for the effectivity of a Contract under the LTA, which will be signed by and between the Bidder and UNDP.

38 Bank Guarantee for Advanced Payment

Except when the interests of UNDP so require, it is the UNDP's preference to make no advanced payment(s) on Contracts (i.e., payments without having received any outputs). In the event that the Bidder requires an advanced payment upon Purchase Order signature, and if such request is duly accepted by UNDP, and the said advanced payment exceeds 20% of the total Bid price, or exceed the amount of USD 30,000, UNDP shall require the Bidder to submit a Bank Guarantee in the same amount as the advanced payment. A bank guarantee for advanced payment shall be furnished in the form provided in Section 10.

39 Vendor Protest

UNDP's vendor protest procedure provides an opportunity for appeal to those persons or firms not awarded a purchase order or Contract through a competitive procurement process. SECTION 3. SCHEDULE OF REQUIREMENTS & TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS

A. BACKGROUND

Procurement and supply management are key elements of the grants of the Global Fund to fight AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria managed by UNDP and other partners in Africa. The supplies for the three diseases may cater for up to 40% of the total volume of supplies handled in the public sector.

The last years have been marked by a dramatic increase of total volumes of health commodities handled by UNDP. At the same time there have been plans to improve the handling capacity of this supply chain with enlargement of various warehouses and regional hubs.

The lack of sufficient space at central and "regional" stores/HUBs for storage and handling of supplies is affecting capacity and quality of operations and hampering the efforts of UNDP and its partners to provide quality logistics services.

The UNDP is supporting several governments in Africa in the upgrading and extension of their medical warehouses, which operate as major logistics service centres for the respective public health sectors. These facilities will ensure local storage and distribution and as such need to be pharmaceutical grade stores to cater for medicines, vaccines and other health commodities.

The first phase of this project has entailed structural additions, renovations and extensions. UNDP-GF is financing this first phase of this development, which includes a new building with truck-bays and cold rooms, new office floors and new gates for outgoing trucks and picking and packing areas, which are currently under construction.

The next phase is the subject of two LTAs:

- (i) The supply and installation of warehouse storage systems,
- (ii) The supply, delivery, commissioning of, and training for, warehouse materials handling equipment.

The following contractual provisions will apply to any Contract awarded under this LTA:

1 OBLIGATIONS OF THE CONTRACTOR

- 1.1 The Contractor shall commence work within the number of days specified in a Purchase Order (PO) from the date of sign-off, and shall perform and substantially complete its obligations by the date specified in the PO including delivery to site, in accordance with the Purchase Order. The PO will also specify target dates for Commissioning and training. The Contractor shall provide all materials, goods, labour and other services necessary to that end.
- 1.2 The Contractor shall be responsible for verifying that all goods, systems, equipment, and other project elements have been installed, tested, fit the purpose, and are in good operating condition and relevant training has been conducted under the Purchase Order. If defects are found, the Contractor is responsible for correcting these defects. Additionally, the Contractor is required to hand over all goods and systems to UNDP after the issuance of a letter of acceptance by UNDP.

This Purchase Order may only be accepted by the Supplier's signing and returning an acknowledgement copy of it. Acceptance of this Purchase Order shall affect a contract between the Parties under which the rights and obligations of the Parties shall be governed solely by the terms and conditions of this Purchase Order, and the Contract Documents of the LTA pursuant to which the Purchase Order was issued. No additional or inconsistent provisions proposed by the Supplier shall bind UNDP unless agreed to in writing by a duly authorized official of UNDP.

PROVISIONS SUPPLEMENTING THE GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT IN ANNEX I

1 CONTRACTOR'S RESPONSIBILITY FOR EMPLOYEES:

The Contractor shall be responsible for the professional and technical competence of its employees and will select, for work under this Contract, reliable individuals who will perform effectively in the implementation of this Contract, respect the local customs, and conform to a high standard of moral and ethical conduct.

2 ASSIGNMENT:

4 INDEMNIFICATION:

The Contractor shall indemnify, hold and save harmless, and defend, at its own expense, UNDP, its officials, agents, servants and employees from and against all suits, claims, demands, and liability of any nature or kind, including their costs and expenses, arising out of acts or omissions of the Contractor, or the Contractor's employees, officers, agents or sub-contractors, in the performance of this Contract. This provision shall extend, inter alia, to claims and liability in the nature of workmen's compensation, products liability and liability arising out of the use of patented inventions or devices, copyrighted material or other intellectual property by the Contractor, its employees, officers, agents, servants or sub-contractors. The obligations under this Article do not lapse upon termination of this Contract.

5 INSURANCE AND LIABILITIES TO THIRD PARTIES:

5.1 The Contractor shall provide and thereafter maintain insurance against all risks in respect of its property and any equipment used for the execution of this Contract.

- **5.2** The Contractor shall provide and thereafter maintain all appropriate workmen's compensation insurance, or the equivalent, with respect to its employees to cover claims for personal injury or death in connection with this Contract.
- **5.3** The Contractor shall also provide and thereafter maintain liability insurance in an adequate amount to cover third party claims for death or bodily injury, or loss of or damage to property, arising from or in connection with the provision of services under this Contract or the operation of any vehicles, boats, airplanes or other equipment owned or leased by the Contractor or its agents, servants, employees or subcontractors performing work or services in connection with this Contract.
- 5.4 Except for the workmen's compensation insurance, the insurance policies under this Article shall:

9 WORKMANSHIP

All workmanship shall be to a high standard of quality in accordance with norms of the industry and appropriate to the particular function of the works. To this end, the Contractor shall employ only qualified tradesmen to undertake the various skilled works under the supervision of a competent foreman.

10 MATERIAL

All new materials and goods used in permanent works shall be new, of good quality and to appropriate standards and specifications of industry and/or as indicated in this document. The supplier shall include in their tender not only the major items of equipment and fittings, but all the incidental sundry components necessary for the complete execution of the works and for the proper operation of the installation.

11 TRANSIT AND STORAGE

All goods shall be carefully packed to prevent damage in transit and its storage on site and such manner as will prevent deterioration. Any damage or deterioration shall be made good by the Bidder at his expense.

12 SITE INSPECTION

It is the responsibility of the bidder prior to commencement of installation, to view the site in terms of access, building dimensions, civil / electrical interfaces, offloading and assembly areas. 1.1 Overview

2 STANDARD TECHNICAL SPECIFICATION DETAIL (REFER TO SPREADSHEET ANNEX VII)

2.1 Racking Requirements

- a) The calculations for designing the racking solution must take account of racking self-weight, pallet/product live loads, transient miscellaneous forces during retrieval or putaway and any other loads that can reasonably be expected during normal operations.
- b) Generally racking shall be installed to be rigid and without any discernible sway. This especially applies to single bay racking and the supplier must include for all additional supports, braces and arms etc. to ensure that this requirement is met.
- c) Where single frames are present and where the base-to-height ratio of these single frames exceeds 10:1, then these single frames shall be supported to the nearest double rack by means of cross-aisle ties in accordance with the SEMA Code of Practice.
- d) The installation will be according to the SEMA Guideline No. 2 (Guide to Erection Tolerances for Static Racking), Grade 1 Low Tolerance.

2.2 Frames

- a) For 2 pallet high APR installation, frames shall be designed to allow a bottom floor supported pallet position and to support extension to two levels of maximum weight pallets above. In essence the system is expandable to store 3 high with the two levels above ground floor as short heavy pallets.
- b) Frames shall be of bolted or welded construction.

2.3 Beams

- a) Beams shall be closed section and locked to end frames using an approved locking system. The height of each beam above floor level shall be easily adjustable without the use of tools and independent of any adjacent beam.
- b) Beam pairs are to be adequately designed to support the pallet loads described earlier in this ITB.
- c) Bidders must take cognizance of the beam levels required in the LGSWC design. If any differences in beam levels due to rack /slot pitch and hook connector configuration are found, the bidder will be required to alter the beam and connector design by means of down-welding in order to achieve the required beam levels. The structural integrity and safety aspects of the beams must not be affected and where such alterations are required, these are to be brought to the attention of the Project Manager prior to commencement of manufacturing.
 - Typical back-to-back connectors shall be installed between frames approx. 250mm spacing

2.4 Back to Back Connectors

- a) Where building columns occur, the back-to-back are to be constructed accordingly to ensure that the operational aisles remain integral to functioning of the system and may not be changed without prior consultation to the Project Manager.
- b) Bidders must refer to the relevant drawings to determine the back-to-back connector lengths and quantities to suit the SEMA requirements. The position of the back-to-back connector must be installed according to the SEMA Code of Practice.

2.5 Baseplates and Point Loads

- a) A recommended base-plate size required: 140mm x 110mm x 6mm.
- b) Base plates may consist of bolted base spigot or can be welded to the frame uprights. The base plates shall have four fixing holes but, in the first instance, be fixed to the floor slab using only one bolt per base plate as according to the SEMA Code of Practice. These floor fixings shall be sized to ensure that the base plates are not turned by impact from pallets, products or MHE equipment. Using only one the four available holes allows maximum opportunity to avoid bolt position coinciding with floor joint.
- c) Bidders are to provide details and their dimensions for the proposed base plate and confirm the maximum rack leg point loads (KN.) The final size of the base-plate will be subject to acceptance by the projects Structural Engineer.
- d) Bidders are to include for all shims to ensure correct levelling of all frames to ensure that racking elevations and alignments comply with the requirements of the SEMA Codes of Practice. The shim plate must be the full size of the base-plates area.
- e) Where racks are joined by a back-to-back connector, only those uprights which are adjacent to aisles and gangways require floor fixing in accordance with SEMA Codes of Practice. Should a pair of uprights fall on or over a building sawcut floor joint, the floor fixing may be omitted on that particular upright only in order to permit floor expansion and shrinkage. The successful bidder is to identify such conflicts and present the same to the Project Manager before commencement of the installation.

2.6 Load notices

- a) Supply and fix load notices (not less than 200mm x150mm) to the racking installation stating maximum beam and bay loadings, first beam level and beam pitch.
- b) These notices shall be placed in a prominent location (typically at rack ends) and shall be sized and coloured in accordance with the requirements of SEMA Code of Practice.

2.7 Row Identification Signage

- a) The bidder is to provide plaques measuring not less than 200mm (High) x 300mm (Wide) on which the row number will be indicated.
- b) UNDP will inform the supplier with the details of the row numbers during manufacturing.

2.8 Rack Labelling

The bidder is to cost for the installation of the rack labels only and not for the supply of barcode labels. Each location and pick face is to be labelled according to instruction issued before commencement of installation.

- a) Bidders are to provide protection to all 'aisle facing' (APR) racking uprights. The adjustable pallet racking is to be supplied with an upright protector with a height of not less than 400 mm and must be positioned on every rack upright, providing protection to the three 'accessible' sides of the upright (EXCLUDING VNA RACKING)
- b) The upright protector must be designed for energy absorption of at least 400 Nm in any direction at any height between 0.10 m and 0.40 m, alternatively, reference may be made to FEM user's guide 10.2.03.
- c) Two options for upright protection are to be considered by the bidder:

- i. The upright protector could be made of alternative / composite / plastic material that is of suitable strength and is designed as per above.
- ii. Steel upright protection that is mounted separately to the fixing of the rack column and does not use the same anchor fixing. These protection barriers shall be bolted to the floor independently of the frame base plate and positioned to afford maximum protection to the uprights from contact by MHE and other equipment.

In the instance of a pre-existing (brown built) project, the location of floor joints may exclude the anchoring of steel protectors.

d) Provide clear details of the proposed racking upright protection.

Note: Both types of upright protectors are to be indicated separately and as optional for the client's decision.

2.9 Row End Protection

- a) Row End Protection barriers shall be manufactured and installed at both ends of each racking structure. These shall be fixed to the floor independently of the racking frame assembly and shall protect the end frames from damage by MHE, trolleys and other equipment.
- b) A suitable barrier is indicated on the drawings but an alternative may be proposed. For the purposes of the ITB provide costs based on the drawing supplied and indicate the difference in cost for the proposed alternative.
- c) The rack end barriers shall be primed, undercoated and finished with two full coats of gloss paint. The colour will be yellow from the manufacturer's standard range.

2.10 Standard Specification for Mobile Shelving

Each mobile base is equipped with a mechanical servo assisted mechanism for easy movement along 2-off bright mild steel rails which are fixed to a timber platform. The system is considered to be security storage and must be made lockable.

2.11 Standard Specification for Steel Binning

- a) All components shall be free from sharp edges and protrusions and shall be galvanised or epoxy coated whichever is deemed best for Fridge and Coldroom environments.
- b) Indicate the finish of all components in the ITB submission.
- c) The bidder must furnish load capabilities and limitations of their equipment.
- d) The bottom of all uprights shall be provided with base-plates. Shelving shall be anchored to the floor by fixings capable of resisting the horizontal shear forces caused by horizontal and vertical loads on the binning.
- e) Where binning is subjected only to gravity loads plus incidental horizontal forces from loading and off-loading of shelves, each upright on the perimeter of a run shall be fixed to the floor through its base plate by a bolt, stud or other such fixing capable of safely resisting a horizontal shear load of not less than 3kN and a tensile force of not less than 2kN.

- f) The factor against overturning of the entire binning run shall not be less than 1.4. Stabilising forces provided by the floor fixings shall not be considered in checking overturning, unless these are especially designed and installed to resist the uplift forces.
- g) The binning shall be installed with a maximum deviation from the vertical of 1 in 500 of height.

2.12 Standard Specification for Carton Flow Rack (where applicable)

- a) Minimum of three adjustable roller tracks required per lane.
- b) Capacity required per tray level = 600kg
- c) Lane side guides are to be included as an option and therefore must be costed separately.
- d) The following must be specified in your ITB offer:
 - Conveying track profile size
 - Conveying wheel diameter and width
 - Conveying wheel pitch
 - Offload presentation tray width and angle
 - End stop assembly
 - Tray support bracket assembly
- e) The carton flow tracks must be fully adjustable within the tray.

3 GENERAL SYSTEM REQUIREMENTS

3.1 Finishes

- a) All components shall be free from sharp edges and protrusions and shall be galvanised or epoxy coated.
- b) Indicate the finish of all components in the ITB submission.
- c) All bidders must supply a list of available colour finishes.
- d) The finishing process shall ensure that all edges are properly covered and sealed. Any components not completely finished in this manner will be rejected and a replacement installed.
- e) All bidders must specify the proposed preparation and finish techniques to be employed.
- f) All minimum dry film paint thickness must be specified in the instance of epoxy finish.
- g) All paint finish may be subject to inspection of paint adhesion and surface preparation test by Client and an independent paint inspector.

3.2 Requirements on the Materials

a) Steel structure Type: Hot or cold – rolled profiles.

- b) Steel grade: To be specified by bidder.
- c) Bolts and nuts: Steel grade 8.8 electro galvanized
- d) Anchors for floor fixing shall be chemical anchor type.
- e) The bidder must be able to prove the quality and origin of the materials by certification; this will be subject to an approval by Client

3.3 Requirements on Manufacturing

- a) All welding shall be performed by certified welders.
- b) On the request of the Client, the copies of welder certifications must be made available.
- c) The ends of all tubular components must be sealed.
- d) Length of all bolts should generally be chosen to avoid excess protrusion beyond the fixing nut, typically by 2 to 3 threads.

3.4 Requirements on Installation

- a) Packaging & shipping, storage and installation of the storage system shall be with due care to minimize any damage.
- b) Damaged parts are to be repaired and paint touch-ups effected as required.
- c) Welding on site is not allowed without prior authorization and required occupational health and safety regulations followed. A suitable screened area shall be set up by the installer.
- d) During installation, the bidder takes care of bracing the storage structure where necessary.
- e) The successful bidder carries full responsibility for familiarising themselves with the site in respect of the way storage structures can be brought in, located and installed.

3.5 Standardisation

- a) To minimise the number of spare parts that need to be stored and to simplify the racking installation as much as possible, the use of standard components is encouraged i.e. a common slot profile and hook connector.
- b) Bidders are to confirm to what extent, and how, this has been achieved.

4 SPECIFICATIONS COMPLIANCE

AGREEMENT FOR TECHNICAL SPECIFICATION MODIFICATIONS PROPOSED BY THE BIDDER AGAINST THOSE STATED IN THE ITB.

Bids shall be based on the specified equipment and materials. Should the Bidder base his bid price on any alternative and this alternative is rejected by UNDP, any cost implication this may have shall be for his account as no additional cost to the Contract shall be permitted.

Bid prices may only be based on alternatives to those items not specifically specified in the ITB

documentation or where a written addendum to the ITB document, specifying allowable alternatives is issued during the bid period by UNDP.

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ANNEX VI

SAFETY, HEALTH AND WELFARE ON CONSTRUCTION SITES - MANUAL

The Bidder should NOT submit a copy of the Safety Manual along with his/her bid.

Only Successful bidder shall print and provide UNDP with a hardcopy of the **Safety Manual** duly acknowledged (signed/stamped) upon Purchase Order signature.

A Safety Plan is a requirement upon Purchase Order signature including the following details:

The Contractor agrees to observe the following protocol in the execution of his work on site.

- 1. Before the contractor takes beneficial occupation of the site or part thereof, a full inspection and acceptance certificate of the applicable area will be agreed and signed between the Developer, the Client, the Project Manager and the Contractor. Other contractors working in this area will be subjected to same acceptance certification.
- 2. The contractor will enter into a health and Safety Contract with the employer in terms of Section 37 (2) of the Occupational Health and safety Act No. 85 0f 1993
- 3. The contractor will carry out all activities on site in terms of the Construction Regulations, 2003; of the Occupational Health and Safety Act, 1993.
- 4. Prior to commencing work at the site the contractor will provide to the Client, a Health and Safety Plan, as contemplated in sub-regulation 5(1).
- 5. The Contractor's Health and Safety Plan must include a Risk Assessment in accordance with subregulation 7(1).
- 6. The Contractor's Health and Safety Plan must include a Fall Protection Plan in terms in subregulation 8(1).
- 7. Site internal vehicle and pedestrian routes to be planned and regularly co-ordinated with the site office.
- 8. The contractor must ensure that requirements for the installation and maintenance of perimeter protection, screens, and barrier tape is clearly defined and agreed for areas of beneficial use.
- 9. In the erection of material an installation and erection method statement must be agreed.
- 10. The contractor must ensure the protection and safety of the site and personnel.
- 11. When materials are stored on site, a designated storage area will be indicated within the area of beneficial use.
- 12. The contractor must ensure that no materials such as steel may make direct contact with building components such as floor, walls, doors and other infrastructure. Any damage must be reported to the site office and project manager. Damage will be fairly assessed and repaired at the contractor's expense.
- 13. Due to the possible unavailability of temporary power, the contractor must arrange for their own generator power supply. The contractor must ensure safe fuel handling and storage. The contractor must try to minimise any excessive exhaust and noise pollution within the building when using generator.
- 14. The contractor must make use of the available waste disposal units on site.
- 15. The contractor to ensure good housekeeping on site at all times. No loose materials such as bolts, nuts, components and tools are to remain in the work area at the end of a days work.
- 16. The safe-keeping of tools, generators, handling equipment and material is for the contractor's responsibility.

GENERAL SITE RULES

- 1. All personnel shall undergo induction training.
- 2. Appropriate Personal Protection Equipment (PPE) shall be worn.
- 3. Every accident and near miss event must be reported to the site office.
- 4. Any person found to be interfering or misusing fixtures, fittings or equipment provided in the interest of health, safety or welfare will be excluded from the site.

- 5. Smoking will be prohibited from high risk and / or sensitive areas.
- 6. Visitors must report to the site offices, and will be allowed entry at site office's discretion. Whilst on site visitors are to wear the appropriate PPE.
- 7. Vehicle drivers must wear a safety helmet at all times when at risk. Vehicles are not to be reversed in construction areas unless under the control of an authorised banksman.
- 8. Vehicle drivers must at all times wear a safety belt.
- 9. Safety signs and notices must be adhered to.
- 10. Transistor radios or personal stereos / walkmans are not to be used.
- 11. Cell phones may not be used whilst in the process of carrying out work.
- 12. Permission must be obtained from the site office, the Client and UNDP prior to any photography or video filming on site.
- 13. All site personnel, for their own safety and for the safety of others, are required to fully comply with their employer's statement of safe working method.
- 14. Site fire and emergency alarms, equipment and instructions are designed to protect life. They must be followed.
- 15. The Contractor agrees to carry out the reasonable requests of Developer's Site Manager.

PERSONAL SAFETY - SITE RULES

- 1. All personnel are required to wear safety helmet and safety footwear. High visibility vests are required in vehicle movement areas.
- 2. The consumption of alcohol and drugs is prohibited.
- 3. No person is to operate any mechanical plant or equipment unless they have been trained and have been certificated as competent.
- 4. Any mechanical plant or equipment found to be defective is not to be used.
- 5. Ladders are only to be used as work platforms for tasks of short duration and only if no alternative means of access is readily available. Ladders must always be secured to a structure or securely 'footed' by another person whilst in use.
- 6. The use of trestles is prohibited. Bandstands may be used up to 600mm height only. Thereafter properly constructed and guarded mobile towers are to be used. Mobile towers without guardrails must not be used.
- 7. Food is only to be consumed in the designated accommodation / messing areas.
- 8. No person, other than a designated & qualified electrician, is to make connection / disconnection, other than at approved plug & socket points, or make alteration to the temporary electrical supply.
- 9. No personnel shall indulge in fighting, horseplay or practical jokes within the site perimeter.
