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4. Conflict of Interests 4.1

- Bidders must strictly avoid conflicts with other assignments or their own interests, and act without consideration for future work. Bidders found to have a conflict of interest shall be disqualified. Without limitation on the generality of the above, Bidders, and any of their affiliates, shall be considered to have a conflict of interest with one or more parties in this solicitation process, if they:
 - a) Are or have been associated in the past, with a firm or any of its affiliates which have been engaged by UNDP to provide services for the preparation of the design, specifications, Terms of Reference, cost analysis/estimation, and other documents to be used for the procurement of the goods and services in this selection process;
 - b) Were involved in the preparation and/or design of the programme/project related to the services requested under this RFP; or
 - c) Are found to be in conflict for any other reason, as may be established by, or at the discretion of UNDP.
- 4.2 In the event of any uncertainty in the interpretation of a potential conflict of interest, Bidders must disclose to UNDP, and seek UNDP's confirmation on whether or not such a conflict exists.
- 4.3 Similarly, the Bidders must disclose in their proposal their knowledge of the following:
 - a) If the owners, part-owners, officers, directors, controlling shareholders, of the bidding entity or key personnel are family members of UNDP staff involved in the procurement functions and/or the Government of the country or any Implementing Partner receiving services under this RFP; and
 - b) All other circumstances that could potentially lead to actual or perceived conflict of interest, collusion or unfair competition practices.

Failure to disclose such an information may result in the rejection of the proposal or proposals affected by the non-disclosure.

4.4 The eligibility of Bidders that are wholly or partly owned by the Government shall be subject to UNDP's further evaluation and review of various factors such as being registered, operated and managed as an independent business entity, the extent of Government ownership/share, receipt of subsidies, mandate and access to information in relation to this RFP, among others. Conditions that may lead to undue advantage against other Bidders may result in the eventual rejection of the Proposal.

 - b) In the event that the successful Bidder fails:
 - . to sign the Contract after UNDP has issued an award; or
- 12.6 to furnish the Performance Security, insurances, or other documents that UNDP may require as a condition precedent to the effectivity of the contract that may be awarded to the Bidder.

13. Currencies

- 13.1 All prices shall be quoted in the currency or currencies indicated in the BDS. Where Proposals are quoted in different currencies, for the purposes of comparison of all Proposals:
 - a) UNDP will convert the currency quoted in the Proposal into the UNDP preferred currency, in accordance with the prevailing UN operational rate of exchange on the last day of submission of Proposals; and
 - b) In the event that UNDP selects a proposal for award that is quoted in a currency different from the preferred currency in the BDS, UNDP shall reserve the right to award the contract in the currency of UNDP's preference, using the conversion method specified above.

14. Joint Venture, Consortium or Association

- 14.1 If the Bidder is a group of legal entities that will form or have formed a Joint Venture (JV), Consortium or Association for the Proposal, they shall confirm in their Proposal that: (i) they have designated one party to act as a lead entity, duly vested with authority to legally bind the members of the JV, Consortium or Association jointly and severally, which shall be evidenced by a duly notarized Agreement among the legal entities, and submitted with the Proposal; and (ii) if they are awarded the contract, the contract shall be entered into, by and between UNDP and the designated lead entity, who shall be acting for and on behalf of all the member entities comprising the joint venture.
- 14.2 After the Deadline for Submission of Proposal, the lead entity identified to represent the JV, Consortium or Association shall not be altered without the prior written consent of UNDP.
- 14.3 The lead entity and the member entities of the JV, Consortium or Association shall abide by the provisions of Clause 9 herein in respect of submitting only one proposal.
- 14.4 The description of the organization of the JV, Consortium or Association must clearly define the expected role of each of the entity in the joint venture in delivering the requirements of the RFP, both in the Proposal and the JV, Consortium or Association Agreement. All entities that comprise the JV, Consortium or Association shall be subject to the eligibility and qualification assessment by UNDP.
- 14.5 A JV, Consortium or Association in presenting its track record and experience should clearly differentiate between:

- a) Those that were undertaken together by the JV, Consortium or Association; and
- b) Those that were undertaken by the individual entities of the JV, Consortium or Association.
- 14.6 Previous contracts completed by individual experts working privately but who are permanently or were temporarily associated with any of the member firms cannot be claimed as the experience of the JV, Consortium or Association or those of its members, but should only be claimed by the individual experts themselves in their presentation of their individual credentials.
- 14.7 JV, Consortium or Associations are encouraged for high value, multi-sectoral requirements when the spectrum of expertise and resources required may not be available within one firm.

15. Only One Proposal

- 15.1 The Bidder (including the individual members of any Joint Venture) shall submit only one Proposal, either in its own name or as part of a Joint Venture.
- 15.2 Proposals submitted by two (2) or more Bidders shall all be rejected if they are found to have any of the following:
 - a) they have at least one controlling partner, director or shareholder in common; or
 - b) any one of them receive or have received any direct or indirect subsidy from the other/s; or
 - c) they have the same legal representative for purposes of this RFP; or
 - d) they have a relationship with each other, directly or through common third parties, that puts them in a position to have access to information about, or influence on the Proposal of, another Bidder regarding this RFP process;
 - e) they are subcontractors to each other's Proposal, or a subcontractor to one Proposal also submits another Proposal under its name as lead Bidder; or
 - f) some key personnel proposed to be in the team of one Bidder participates in more than one Proposal received for this RFP process. This condition relating to the personnel, does not apply to subcontractors being included in more than one Proposal.

16. Proposal Validity Period

- 16.1 Proposals shall remain valid for the period specified in the BDS, commencing on the Deadline for Submission of Proposals. A Proposal valid for a shorter period may be rejected by UNDP and rendered non-responsive.
- During the Proposal validity period, the Bidder shall maintain its original Proposal without any change, including the availability of the Key Personnel, the proposed rates and the total price.

17. Extension of Proposal Validity Period

- 17.1 In exceptional circumstances, prior to the expiration of the proposal validity period, UNDP may request Bidders to extend the period of validity of their Proposals. The request and the responses shall be made in writing, and shall be considered integral to the Proposal.
- 17.2 If the Bidder agrees to extend the validity of its Proposal, it shall be done without any change in the original Proposal.

	17.3	The Bidder has the right to refuse to extend the validity of its Proposal, and in which case, such Proposal will not be further evaluated.
18. Clarification of Proposal	18.1	Bidders may request clarifications on any of the RFP documents no later than the date indicated in the BDS. If inquiries are sent other than specified channel, even if they are sent to a UNDP staff member, UNDP shall have no obligation to respond or confirm that the query was officially received.

20. Alternative Proposals	20.1	Unless otherwise specified in the BDS, alternative proposals shall not be considered. UNDP shall only consider the alternative proposal offered by the Bidder whose conforming proposal ranked the highest as per the specified evaluation method. Where the conditions for its acceptance are met, or justifications are clearly established, UNDP reserves the right to award a contract based on an alternative proposal.

SUBMISSION AND OPENING OF PROPOSALS

22.1 The Bidder shall submit a duly signed and complete Proposal comprising the 22. Submission documents and forms in accordance with the requirements in the BDS. The submission shall be in the manner specified in the BDS. 22.2 The Proposal shall be signed by the Bidder or person(s) duly authorized to commit the Bidder. The authorization shall be communicated through a document evidencing such authorization issued by the legal representative of the bidding entity, or a Power of Attorney, accompanying the Proposal. Bidders must be aware that the mere act of submission of a Proposal, in and of itself, implies that the Bidder fully accepts the UNDP General Contract Terms and Conditions. - 23. Deadline for Submission of Proposals and Late Proposals
- 23.1 Complete Proposals must be received by UNDP in the manner, and no later than the date and time, specified in the BDS. UNDP shall only recognize the date and time that the bid was received by UNDP
- 23.2 UNDP shall not consider any Proposal that is submitted after the deadline for the submission of Proposals.
- 24. Withdrawal, Substitution, and Modification of Proposals
- 24.1 A Bidder may withdraw, substitute or modify its Proposal after it has been submitted at any time prior to the deadline for submission.
- 24.2 Manual and Email submissions: A bidder may withdraw, substitute or modify its Proposal by sending a written notice to UNDP, duly signed by an authorized representative, and shall include a copy of the authorization (or a Power of Attorney). The corresponding substitution or modification of the Proposal, if any, must accompany the respective written notice. 25. Proposal Opening

25.1 There is no public bid opening for RFPs. UNDP shall open the Proposals

in the presence of an ad-hoc committee formed by UNDP, consisting of at least two (2) members. In the case of e-Tendering submission, bidders will receive an automatic notification once their proposal is opened. **EVALUATION OF PROPOSALS** 26. UNDP reserves the right to reject any Proposal at this stage. 29. Evaluation of 29.1 Eligibility and Qualification of the Bidder will be evaluated against the **Eligibility and** Minimum Eligibility/Qualification requirements specified in the Section 4 Qualification (Evaluation Criteria). 29.2 In general terms, vendors that meet the following criteria may be considered qualified: a) They are not included in the UN Security Council 1267/1989 Committee's list of terrorists and terrorist financiers, and in UNDP's ineligible vendors' list; b) They have a good financial standing and have access to adequate financial resources to perform the contract and all existing commercial commitments. c) They have the necessary similar experience, technical expertise, production capacity where applicable, quality certifications, quality assurance procedures and other resources applicable to the provision of the services required; d) They are able to comply fully with UNDP General Terms and Conditions of Contract; e) They do not have a consistent history of court/arbitral award decisions against the Bidder; and They have a record of timely and satisfactory performance with their

clients.

30. Evaluation of Technical and Financial Proposals

- 30.1 The evaluation team shall review and evaluate the Technical Proposals on the basis of their responsiveness to the Terms of Reference and other RFP documents, applying the evaluation criteria, sub-criteria, and point system specified in the Section 4 (Evaluation Criteria). A Proposal shall be rendered non-responsive at the technical evaluation stage if it fails to achieve the minimum technical score indicated in the BDS. When necessary and if stated in the BDS, UNDP may invite technically responsive bidders for a presentation related to their technical proposals. The conditions for the presentation shall be provided in the bid document where required.
- 30.2 In the second stage, only the Financial Proposals of those Bidders who achieve the minimum technical score will be opened for evaluation. The Financial Proposals corresponding to Technical Proposals that were rendered non-responsive shall remain unopened, and, in the case of manual submission, be returned to the Bidder unopened. For emailed Proposals and e-tendering submissions, UNDP will not request for the password of the Financial Proposals of bidders whose Technical Proposal were found not responsive.
- 30.3 The evaluation method that applies for this RFP shall be as indicated in the BDS, which may be either of two (2) possible methods, as follows: (a) the lowest priced method which selects the lowest evaluated financial proposal of the technically responsive Bidders; or (b) the combined scoring method which will be based on a combination of the technical and financial score.
- 30.4 When the BDS specifies a combined scoring method, the formula for the rating of the Proposals will be as follows:

TP Rating = (Total Score Obtained by the Offer / Max. Obtainable Score for TP) \times 100

Rating the Financial Proposal (FP):

FP Rating = (Lowest Priced Offer / Price of the Offer Being Reviewed) x 100

Total Combined Score:

Combined Score = (TP Rating) x (Weight of TP, e.g. 70%) + (FP Rating) x (Weight of FP, e.g., 30%)

31. Due Diligence

- 31.1 UNDP reserves the right to undertake a due diligence exercise, also called post qualification, aimed at determining to its satisfaction, the validity of the information provided by the Bidder. Such exercise shall be fully documented and may include, but need not be limited to, all or any combination of the following:
 - Verification of accuracy, correctness and authenticity of information provided by the Bidder;
 - b) Validation of extent of compliance to the RFP requirements and evaluation criteria based on what has so far been found by the evaluation team;

- c) Inquiry and reference checking with Government entities with jurisdiction on the Bidder, or with previous clients, or any other entity that may have done business with the Bidder;
- d) Inquiry and reference checking with previous clients on the performance on on-going or contracts completed, including physical inspections of previous works, as necessary;
- e) Physical inspection of the Bidder's offices, branches or other places where business transpires, with or without notice to the Bidder;
- f) Other means that UNDP may deem appropriate, at any stage within the selection process, prior to awarding the contract.

32. Clarification of Proposals

- 32.1 To assist in the examination, evaluation and comparison of Proposals, UNDP may, at its discretion, ask any Bidder for a clarification of its Proposal.
- 32.2 UNDP's request for clarification and the response shall be in writing and no change in the prices or substance of the Proposal shall be sought, offered, or permitted, except to provide clarification, and confirm the correction of any arithmetic errors discovered by UNDP in the evaluation of the Proposals, in accordance with RFP.
- 32.3 Any unsolicited clarification submitted by a Bidder in respect to its Proposal, which is not a response to a request by UNDP, shall not be considered during the review and evaluation of the Proposals.

33. Responsiveness of Proposal

- 33.1 UNDP's determination of a Proposal's responsiveness will be based on the contents of the Proposal itself. A substantially responsive Proposal is one that conforms to all the terms, conditions, TOR and other requirements of the RFP without material deviation, reservation, or omission.
- 33.2 If a Proposal is not substantially responsive, it shall be rejected by UNDP and may not subsequently be made responsive by the Bidder by correction of the material deviation, reservation, or omission.

34. Nonconformities, Reparable Errors and Omissions

- 34.1 Provided that a Proposal is substantially responsive, UNDP may waive any non-conformities or omissions in the Proposal that, in the opinion of UNDP, do not constitute a material deviation.
- 34.2 UNDP may request the Bidder to submit the necessary information or documentation, within a reasonable period of time, to rectify nonmaterial nonconformities or omissions in the Proposal related to documentation requirements. Such omission shall not be related to any aspect of the price of the Proposal. Failure of the Bidder to comply with the request may result in the rejection of its Proposal.
- 34.3 For Financial Proposal that has been opened, UNDP shall check and correct arithmetical errors as follows:
 - a) if there is a discrepancy between the unit price and the line item total that is obtained by multiplying the unit price by the quantity, the unit price shall prevail and the line item total shall be corrected, unless in the opinion of UNDP there is an obvious misplacement of the decimal point in the unit price; in which case the line item total as quoted shall govern and the unit price shall be corrected;
 - b) if there is an error in a total corresponding to the addition or subtraction of subtotals, the subtotals shall prevail and the total shall be corrected; and

- c) if there is a discrepancy between words and figures, the amount in words shall prevail, unless the amount expressed in words is related to an arithmetic error, in which case the amount in figures shall prevail.
- 34.4 If the Bidder does not accept the correction of errors made by UNDP, its Proposal shall be rejected.

AWARD OF CONTRACT

35. Right to Accept, Reject, Any or All Proposals

35.1 UNDP reserves the right to accept or reject any Proposal, to render any or all of the Proposals as non-responsive, and to reject all Proposals at any time prior to award of contract, without incurring any liability, or obligation to inform the affected Bidder(s) of the grounds for UNDP's action. UNDP shall not be obliged to award the contract to the lowest priced offer.

36. Award Criteria

Prior to expiration of the proposal validity, UNDP shall award the contract to the qualified Bidder based on the award criteria indicated in the BDS.

37. Debriefing

37.1 In the event that a Bidder is unsuccessful, the Bidder may request a debriefing from UNDP. The purpose of the debriefing is to discuss the strengths and weaknesses of the Bidder's submission, in order to assist the Bidder in improving its future proposals for UNDP procurement opportunities. The content of other proposals and how they compare to the Bidder's submission shall not be discussed.

38. Right to Vary Requirements at the Time of Award

38.1 At the time of award of Contract, UNDP reserves the right to vary the quantity of services and/or goods, by up to a maximum twenty-five per cent (25%) of the total offer, without any change in the unit price or other terms and conditions.

39. Contract Signature

39.1 Within fifteen (15) days from the date of receipt of the Contract, the successful Bidder shall sign and date the Contract and return it to UNDP. Failure to do so may constitute sufficient grounds for the annulment of the award, and forfeiture of the Proposal Security, if any, and on which event, UNDP may award the Contract to the Second Ranked Bidder or call for new Proposals.

40. Contract Type and General Terms and Conditions

41. Performance Security

The Youth Empowerment Programme is exploring alternative channels to deliver entrepreneurial training to micro entrepreneurs as part of the Youth Empowerment Programme included blended learning with a mix of classroom, online and Interactive voice response (IVR) content. UNDP is particularly keen to promote female entrepreneurship. It plans to select at least one organization that has relevant background, experience and valid expertise in the identification and needs assessment of vulnerable youth, delivery of training, capacity development and mentorship services as well as monitoring and evaluation of micro entrepreneurship/business development programmes.

II. RESPONSIBILITIES

With a large portion (32%) of youth in Pakistan poverty-stricken and uneducated with no vocational and life skills, a big segment of the society remains vulnerable to violence and extremism. Investment in skills development and employment opportunities for youth is needed to reduce conflict but also help establish a foundation for long-term economic growth and prosperity in Pakistan. UNDP's Youth Empowerment Programme caters to the comprehensive global strategy that places youth at the forefront of its development work. It is a multi-pronged strategy aimed at creating pathways for the economic empowerment and constructive engagement of youth in Sindh and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa.

Since 2016, the Program has made considerable headway in equipping young people with the necessary skills and knowledge to become successful in an increasingly competitive market environment and promote social cohesion in their respective communities by assuming leadership roles. The Program has an extensive research component which aims at institutionalizing informed decision making on youth, peace, and development in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Sindh.

In 2018, the programme is exploring new and innovative avenues for skill and entrepreneurial trainings to facilitate youth economic empowerment. In this regard, UNDP is currently developing a mobile application which will be used to deliver entrepreneurial trainings to youth in Pakistan. The application will have a human-

centric approach which will incorporate a market relevant and up to date training content for online training and mentoring. In order to test the effectiveness of the content and the application, UNDP seeks to train an initial batch of 8,000 youth in the provinces of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Sindh and Balochistan. To do so, UNDP requires the services of a firm/organization/institution to support in the identification of potential/existing entrepreneurs in the aforementioned provinces (based on selection criteria which will be jointly developed by UNDP and the partner), carry out a total of 5 day training sessions with 8,000 selected youth (split into 2 sessions per person of 2 and 3 days respectively) using the UNDP approved materials (a blend of traditional classroom based, mobile IVR and e-learning tools including a mobile application which is currently being designed to ensure easier access to content for those with SMART phones), provide group/individual mentoring services during/between and after the training for a period of up to 3 months post-training and ensure quality monitoring and evaluation of the effectiveness of the training. Given the emphasis placed by UNDP on promoting female economic empowerment, at least 50% of the trainees should be female.

Based on the experience of the project, it has been realized that a comprehensive approach is required to support youth in establishing micro-enterprises, that caters to different skill requirements pertinent to challenges of starting a business and business development.

Due to limited employment opportunities and saturation of the job market, it has been observed that there is an immense motivation pulling youth towards entrepreneurship as opposed to being employed. While this trend can have a positive impact of creating employment opportunities and economic independence, it also highlights several social, cultural, and economic barriers preventing them to setup sustainable businesses. In light of these revelations it is observed that a 360-degree approach to entrepreneurship is required which not only focuses on the training aspect of the entrepreneurship journey but also focuses on the following pertinent issues in the entrepreneurial journey.

- 1. Generating a sustainable income
- 2. Understanding of trainees as to what being an entrepreneur means
- 3. Motivation of youth to start their own enterprise
- 4. Training to enable youth to set their own micro-enterprises. This includes market know-how, opportunities, bookkeeping, managing customers, use of social media, etc.
- 5. Capacity of the existing organizations to support micro-entrepreneurs
- 6. Developing market-linkages
- 7. Obtaining micro-credit to support the establishment of the micro-enterprises
- 8. Means of verifying micro-enterprise established by youth

Scope of Work

Youth Empowerment Programme of UNDP is seeking proposals from organizations for the delivery of the entrepreneurship skills trainings in the targeted areas of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Sindh. The organization will support entrepreneurship and self-employment interventions for young women and men, ensuring that they are increasingly built on lessons from the field operations and utilize blended methods of learning (classroom based and e-learning). The organization will strengthen entrepreneurial skills and competence for women and men and better understand how to make young people aware of specific opportunities for starting up a business, including understanding of existing value chains and the opportunities for linking young women and men into them. It will also seek to understand success factors affecting small and micro enterprise development – especially critical for informal economies lacking access to mentors, capital, and markets – particularly insofar as how they relate to women and men.

In particular, the contracting organization needs to carry out the following activities:

1. Identify potential candidates for the micro-entrepreneurship training (based on selection criteria developed jointly by UNDP and the partner) and ensuring 50% of proposed trainees are female.

- 2. Conduct Training Need Assessment (TNA) for the potential micro-entrepreneurs. Special consideration should be put in place to ensure that the training plan helps facilitate the active participation of young women, particularly young women who are already economically active or who have family obligations. Childcare facilities can be considered if required.
- 3. Review content finalized by UNDP (including a mobile application which is currently being designed by UNDP to ensure easier access to content for those with SMART phones) and provide suggestions on improvement of the content based on the needs assessments.
- 4. Deliver training to 8,000 youth using the finalized content. As UNDP is looking to devise a model for mass-training on micro-entrepreneurship skills, training plans which seek to reach the maximum number of trainees in the least amount of funds will be preferred. Use of technology and innovation to ensure low-cost access to micro-entrepreneurship training is encouraged.
- 5. Provide mentorship services to the trained youth (at least 3 group mentoring sessions and 3 individual sessions per person trained). Again, special measures may need to be put in place to ensure women are able to attend these mentoring sessions.
- 6. Carry out effective monitoring and evaluation of the training programme and suggest improvements.
- 7. Provide a platform for market linkages and further support to the trainees by supporting in the distribution of grants/equipment to selected micro-entrepreneurs for the duration of the contract.
