TERMS OF REFERENCE AND TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS

Automated Early Warning System on Elephants

A. BACKGROUND

"Enhancing Biodiversity Conservation and Sustenance of Ecosystems services in Environmentally Sensitive Areas" is a Global Environment Facility funded project, implemented by the Ministry of Mahaweli Development and Environment (MoMDE) and supported by UNDP, Sri Lanka. The primary objective of this project is "to operationalize Environmentally Sensitive Areas (ESA) as a mechanism for mainstreaming biodiversity management into development, in areas of high conservation significance and this is pilot tested presently at the Kala Oya Basin.

While mainstreaming biodiversity in to development, finding sustainable solutions to human wild animal conflict is one of the remarkable preconditions. Damages to humans, crops and properties of the forest adjacent communities by the wild elephants and killings elephants back by humans have been reported consistently over the last several centuries in Sri Lanka (Department of Wildlife Conservation [DWC], 2008). However, today the human elephant conflict has come to its climax due to rapid loss of elephant habitats including blocking of their movement parts by human actions including large scale land alteration for development. The human population of Sri Lanka has increased by 150% during the last 6 decades (1950-2010) while wild elephant population seems be increased as the population structure of the group is quite healthy. These two figures are sufficient to realize the magnitude of the human elephant conflict in the current context of Sri Lanka where both parties are seriously affected by each other. Presently, local communities of the forest belts, the government agencies and many other non-governmental development agencies are desperately looking for a sustainable solution for human elephant conflict, as it has become one of the crucial constraints to enhance the living conditions of the people live by the forest belt. Moreover, intensified human elephant conflict has undermined most measures taken by the DWC to protect wild elephants and to control the conflict by adopting the situations and it has become the prime cause for elephant deaths in the country today.

While supporting the DWC and other stakeholders on management plan and biodiversity integrated land use plan preparations in Kala Oya Basin the project intends to strengthen the DWC's work on mitigating human elephant conflicts in the region via working with particularly affected communities to develop community action plans – including inter-community early warning systems, plantation of biological fences and supporting habitat improvement activities for elephants as prescribed by the Management Plans for the PAs.

B. SCOPE OF SERVICES, EXPECTED OUTPUTS AND TARGET COMPLETION

Scope:

UNDP requires to pilot test an Automated Elephant Proximity Alarm System as a sustainable solution to mitigate the human wild elephant conflict in the area.

i. <u>Technical Specification:</u>

The System Operation Cycle should be on following order, any add-ons must be notified

- Identify the Approaching Elephants at least 1 km radius distance to Local residences
- Identify the Approaching Zone (The Area Had to divide into sectors (North/ Northwest /South Southwest etc. At least 8 Zones to identify the elephant approaching direction)
- Visible sensor poles (minimum 10 feet height) will flash 1W Red Color Led Flashers covering 360 degrees of the pole if elephant within its range.
- Notify the Control Unit (Using DATA Communications / Radio Frequency)- The control unit has to be fully automated.
- Notify the Colombo Centre/ Local DWC Offices (Using SMS Service / Data Communication to Colombo DWC office)
- SMS Alerts for Village Residences
- Siren Alarm for Village (120 Db siren All the villagers live within GND must hear the siren So one or more to cover the village)
- When Elephant Leaves Reset of the System (Remote or Local) and system will notify the villagers with another SMS when elephant left or chase away

Elephant Identification

Suggested Elephant Identification Methods (Use the combination of methods based on geographic conditions to identify the Elephant from distance and state the methods against financial quotes)

- Elephant Infrasonic Rumble
- High Mounted Passive Infra-Red (PIR)
- Virtual Fence
- Camera Detection (no recording required, and it has to be a night vision with at least 500 M range. Camera software has to identify the elephants only using machine learning.)

- Fully Automated Solar powered Smart Controller with self-reporting and fault-finding System.
- Tamper Security
- Wireless Connectivity up to 256 Sensors
- Remote Monitoring support
- GSM and/or DATA commutations (Bi directional)
- SMS Alert System Over 500 mobile numbers Maximum time limit of 5Min to deliver 500 SMS

- Siren Alarm (How many times 3) flash will off once elephants leave 20 Seconds for every 10Min until elephant leaves the zone.
- Distress AM Signal Broadcast Facility

System Security and Safety

All System Sensors and solar panels has to be protected by a motion activated capacitor discharge Mini Energizers (Recommended Voltage 10000V – Maximum of 120Miliamps) All sensors have to automatically report its working states to control unit If a sensor not responding the control unit has to notify the location to check

Main Controller has to have 2 Computers (Main & Backup) to ensure system continues working All equipment's needs to cover with CE certification and RoHS certification.

Maintains and Warranty

Minimum 2 years Warranty from the finalization date

Nominated DWC staff will be trained on replacing and rebuilding of every part in system. Every part will be numbered and has to be ready to plug and play.

Acceptance of this Purchase Order shall effect a contract between the Parties under which the rights and obligations of the Parties shall be governed solely by the terms and conditions of this Purchase Order, including these General Conditions. No additional or inconsistent provisions proposed by the Supplier shall bind UNDP unless agreed to in writing by a duly authorized official of UNDP.

2. PAYMENT

- 2.1 UNDP shall, on fulfillment of the Delivery Terms, unless otherwise provided in this Purchase Order, make payment within 30 days of receipt of the Supplier's invoice for the goods and copies of the shipping documents specified in this Purchase Order.
- 2.2 Payment against the invoice referred to above will reflect any discount shown under the payment terms of this Purchase Order, provided payment is made within the period required by such payment terms.
- 2.3 Unless authorized by UNDP, the Supplier shall submit one invoice in respect of this Purchase Order, and such invoice must indicate the Purchase Order's identification number.
- 2.4 The prices shown in this Purchase Order may not be increased except by express written agreement of UNDP.

3. TAX EXEMPTION

- 7.1 UNDP shall have a reasonable time after delivery of the goods to inspect them and to reject and refuse acceptance of goods not conforming to this Purchase Order; payment for goods pursuant to this Purchase Order shall not be deemed an acceptance of the goods.
- 7.2 Inspection prior to shipment does not relieve the Supplier from any of its contractual obligations.

8. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY INFRINGEMENT

The Supplier warrants that the use or supply by UNDP of the goods sold under this Purchase Order does not infringe any patent, design, trade-name or trade-mark. In addition, the Supplier shall, pursuant to this warranty, indemnify, defend and hold UNDP and the United Nations harmless from any actions or claims brought against UNDP or the United Nations pertaining to the alleged infringement of a patent, design, trade-name or trade-mark arising in connection with the goods sold under this Purchase Order.

9. RIGHTS OF UNDP

In case of failure by the Supplier to fulfil its obligations under the terms and conditions of this Purchase Order, including but not limited to failure to obtain necessary export licences, or to make delivery of all or part of the goods by the agreed delivery date or dates, UNDP may, after giving the Supplier reasonable notice to perform and without prejudice to any other rights or remedies, exercise one or more of the following rights:

- 9.1 Procure all or part of the goods from other sources, in which event UNDP may hold the Supplier responsible for any excess cost occasioned thereby.
- 9.2 Refuse to accept delivery of all or part of the goods.
- 9.3 Cancel this Purchase Order without any liability for termination charges or any other liability of any kind of UNDP.

10. LATE DELIVERY

Without limiting any other rights or obligations of the parties hereunder, if the Supplier will be unable to deliver the goods by the delivery date(s) stipulated in this Purchase Order, the Supplier shall (i) immediately consult with UNDP to determine the most expeditious means for delivering the goods and (ii) use an expedited means of delivery, at the Supplier's cost (unless the delay is due to Force Majeure), if reasonably so requested by UNDP.

11. ASSIGNMENT AND INSOLVENCY

- 11.1. The Supplier shall not, except after obtaining the written consent of UNDP, assign, transfer, pledge or make other disposition of this Purchase Order, or any part thereof, or any of the Supplier's rights or obligations under this Purchase Order.
- 11.2. Should the Supplier become insolvent or should control of the Supplier change by virtue of insolvency, UNDP may, without prejudice to any other rights or remedies, immediately terminate this Purchase Order by giving the Supplier written notice of termination.

12. USE OF UNDP OR UNITED NATIONS NAME OR EMBLEM

The Supplier shall not use the name, emblem or official seal of UNDP or the United Nations for any purpose.

13. PROHIBITION ON ADVERTISING

The Supplier shall not advertise or otherwise make public that it is furnishing goods or services to UNDP without specific permission of UNDP in each instance.

14. CHILD LABOUR

The Supplier represents and warrants that neither it nor any of its affiliates is engaged in any practice inconsistent with the rights set forth in the Convention on the Rights of the Child, including Article 32 thereof, which, inter alia, requires that a child shall be protected from performing any work that is likely to be hazardous or to interfere with the child's education, or to be harmful to the child's health or physical, mental, spiritual, moral or social development.

Any breach of this representation and warranty shall entitle UNDP to terminate this Purchase Order immediately upon notice to the Supplier, without any liability for termination charges or any other liability of any kind of UNDP.

15. MINES

The Supplier represents and warrants that neither it nor any of its affiliates is actively and directly engaged in patent activities, development, assembly, production, trade or manufacture of mines or in such activities in respect of components primarily utilized in the manufacture of Mines. The term "Mines" means those devices defined in Article 2, Paragraphs 1, 4 and 5 of Protocol II annexed to the Convention on Prohibitions and Restrictions on the Use of Certain Conventional Weapons Which May Be Deemed to Be Excessively Injurious or to Have Indiscriminate Effects of 1980.

Any breach of this representation and warranty shall entitle UNDP to terminate this Purchase Order immediately upon notice to the Supplier, without any liability for termination charges or any other liability of any kind of UNDP.

16. SETTLEMENT OF DISPUTES

- **16.1 Amicable Settlement.** The Parties shall use their best efforts to settle amicably any dispute, controversy or claim arising out of, or relating to this Purchase Order or the breach, termination or invalidity thereof. Where the Parties wish to seek such an amicable settlement through conciliation, the conciliation shall take place in accordance with the UNCITRAL Conciliation Rules then obtaining, or according to such other procedure as may be agreed between the Parties.
- **16.2 Arbitration.** Unless, any such dispute, controversy or claim between the Parties arising out of or relating to this Purchase Order or the breach, termination or invalidity thereof is settled amicably under the preceding paragraph of this Section within sixty (60) days after receipt by one Party of the other Party's request for such amicable settlement, such dispute, controversy or claim shall be referred by either Party to arbitration in accordance with the UNCITRAL Arbitration Rules then obtaining, including its provisions on applicable law. The arbitral tribunal shall have no authority to award punitive damages. The Parties shall be bound by any arbitration award rendered as a result of such arbitration as the final adjudication of any such controversy, claim or dispute.

17. PRIVILEGES AND IMMUNITIES

Nothing in or related to these General Terms and Conditions or this Purchase Order shall be deemed a waiver of any of the privileges and immunities of the United Nations, including its subsidiary organs.

18. SEXUAL EXPLOITATION:

18.1 The Contractor shall take all appropriate measures to prevent sexual exploitation or abuse of anyone by it or by any of its employees or any other persons who may be engaged by the Contractor to perform any services under the Contract. For these purposes, sexual activity with any person less than eighteen years of age, regardless of any laws relating to consent, shall constitute the sexual exploitation and abuse of such person. In addition, the Contractor shall refrain from, and shall take all appropriate measures to prohibit its employees or other persons engaged by it from, exchanging any money, goods,

services, offers of employment or other things of value, for sexual favors or activities, or from engaging in any sexual activities that are exploitive or degrading to any person. The Contractor acknowledges and agrees that the provisions hereof constitute an essential term of the Contract and that any breach of this representation and warranty shall entitle UNDP to terminate the Contract immediately upon notice to the Contractor, without any liability for termination charges or any other liability of any kind.

18.2 UNDP shall not apply the foregoing standard relating to age in any case in which the Contractor's personnel or any other person who may be engaged by the Contractor to perform any services under the Contract is married to the person less than the age of eighteen years with whom sexual activity has occurred and in which such marriage is recognized as valid under the laws of the country of citizenship of such Contractor's personnel or such other person who may be engaged by the Contractor to perform any services under the Contractor's personnel or such other person who may be engaged by the Contractor to perform any services under the Contract.

19.0 OFFICIALS NOT TO BENEFIT:

The Contractor warrants that no official of UNDP or the United Nations has received or will be offered by the Contractor any direct or indirect benefit arising from this Contract or the award thereof. The Contractor agrees that breach of this provision is a breach of an essential term of this Contract.

20. AUTHORITY TO MODIFY:

Pursuant to the Financial Regulations and Rules of UNDP, only the UNDP Authorized Official possess the authority to agree on behalf of UNDP to any modification of or change in this Agreement, to a waiver of any of its provisions or to any additional contractual relationship of any kind with the Contractor. Accordingly, no modification or change in this Contract shall be valid and enforceable against UNDP unless provided by an amendment to this Agreement signed by the Contractor and jointly by the UNDP Authorized Official.
