A. GENERAL PROVISIONS	
1. Introduction	<p>1.1 Bidders shall adhere to all the requirements of this RFP, including any amendments in writing by UNDP. UNDP is under no obligation to award a contract to any Bidder as a result of this RFP.</p> <p>1.3 As part of the bid, it is desired that the Bidder registers at the United Nations Global Marketplace (UNGM) website (<a href="http://www.ungm.org">www.ungm.org</a>). 3. Eligibility	<p>3.1 A vendor should not be suspended, debarred, or otherwise identified as ineligible by any UN Organization or the World Bank Group or any other international Organization. Vendors are therefore required to disclose to UNDP whether they are subject to any sanction or temporary suspension imposed by these organizations.</p> <p>3.2 It is the Bidder's responsibility to ensure that its employees, joint venture members, sub-contractors, service providers, suppliers and/or their employees meet the eligibility requirements as established by UNDP.</p>

<b>4. Conflict of Interests</b>	<p>4.1 Bidders must strictly avoid conflicts with other assignments or their own interests, and act without consideration for future work. Bidders found to have a conflict of interest shall be disqualified. Without limitation on the generality of the above, Bidders, and any of their affiliates, shall be considered to have a conflict of interest with one or more parties in this solicitation process, if they:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a) Are or have been associated in the past, with a firm or any of its affiliates which have been engaged by UNDP to provide services for the preparation of the design, specifications, Terms of Reference, cost analysis/estimation, and other documents to be used for the procurement of the goods and services in this selection process;</li> <li>b) Were involved in the preparation and/or design of the programme/project related to the services requested under this RFP; or</li> <li>c) Are found to be in conflict for any other reason, as may be established by, or at the discretion of UNDP.</li> </ul> <p>4.2 In the event of any uncertainty in the interpretation of a potential conflict of interest, Bidders must disclose to UNDP, and seek UNDP's confirmation on whether or not such a conflict exists.</p> <p>4.3 Similarly, the Bidders must disclose in their proposal their knowledge of the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a) If the owners, part-owners, officers, directors, controlling shareholders, of the bidding entity or key personnel are family members of UNDP staff involved in the procurement functions and/or the Government of the country or any Implementing Partner receiving services under this RFP; and</li> <li>b) All other circumstances that could potentially lead to actual or perceived conflict of interest, collusion or unfair competition practices.</li> </ul> <p>Failure to disclose such an information may result in the rejection of the proposal or proposals affected by the non-disclosure.</p> <p>4.4 The eligibility of Bidders that are wholly or partly owned by the Government shall be subject to UNDP's further evaluation and review of various factors such as being registered, operated and managed as an independent business entity, the extent of Government ownership/share, receipt of subsidies, mandate and access to information in relation to this RFP, among others. Conditions that may lead to undue advantage against other Bidders may result in the eventual rejection of the Proposal.</p>
<b>B. PREPARATION OF PROPOSALS</b>	
<b>5. General Considerations</b>	<p>5.1 In preparing the Proposal, the Bidder is expected to examine the RFP in detail. Material deficiencies in providing the information requested in the RFP may result in rejection of the Proposal.</p> <p>5.2 The Bidder will not be permitted to take advantage of any errors or omissions in the RFP. Should such errors or omissions be discovered, the Bidder must notify the UNDP</p>
<b>6. Cost of Preparation of Proposal</b>	<p>6.1 The Bidder shall bear any and all costs related to the preparation and/or submission of the Proposal, regardless of whether its Proposal was selected or not. UNDP shall not be responsible or liable for those costs, regardless of the conduct or outcome of the procurement process.</p>
<b>7. Language</b>	<p>7.1 The Proposal, as well as any and all related correspondence exchanged by the Bidder and UNDP, shall be written in the language (s) specified in the BDS.</p>
<b>8. Documents</b>	<p>8.1 The Proposal shall comprise of the following documents:</p>

<b>Comprising the Proposal</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a) Documents Establishing the Eligibility and Qualifications of the Bidder;</li> <li>b) Technical Proposal;</li> <li>c) Financial Proposal;</li> <li>d) Proposal Security, if required by BDS;</li> <li>e) Any attachments and/or appendices to the Proposal.</li> </ul>
<b>9. Documents Establishing the Eligibility and Qualifications of the Bidder</b>	<p>9.1 The Bidder shall furnish documentary evidence of its status as an eligible and qualified vendor, using the Forms provided under Section 6 and providing documents required in those forms. In order to award a contract to a Bidder, its qualifications must be documented to UNDP's satisfaction.</p>
<b>10. Technical Proposal Format and Content</b>	<p>10.1 The Bidder is required to submit a Technical Proposal using the Standard Forms and templates provided in Section 6 of the RFP.</p> <p>10.2 The Technical Proposal shall not include any price or financial information. A Technical Proposal containing material financial information may be declared non-responsive.</p> <p>10.3 Samples of items, when required as per Section 5, shall be provided within the time specified and unless otherwise specified by UNDP, and at no expense to UNDP</p> <p>10.4 When applicable and required as per Section 5, the Bidder shall describe the necessary training programme available for the maintenance and operation of the services and/or equipment offered as well as the cost to the UNDP. Unless otherwise specified, such training as well as training materials shall be provided in the language of the Bid as specified in the BDS.</p>
<b>11. Financial Proposals</b>	<p>11.1 The Financial Proposal shall be prepared using the Standard Form provided in Section 6 of the RFP. It shall list all major cost components associated with the services, and the detailed breakdown of such costs.</p> <p>11.2 Any output and activities described in the Technical Proposal but not priced in the Financial Proposal, shall be assumed to be included in the prices of other activities or items, as well as in the final total price.</p> <p>11.3 Prices and other financial information must not be disclosed in any other place except in the financial proposal.</p>
<b>12. Proposal Security</b>	<p>12.1 A Proposal Security, if required by BDS, shall be provided in the amount and form indicated in the BDS. The Proposal Security shall be valid up to thirty (30) days after the final date of validity of the Proposal.</p> <p>12.2 The Proposal Security shall be included along with the Technical Proposal. If Proposal Security is required by the RFP but is not found along with the Technical Proposal, the Proposal shall be rejected.</p> <p>12.3 If the Proposal Security amount or its validity period is found to be less than what is required by UNDP, UNDP shall reject the Proposal.</p> <p>12.4 In the event an electronic submission is allowed in the BDS, Bidders shall include a copy of the Bid Security in their proposal and the original of the Proposal Security must be sent via courier or hand delivery as per the instructions in BDS.</p> <p>12.5 The Proposal Security may be forfeited by UNDP, and the Proposal rejected, in the event of any one or combination, of the following conditions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a) If the Bidder withdraws its offer during the period of the Proposal Validity specified in the BDS, or;</li> <li>b) In the event that the successful Bidder fails:</li> </ul>

	<p>i. to sign the Contract after UNDP has issued an award; or</p> <p>12.6 to furnish the Performance Security, insurances, or other documents that UNDP may require as a condition precedent to the effectivity of the contract that may be awarded to the Bidder.</p>
<b>13. Currencies</b>	<p>13.1 All prices shall be quoted in the currency or currencies indicated in the BDS. Where Proposals are quoted in different currencies, for the purposes of comparison of all Proposals:</p> <p>a) UNDP will convert the currency quoted in the Proposal into the UNDP preferred currency, in accordance with the prevailing UN operational rate of exchange on the last day of submission of Proposals; and</p> <p>b) In the event that UNDP selects a proposal for award that is quoted in a currency different from the preferred currency in the BDS, UNDP shall reserve the right to award the contract in the currency of UNDP's preference, using the conversion method specified above.</p>
<b>14. Joint Venture, Consortium or Association</b>	<p>14.1 If the Bidder is a group of legal entities that will form or have formed a Joint Venture (JV), Consortium or Association for the Proposal, they shall confirm in their Proposal that : (i) they have designated one party to act as a lead entity, duly vested with authority to legally bind the members of the JV, Consortium or Association jointly and severally, which shall be evidenced by a duly notarized Agreement among the legal entities, and submitted with the Proposal; and (ii) if they are awarded the contract, the contract shall be entered into, by and between UNDP and the designated lead entity, who shall be acting for and on behalf of all the member entities comprising the joint venture.</p> <p>14.2 After the Deadline for Submission of Proposal, the lead entity identified to represent the JV, Consortium or Association shall not be altered without the prior written consent of UNDP.</p> <p>14.3 The lead entity and the member entities of the JV, Consortium or Association shall abide by the provisions of Clause 9 herein in respect of submitting only one proposal.</p> <p>14.4 The description of the organization of the JV, Consortium or Association must clearly define the expected role of each of the entity in the joint venture in delivering the requirements of the RFP, both in the Proposal and the JV, Consortium or Association Agreement. All entities that comprise the JV, Consortium or Association shall be subject to the eligibility and qualification assessment by UNDP.</p> <p>14.5 A JV, Consortium or Association in presenting its track record and experience should clearly differentiate between:</p> <p>a) Those that were undertaken together by the JV, Consortium or Association; and</p> <p>b) Those that were undertaken by the individual entities of the JV, Consortium or Association.</p> <p>14.6 Previous contracts completed by individual experts working privately but who are permanently or were temporarily associated with any of the member firms cannot be claimed as the experience of the JV, Consortium or Association or those of its members, but should only be claimed by the individual experts themselves in their presentation of their individual credentials.</p> <p>14.7 JV, Consortium or Associations are encouraged for high value, multi-sectoral requirements when the spectrum of expertise and resources required may not be available within one firm.</p>

<b>15. Only One Proposal</b>	<p>15.1 The Bidder (including the individual members of any Joint Venture) shall submit only one Proposal, either in its own name or as part of a Joint Venture.</p> <p>15.2 Proposals submitted by two (2) or more Bidders shall all be rejected if they are found to have any of the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a) they have at least one controlling partner, director or shareholder in common; or</li> <li>b) any one of them receive or have received any direct or indirect subsidy from the other/s; or</li> <li>c) they have the same legal representative for purposes of this RFP; or</li> <li>d) they have a relationship with each other, directly or through common third parties, that puts them in a position to have access to information about, or influence on the Proposal of, another Bidder regarding this RFP process;</li> <li>e) they are subcontractors to each other's Proposal, or a subcontractor to one Proposal also submits another Proposal under its name as lead Bidder; or</li> <li>f) some key personnel proposed to be in the team of one Bidder participates in more than one Proposal received for this RFP process. This condition relating to the personnel, does not apply to subcontractors being included in more than one Proposal.</li> </ul>
<b>16. Proposal Validity Period</b>	<p>16.1 Proposals shall remain valid for the period specified in the BDS, commencing on the Deadline for Submission of Proposals. A Proposal valid for a shorter period may be rejected by UNDP and rendered non-responsive.</p> <p>16.2 During the Proposal validity period, the Bidder shall maintain its original Proposal without any change, including the availability of the Key Personnel, the proposed rates and the total price.</p>
<b>17. Extension of Proposal Validity Period</b>	<p>17.1 In exceptional circumstances, prior to the expiration of the proposal validity period, UNDP may request Bidders to extend the period of validity of their Proposals. The request and the responses shall be made in writing, and shall be considered integral to the Proposal.</p> <p>17.2 If the Bidder agrees to extend the validity of its Proposal, it shall be done without any change in the original Proposal.</p> <p>17.3 The Bidder has the right to refuse to extend the validity of its Proposal, and in which case, such Proposal will not be further evaluated.</p>
<b>18. Clarification of Proposal</b>	<p>18.1 Bidders may request clarifications on any of the RFP documents no later than the date indicated in the BDS. Any request for clarification must be sent in writing in the manner indicated in the BDS. If inquiries are sent other than specified channel, even if they are sent to a UNDP staff member, UNDP shall have no obligation to respond or confirm that the query was officially received.</p> <p>18.2 UNDP will provide the responses to clarifications through the method specified in the BDS.</p> <p>18.3 UNDP shall endeavor to provide responses to clarifications in an expeditious manner, but any delay in such response shall not cause an obligation on the part of UNDP to extend the submission date of the Proposals, unless UNDP deems that such an extension is justified and necessary.</p>
<b>19. Amendment of Proposals</b>	<p>19.1 At any time prior to the deadline of Proposal submission, UNDP may for any reason, such as in response to a clarification requested by a Bidder, modify the RFP in the form of an amendment to the RFP. Amendments will be made available to all prospective bidders.</p>

	19.2	If the amendment is substantial, UNDP may extend the Deadline for submission of proposal to give the Bidders reasonable time to incorporate the amendment into their Proposals.
<b>20. Alternative Proposals</b>	20.1	Unless otherwise specified in the BDS, alternative proposals shall not be considered. If submission of alternative proposal is allowed by BDS, a Bidder may submit an alternative proposal, but only if it also submits a proposal conforming to the RFP requirements. UNDP shall only consider the alternative proposal offered by the Bidder whose conforming proposal ranked the highest as per the specified evaluation method. Where the conditions for its acceptance are met, or justifications are clearly established, UNDP reserves the right to award a contract based on an alternative proposal.
	20.2	If multiple/alternative proposals are being submitted, they must be clearly marked as "Main Proposal" and "Alternative Proposal"
<b>21. Pre-Bid Conference</b>	21.1	When appropriate, a Bidder's conference will be conducted at the date, time and location specified in the BDS. All Bidders are encouraged to attend. Non-attendance, however, shall not result in disqualification of an interested Bidder. Minutes of the Bidder's conference will be disseminated on the procurement website and shared by email or on the e-Tendering platform as specified in the BDS. No verbal statement made during the conference shall modify the terms and conditions of the RFP, unless specifically incorporated in the Minutes of the Bidder's Conference or issued/posted as an amendment to RFP.
<b>C. SUBMISSION AND OPENING OF PROPOSALS</b>		
<b>22. Submission</b>	22.1	The Bidder shall submit a duly signed and complete Proposal comprising the documents and forms in accordance with the requirements in the BDS. The submission shall be in the manner specified in the BDS.
	22.2	The Proposal shall be signed by the Bidder or person(s) duly authorized to commit the Bidder. The authorization shall be communicated through a document evidencing such authorization issued by the legal representative of the bidding entity, or a Power of Attorney, accompanying the Proposal.
	22.3	Bidders must be aware that the mere act of submission of a Proposal, in and of itself, implies that the Bidder fully accepts the UNDP General Contract Terms and Conditions.
<b>Hard copy (manual) submission</b>	22.4	Hard copy (manual) submission by courier or hand delivery allowed or specified in the BDS shall be governed as follows: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a) The signed Proposal shall be marked "Original", and its copies marked "Copy" as appropriate. ### I. Background

The communication campaign on tolerance promotion in Ukrainian society, which was implemented in 2017-2018 and involved 12 celebrities as UNDP tolerance envoys, confirmed that there is a great need for dialogue between various social groups within Ukrainian society regarding topical and sometimes painful issues. The campaign proved that Ukrainian society has a critical need of advocacy to explain about the threats of intolerance, the links between tolerance, peace and security, and the importance of an inclusive and participatory national dialogue to build a stable and prosperous country. Such demand was very evident at the local level, as most of the campaign activities took place throughout the Ukrainian regions, and especially in “vulnerable regions.” In the course of the campaign, it was established that more attention and work on the ground is needed in the regions that are directly affected by the conflict, or that have a significant conflict potential (the list of such regions could include Donetsk, Luhansk, Odesa, Kharkiv, Zaporizhzhia, Kherson, Mykolaiv, Zakarpattia, Chernivtsi, Rivne, and Lviv).

The lack of a culture of dialogue, the absence of traditions of consensus building on the basis of mutual respect, or respect for the interests of different groups – these and other factors (including a lack of knowledge) multiplied by the traumatic consequences of conflicts since 2014, create a serious destabilizing conflict potential, as well as undermining efforts to achieve reform and positive changes. A decrease of the level of intolerance, and developing a culture of dialogue and mutual understanding, should be one of key components of the conflict settlement strategy in the country, a prerequisite for preventing future conflicts and establishing a resilient society.

The experience gained during the Reinvent Respect communication campaign on tolerance promotion clearly demonstrated that Ukrainians who are well recognized and not affiliated with politics have a high level of public trust. These Ukrainians are well respected in society for their contributions in the spheres of art, music, sports, literature, science, human rights protection, and so on. Thus, the sensitive and urgent issues about dialogue, acceptance, tolerance and mutual understanding that they raise during their communications with audiences deeply resonate in people’s minds. The activities of tolerance envoys showed there is a need for the depoliticisation of the national dialogue in Ukraine, and encouraging citizens in the regions to engage in the promotion of ideas of tolerance and mutual understanding.

The positive potential generated by the tolerance envoys during their work with regional audiences needs to be developed further in order to inspire citizens and create wider local networks of promoters of tolerance and mutual understanding at the grassroots level in Ukraine. Such leaders could be selected on the basis of educational courses conducted during the campaign, and according to selection criteria elaborated by UNDP in Ukraine, with the support of UNDP coordination offices in the Ukrainian regions.

The regional network of tolerance promoters would be integrated with the UNDP regional network (including SDG coordinators) and with UNDP tolerance envoys, and promote a wider agenda, including SDGs and the goals of UNDP and activities throughout the country. The UNDP regional network will ensure there is synergy in the communications campaign with other UNDP activities in the regions, and UNDP tolerance envoys could act as mentors and coaches for selected leaders in the Ukrainian regions. UNDP tolerance envoys will educate and train regional leaders about ways to communicate and promote tolerance values among the public at the grassroots level. As a result, there will be two levels for communicating values of tolerance and mutual understanding in Ukrainian society – a national level represented by 15 UNDP tolerance envoys, and a regional level represented by a network of some 40 regional tolerance leaders (at least two in each of the 12 oblasts identified as being at risk). Interaction at these two levels, together with the wider campaign to promote SDGs in the country, will ensure the proper promotion of values of tolerance, social cohesion and dialogue in the regions of Ukraine, while the creation of regional groups of influencers will also ensure UNDP outreach to the audience with other strategic messages at the grassroots level in Ukraine.

The selection of the regions where it is planned to “seed” local groups for tolerance promotion and “scale up” the results of the previously conducted communication campaign on tolerance promotion, will be conducted according to the available data of opinion polls regarding such issues as the Ukrainian regions with the highest conflict potential and regions with the highest number of ethnic minorities, IDP settlement, and using the Social Cohesion and Reconciliation Index (SCORE) on the regions with the lowest indicators for social cohesion, peace orientation, and so on. It is planned to select at least 12 regions of Ukraine to be covered by the campaign.

- II. Overall **campaign objective:** Promotion of the values of tolerance and mutual understanding at various levels in Ukraine through the establishment of a regional network of tolerance envoys, as well as a series of arts and sports events and contests aimed at promoting the issues of tolerance and human rights.

### III. Scope of Work and Expected Outcomes

The Contractor will perform the following tasks, as agreed with UNDP.

1. **Develop the concept design for a national campaign on tolerance promotion.** Together with UNDP, select 15 UNDP **Tolerance Envoys**. These should be well-known celebrities and opinion-leaders in the following fields – arts, science, eco-activism, music, cinematography, theatre, sport, human rights or/and literature –

#### **Deliverable 1**

- 1.1 Develop an entire campaign strategy, operation action plan, as well as monitoring and evaluation guidelines.

#### Outputs:

- Operational documents containing the following elements: operational program implementation plan (PR plan) with established deadlines, clarified roles and responsibilities; MoU with 15 Tolerance Envoys, information on partners involved;
- Informational guidelines containing information on target groups; resources that will be engaged; timeline of stages of informational campaign development and their objectives;
- Monitoring and evaluation system: evaluation forms aimed to define impact of strategy on target groups, and the method to analyze them established.

The campaign includes, but not limited to the following components:

2. **[Online training course on tolerance]** Design and launch an online training course on tolerance promotion. The online training course will be developed on the basis of the “Handbook on Tolerance Promotion in Ukraine” already prepared and by UNDP as part of the communication campaign on tolerance promotion.

This course should be placed on educational platform such as Prometheus, EdEra or any other relevant platform, so as to be made accessible to the wider public. A PR campaign should be held around this course. Also, partnerships with outreach amplifiers should be established at the ministry and civil society levels to maximize outreach. – **Deliverable 2**

2.1 Design and agree with UNDP a concept of the online training course on tolerance promotion  
Outputs:

- Concepts of the online training course containing the following elements: key messages; content plan; questions; optional answers; test assessments; a visual design;
- Operational documents: operational program implementation plan with established deadlines and schedule for training course promotion; information on partners involved.

2.2. Launch and popularization of the online training course.

Outputs:

- An interactive and visually attractive online training course is launched and widely promoted.
3. **[Aspiring tolerance envoys]** Select 40 aspiring tolerance envoys (at least two in each of 20 oblasts). Develop and implement a plan on how the aspiring tolerance envoys will be selected and trained, as well as a plan for outreach and promotional activities throughout the contract, which are integrated in overall campaign on tolerance promotion and SDG localization network. – **Deliverable 3**
- 3.1. Develop an entire implementation strategy, operation action plan, as well as monitoring and evaluation guidelines, on how the aspiring tolerance envoys will be selected, trained, and engaged into the national tolerance campaign and wider SDG localization network.

Outputs:

- Operational documents containing the following elements: operational program implementation plan with established deadlines, goals, clarified roles and responsibilities; information on partners involved;
  - Informational guidelines containing information on target groups; resources that will be engaged; timeline of stages of training programmes and their objectives;
  - Monitoring and evaluation system: evaluation forms aimed to define impact of training programmes on target groups, and the method to analyze them established.
  - 40 aspiring tolerance envoys are selected and trained by 15 Tolerance Envoys.  
Travel and other expenses related to training of the aspiring tolerance envoys should be outlined here. A series of public events with the aspiring tolerance envoys' participation should be integrated in Deliverable 4.
4. **[Outreach events]** Across the contract duration, hold at least 25 outreach events and/or activities in at least 20 oblasts of Ukraine with the participation of the UNDP Tolerance Envoys. To ensure the maximum outreach, the tolerance events, where possible, should be integrated with bigger national events, festivals, book fairs, eco-food festivals, and so on (i.e. Docudays UA International Human Rights Documentary Film Festival, GogolFest, Arsenal Knyzhkovyi Festival, Kurazh Bazar, etc.), including regional events in each oblast – **Deliverable 4**.

This Deliverable 4 should include, but not limited to the activities and events outlined below in this text, and might cover art, music, theatre, cinema, literature and/or sport, etc:

- **[Social Influencer contest [film]]** Hold a contest of social advertising videos that are aimed at mainstreaming diversity, respect for human rights, an inclusive environment, and tolerance. Up to 10 film crews should receive funding of UAH 20,000 for film production. The three winners should

share a monetary prize of UAH 55,000, and the films should be shown to public during the Docudays UA International Human Rights Documentary Film Festival or any other international or national festival. Also, as part of this activity, award ceremony, public talks, discussions and/or a road cinema tour around Ukraine should be held for social videos on diversity and mutual understanding, as well as the nationwide tolerance campaign.

- **[Challenging intolerance with the pen [literature]]:** Write 24 feature stories, blog posts or other long-reads to promote diversity, human rights and tolerance. This activity is to be led by a Tolerance Envoy who is a writer or a blogger. A dedicated blog column to promote tolerance and diversity should be placed on the popular Ukrainian platform such as Ukrainska Pravda or any other platform that serves the purpose. The web platform should have a photo-text slide effect option, like the [BBC website](#), and have both web and mobile versions.
- **[“Challenge intolerance with sport” event [sport]]:** Hold or join a national sports event to promote the issues of tolerance, inclusion and diversity. Together with Runday or the Kyiv Cyclists' Association, or any other community association, hold a highly visible sport event to promote human rights values, the issues of tolerance and mutual respect, and promote the campaign's messages. A PR campaign should be planned and implemented around this activity.

Outputs for Deliverable 4:

- Concepts of outreach events and/ or activities containing the following elements: detailed plan, key messages.
- Operational documents: operational program implementation plan with established deadlines and schedule; information on partners involved.

All logistical aspects, including travels, photo coverage of each event, invitations to the events etc. are taken over by the Contractor.

5. **[“Challenging intolerance with cartoons” contest [art]].** To design and conduct a contest to challenge intolerance with cartoons (i.e. Let's Doodle Contest). This can be done in partnership with [eYeka](#) or any other creative design platform. The contest should encourage a Ukrainian community of artists to create a cartoon character challenging intolerance with creativity and humour. A slogan should be designed together with the cartoon character – **Deliverable 5**

Outputs:

- Concepts of the doodle contest and activities containing the following elements: detailed plan, timeline and PR plan.
- Operational documents: operational program implementation plan with established deadlines and schedule; information on partners involved.

6. Monitoring and evaluation of the overall campaign, where a clear KPI, monitoring and evaluation matrix is established and addressed. – **Deliverable 6**
