	1.2	Any Bid submitted will be regarded as an offer by the Bidder and does not constitute or imply the acceptance of the Bid by UNDP. UNDP is under no obligation to award a contract to any Bidder as a result of this ITB.
	1.3	UNDP reserves the right to cancel the procurement process at any stage without any liability of any kind for UNDP, upon notice to the bidders or publication of cancellation notice on UNDP website.

Project Title: Provision of Cash Delivery Services in Iraq under the Funding Facility for Stabilization Project (FFS) of UNDP Iraq (Ramadi)

A. Project Description

The conflict in Iraq since 2014 led to significant destruction of assets and infrastructure and displacement of Iraqis which is currently estimated at around 3 million individuals living as Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs). There has been considerable progress in the Government of Iraq, with the support of the its security forces, retaking control over cities in Iraq occupied by the Islamic State of Iraq and Levant (ISIL). Therefore, with the objective of providing immediate support to newly liberated areas in Iraq in order to support improved conditions for IDPs to return to their homes, UNDP Iraq and the Government of Iraq agreed to establish the Funding Facility for Stabilization (FFS).

UNDP is seeking the direct procurement of a fiduciary agent to assist in the distribution of cash grants to beneficiaries in the targeted areas – specifically vulnerable women. These grants will contribute in improving their living conditions and meeting their daily basic needs. The project's main objective is to create positive dynamics within the returnee community by helping women returnees to recover and improve their living conditions, which is key to the overall restoration of the normal daily life in the liberated areas, through the provision of cash grants to female returnees within the target areas. The list of beneficiaries and all related supporting documents will be provided by UNDP to the fiduciary agent. The fiduciary agent is requested to provide each beneficiary with a small cash grant of an amount of 500.00USD (five hundred United States dollars).

B. Objective

In view above, UNDP Iraq intends to contract a Service Provider to deliver cash payments to the beneficiaries. The volume of annual cash delivery expected is to be 1,500,000 USD for one-year period. However, UNDP does not guarantee that the mentioned volume above will be channelled through the service provider.

C. Scope of Services, Expected Outputs and Target Completion
