BACKGROUND

UNDP Myanmar has been implementing Global Environmental Facility (GEF) funded projects that support efforts in conservation and the sustainable use, access and benefits-sharing of natural resources, biodiversity and ecosystems in Myanmar. These projects also support the Government of Myanmar in establishing the legal and regulatory frameworks, policies and institutions required to ensure that these initiatives are developed and implemented in line with international conventions and legislation.

The Support to Produce the Sixth National Report to the Convention to Biological Diversity (Asia) Project was formulated with the participation of 66 countries from 5 regions (Africa, Central Asia, Arab States, Asia-Pacific and Latin America and the Caribbean). The objective of the project is "to provide financial support to GEF-eligible Parties to the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD) in their work to develop high quality, data driven sixth national reports (6NR) that will improve national decision-making processes for the implementation of national biodiversity strategies and action plans (NBSAPs). These reports detail the progress made towards achieving the Aichi Biodiversity Targets (ABTs) and inform both the 5th Global



Biodiversity Outlook (GBO5) and the Global Biodiversity Strategy of 2021-2030.

The project duration will be January 2018 to May 2019 and three components will be implemented:

- i. Development of a workplan
- ii. Assessment of progress made towards each national target
- iii. Production and submission of the Sixth National Report

The Forest Department under the Ministry of Natural Resources and Environmental Conservation is the 'Executive Agency' responsible for leading this project on behalf of the Government of Myanmar.

5. FINANCIAL PROPOSAL

Fees

Financial Proposal that indicates the all-inclusive fixed total contract price, supported by a breakdown of costs, as per template provided. If an Offeror is employed by an organization/company/institution, and he/she expects his/her employer to charge a management fee in the process of releasing him/her to UNDP under Reimbursable Loan Agreement (RLA), the Offeror must indicate at this point, and ensure that all such costs are duly incorporated in the financial proposal submitted to UNDP.

Travels

All envisaged travel costs must be included in the financial proposal. This includes all travel to join duty station/repatriation travel. In general, UNDP will not accept travel costs exceeding those of an economy class ticket.

In the case of unforeseeable travel, payment of travel costs including tickets, lodging and terminal expenses will be agreed upon, between the respective business unit and Individual Consultant, prior to travel and will be reimbursed. (Please see Template attached at Annex-4)

6. EVALUATION

- Individual consultants will be evaluated based on the following methodologies:
- Combined scoring method where the qualifications will be weighted 70 % and combined with the price offer which will be weighted 30%. The criterial for qualifications obtainable score: 100 points.

Educational background: 10 points

 (Bachelors' degree in environmental management/sciences, sustainable development (such as water/energy/food), international relations, development studies, social/political sciences and/or other relevant field for biodiversity planning, Master's degree in natural resource management or relevant field highly desired);

Relevant Experience: 55 points

 working experience in biodiversity conservation, natural resource management, or a related field, working experience to support the engagement of stakeholders in issues of environmental management, experience in compiling data regarding biological diversity and national biodiversity targets and indicators and preparing NBSAP and National Report to CBD, Experience working with governments is an advantage,



Working experience related to biodiversity in Myanmar is an asset)

English language skills: 5 points

Excellent command of written and spoken in Myanmar and English, evidence of reports prepared in Myanmar and English languages, academic papers published in peer review journals)

Financial Evaluation of Proposals:

The financial proposals of all the applicants who pass the technical evaluation will be scored. The maximum 30 points will be allotted to the lowest financial bid, and all other bids shall receive points in inverse proportion to the lowest fee e.g. [30 Points] x [USD lowest] / [USD other] = points for other proposer's fees

The contract shall be awarded to the applicant who receives the highest cumulative score.
