A. Description of Challemnge Fund

I. General Information:

The challenge fund support to CSOs/CBOs/NGOs is an initiative of Human Rights programme (HRP) to foster innovative human rights actions actions under the coalition of CSOs/CBOs at grassroots/district/national level with limited magament capacity. The actions will special focus on vulnerable groups/communities, particularly minorities, youth and women and the coalition should include at least two CSOs/CBOs. The size of funding to human rights actions of coalition will be in two LOTs (LOT-1: less than 10,000 USD and LOT-2: More than 10,000 USD). One coalition can only apply in one LOT.

II. Background:

Human Rights Programme (HRP) is a rights-based initiative UNDP supported by a consortium of donors. The programme has a specific focus on "strengthening capacity of civil society organisations/community-based civil organisations to engage in human rights advocacy and awareness raising in Bangladesh".

The Human Rights Programme will build the capacity of existing human rights CSOs/CBOs and their coalitions to improve collaborative human rights actions at grassroots and national level of Bangladesh. The programme will have a particular focus on working with vulnerable and marginalized groups, including women and girls, children and young people, ethnic and religious minorities, people with disabilities, Dalit and sexual minority population. This will seek to expand on human rights advocacy, awareness raising, human rights reporting and collaborative actions through engaging national institutions and civil society organisations in addressing human rights issues/concerns in Bangladesh.

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The Human Rights Programme (HRP) has five outcomes:

- 1) Strengthened capacity of the National Human Rights Commission to deliver on its mandate
- 2) Enhanced capacity of civil society and community based organizations to engage in human rights advocacy and awareness raising
- 3) Enhanced capacity of law enforcement agencies, in particular police, on human rights issues
- 4) Strengthened capacity of national stakeholders to better protect and promote women's rights
- 5) Strengthened capacity of national stakeholders to better protect and promote the rights of ethnic minorities

This particular challenge fund support to CSOs/CBOs coalitions is linked with outcome-2 of the HRP, UNDP.

III. The Purpose of the RFA

The purpose of this RFA is to solicit applications and establish partnerships with CSOs/CBOs cioalitions to enhance capacity and engagement of CSOs/CBOs coalitions in Human Rights awareness, rights-issue based advocacy and rights claiming actions in specific areas of Bangladesh.

The RFA is open to all coalitions of Bangladeshi CSOs/CBOs, working at grassroots/national level to work togather on innovative human rights actions in addressing specific human rights issues/concerns.

IV. Thematic issues:

The RFA will predominantly focus on the follow thematic areas

- Rights of the Minorities (ethnic/religious/other excluded groups)
- Women Rights (including Dalit women)
- Child rights
- Rights of the persons with disabilities

V. Expected Outputs

The RFA is expected that as immediate outputs, the coalition of CSO/CBOs working at grassroots/national level will:

- 1) Have greater opportunity to enhance capacity of the CSOs/CBOs coalitions:
- 2) Have an opportunity to work togather on some common and innovative actions under specific thematic areas;
- 3) Have opprtunity to eb engaged in human rights advocacy and awareness raising initiatives/actions;
- 4) Establish a stronger coordination of rights-based CSO/CBO coalitions in promotion and protection of human rights in Bangladesh.







B. Elligibility Requirements:

Following an open advertisement, the following eligibility requirements will be adopted for selection of potential CSOs and CBOs:

- ✓ Hold a valid Govt. registration (i..e need GoB registration certificate)
- ✓ Working experience in specific thematic issues, particular experiences to work with minorities (ethnic/religious/Dalits-other excluded groups), youth, women and persons with disabiloities;
- ✓ Have valid evidence indicating transparent and accountable financial management systems (i.e. need authorised audit report)
- ✓ Have evidence of CSOs/CBO coalition (i.e. signed MoU among CSOs/CBOs under the coalition)
- ✓ Proven track record in the human rights sector





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✓ Other value-added criteria as and when required.



c. Selection Criteria and Requirement

The selection criteria and requirement to be eligible to receive grants under the challenge fund is set in accordance with UNDP's guidelines for Micro – Capital Grants(MCG)

UNDP provides micro-capital grants for both credit and non-credit purposes as inputs to its programme and project activities for the purpose of this strategy, HRP will be using the noncredit grant modality under MCGs are generally and broadly used for the purpose of:

- a. Strengthening the institutional capacity of local CSOs/CBOs and CSO coalitions;
- b. Supporting community-based self-help initiatives, which may include incomegenerating activities designed to alleviate poverty;
- c. Promoting advocacy activities and networking between civil society organizations (CSOs), government and donors; and
- d. Supporting CSOs /CBOs involved with local environmental protection and poverty eradication activities.
