Goods offered shall be reviewed based on completeness and compliance of the quotation with the minimum specifications described above and any other annexes providing details of UNDP requirements.

Any discrepancy between the unit price and the total price (obtained by multiplying the unit price and quantity) shall be re-computed by UNDP. The unit price shall prevail and the total price shall be corrected. If the supplier does not accept the final price based on UNDP's re-computation and correction of errors, its quotation will be rejected.

Project title:	UNDP/GEF "Mainstreaming Sustainable Land and Forest Management in Mountain Landscapes of North-eastern Armenia"		

I. Information on the assignment

II. Project Background

The long-term solution sought is to facilitate the shift from unsustainable to sustainable forest management in North-Eastern Armenia. The target area contains 65% of Armenia's forest resources and provides essential ecosystem services including water provision (for urban use and food production), landslide control and carbon storage and sequestration. The project will promote an integrated approach towards fostering sustainable forest management – seeking to balance environmental management with development and community needs.

The major objective of the project is sustainable land and forest management in the North-eastern Armenia to secure continued flow of multiple ecosystem services (such as water provision, land slide control and carbon storage/sequestration) and to ensure conservation of critical wildlife habitats. This would be achieved during the four years of implementation through two main components, namely: (i) Integration of sustainable forest and land management objectives into planning and management of forest ecosystems to reduce degradation and enhance ecosystem services in two marzes covering 0.65 million hectares; and (ii) Sustainable Forest Management practices effectively demonstrating reduced pressure on high conservation forests and maintaining flow of ecosystem services.

It will attempt to reduce conflicting forest land-uses and improve the sustainability of forest management to maintain the flow of vital ecosystem services and sustain the livelihoods of local forest-dependent communities (and downstream users). This platform will be underpinned by a robust forest management planning support system and monitoring framework that will inform plans for the forest estate.

III. Scope of Work

The objective of the task is:

To procure about 30 000 poplar seedlings from different nursery farm and specialized institutions in the Republic of Armenia, to grow saplings in the same amount in own nursery farm, and to provide them for the purposes of planting a protective layer of trees in Tavush and Lori provinces with a view to expanding the green areas in those provinces.

The scope of the services

- 1. Procurement of about 30 000 poplar seedlings from different nursery farm and specialized institutions in the Republic of Armenia, transfer to own nursery farm and planting
- 2. Having a separate 0.3-0.5 ha area in the nursery farm where the soil is prepared (plowed, de-weeded, fertilized) for planting the seedlings and ensuring their further growth. The area must be equipped for irrigating the seedlings.
- 3. Ensure the production of around 30 000 saplings from the procured seedlings and their provision for the purposes of planning a protective layer of trees in Tavush and Lori provinces.

- The contractor shall submit the narrative progress reports upon completion of each deliverable to the Sustainable Growth and Resilence Portfolio Manager and the Project Technical Task Leader.
- The contractor is expected to interact and collaborate with respective specialised institutions.
- Technical verification of the work carried out by the contractor shall be performed by the project and/or project-assigned consultant/expert.

VI. Schedule of Payments

Payments will be made in 3 installments (see above in Expected Outputs), upon timely completion of the respective task and their acceptance by UNDP based on the signed acceptance acts and narrative reports for each deliverable.

VII. Required Qualifications and Application Package

- The company should have the status of a legal entity, with at least **5 years of proven experience** in managing a nursery farm, as well as research and development in sapling production and establishing gardens and groves.
- The bidder is required to submit the following:
 - Company profile with description of proven records and experience in the area of required expertise.
 - Brief description of the nursery farm where the seedlings are to be grown.
 - Documents certifying the availability of human and technical capacity to organize soil cultivation, irrigation and other works.
