Section 2. Instruction to Bidders

GENERAL PROVISIONS

1. Introduction

- Bidders shall adhere to all the requirements of this ITB, including any amendments made in writing by UNDP. This ITB is conducted in accordance with the UNDP Programme and Operations Policies and Procedures (POPP) on Contracts and Procurement which can be accessed at https://popp.undp.org/SitePages/POPPBSUnit.aspx?TermID=254a9f96-b883-476a-8ef8-e81f93a2b38d
- Any Bid submitted will be regarded as an offer by the Bidder and does not
 constitute or imply the acceptance of the Bid by UNDP. UNDP is under no
 obligation to award a contract to any Bidder as a result of this ITB.
- UNDP reserves the right to cancel the procurement process at any stage without any liability of any kind for UNDP, upon notice to the bidders or publication of cancellation notice on UNDP website.
- As part of the bid, it is desired that the Bidder registers at the United Nations Global Marketplace (UNGM) website (www.ungm.org). The Bidder may still submit a bid even if not registered with the UNGM. However, if the Bidder is selected for contract award, the Bidder must register on the UNGM prior to contract signature.

2. Fraud & Corruption, Gifts and Hospitality

- UNDP strictly enforces a policy of zero tolerance on proscribed practices, including fraud, corruption, collusion, unethical or unprofessional practices, and obstruction of UNDP vendors and requires all bidders/vendors observe the highest standard of ethics during the procurement process and contract implementation. - Bidders/vendors shall not offer gifts or hospitality of any kind to UNDP staff
 members including recreational trips to sporting or cultural events, theme
 parks or offers of holidays, transportation, or invitations to extravagant
 lunches or dinners.
- In pursuance of this policy, UNDP:
 - (a) Shall reject a bid if it determines that the selected bidder has engaged in any corrupt or fraudulent practices in competing for the contract in question;
 - (b) Shall declare a vendor ineligible, either indefinitely or for a stated period, to be awarded a contract if at any time it determines that the vendor has engaged in any corrupt or fraudulent practices in competing for, or in executing a UNDP contract.

3. Eligibility

- A vendor should not be suspended, debarred, or otherwise identified as ineligible by any UN Organization or the World Bank Group or any other international Organization. Vendors are therefore required to disclose to UNDP whether they are subject to any sanction or temporary suspension imposed by these organizations.
- It is the Bidder's responsibility to ensure that its employees, joint venture members, sub-contractors, service providers, suppliers and/or their



employees meet the eligibility requirements as established by UNDP.

4. Conflict of Interests

- Bidders must strictly avoid conflicts with other assignments or their own interests, and act without consideration for future work. Bidders found to have a conflict of interest shall be disqualified. Without limitation on the generality of the above, Bidders, and any of their affiliates, shall be considered to have a conflict of interest with one or more parties in this solicitation process, if they:
 - a) Are or have been associated in the past, with a firm or any of its affiliates which have been engaged by UNDP to provide services for the preparation of the design, specifications, Terms of Reference, cost analysis/estimation, and other documents to be used for the procurement of the goods and services in this selection process;
 - b) Were involved in the preparation and/or design of the programme/project related to the goods and/or services requested under this ITB; or
 - c) Are found to be in conflict for any other reason, as may be established by, or at the discretion of UNDP.
- In the event of any uncertainty in the interpretation of a potential conflict of interest, Bidders must disclose to UNDP, and seek UNDP's confirmation on whether or not such conflict exists.
- Similarly, the Bidders must disclose in their Bid their knowledge of the following:
 - a) If the owners, part-owners, officers, directors, controlling shareholders, of the bidding entity or key personnel who are family members of UNDP staff involved in the procurement functions and/or the Government of the country or any Implementing Partner receiving goods and/or services under this ITB; and
 - b) All other circumstances that could potentially lead to actual or perceived conflict of interest, collusion or unfair competition practices.
 Failure to disclose such an information may result in the rejection of the Bid or Bids affected by the non-disclosure.
- The eligibility of Bidders that are wholly or partly owned by the Government shall be subject to UNDP's further evaluation and review of various factors such as being registered, operated and managed as an independent business entity, the extent of Government ownership/share, receipt of subsidies, mandate and access to information in relation to this ITB, among others. Conditions that may lead to undue advantage against other Bidders may result in the eventual rejection of the Bid.

B. PREPARATION OF BIDS

- General Considerations
- In preparing the Bid, the Bidder is expected to examine the ITB in detail. Material deficiencies in providing the information requested in the ITB may result in rejection of the Bid.
- The Bidder will not be permitted to take advantage of any errors or omissions in the ITB. Should such errors or omissions be discovered, the Bidder must notify the UNDP accordingly.
- 6. Cost of Preparation of Bid
- The Bidder shall bear all costs related to the preparation and/or submission of the Bid, regardless of whether its Bid is selected or not. UNDP shall not be responsible or liable for those costs, regardless of the conduct or outcome of the procurement process.



- 7. Language
- The Bid, as well as any and all related correspondence exchanged by the Bidder and UNDP, shall be written in the language (s) specified in the BDS.
- 8. Documents
 Comprising the Bid
- The Bid shall comprise of the following documents and related forms which details are provided in the BDS:
 - a) Documents Establishing the Eligibility and Qualifications of the Bidder;
 - b) Technical Bid;
 - c) Price Schedule:
 - d) Bid Security, if required by BDS;
 - e) Any attachments and/or appendices to the Bid.
- Documents
 Establishing the
 Eligibility and
 Qualifications of the
 Bidder
- The Bidder shall furnish documentary evidence of its status as an eligible and qualified vendor, using the Forms provided under Section 6 and providing documents required in those forms. In order to award a contract to a Bidder, its qualifications must be documented to UNDP's satisfaction.
- 10. Technical Bid Format and Content
- The Bidder is required to submit a Technical Bid using the Standard Forms and templates provided in Section 6 of the ITB.
- Samples of items, when required as per Section 5, shall be provided within
 the time specified and unless otherwise specified by the Purchaser, at no
 expense to the UNDP. If not destroyed by testing, samples will be returned
 at Bidder's request and expense, unless otherwise specified.
- When applicable and required as per Section 5, the Bidder shall describe the
 necessary training programme available for the maintenance and operation
 of the equipment offered as well as the cost to the UNDP. Unless otherwise
 specified, such training as well as training materials shall be provided in the
 language of the Bid as specified in the BDS.
- When applicable and required as per Section 5, the Bidder shall certify the availability of spare parts for a period of at least five (5) years from date of delivery, or as otherwise specified in this ITB.
- 11. Price Schedule
- The Price Schedule shall be prepared using the Form provided in Section 6 of the ITB and taking into consideration the requirements in the ITB.
- Any requirement described in the Technical Bid but not priced in the Price Schedule, shall be assumed to be included in the prices of other activities or items, as well as in the final total price.
- 12. Bid Security
- A Bid Security, if required by BDS, shall be provided in the amount and form indicated in the BDS. The Bid Security shall be valid for a minimum of thirty (30) days after the final date of validity of the Bid.
- The Bid Security shall be included along with the Bid. If Bid Security is required by the ITB but is not found in the Bid, the offer shall be rejected.
- If the Bid Security amount or its validity period is found to be less than what is required by UNDP, UNDP shall reject the Bid.
- In the event an electronic submission is allowed in the BDS, Bidders shall
 include a copy of the Bid Security in their bid and the original of the Bid
 Security must be sent via courier or hand delivery as per the instructions in
 RDS
- The Bid Security may be forfeited by UNDP, and the Bid rejected, in the event of any, or combination, of the following conditions:



- a) If the Bidder withdraws its offer during the period of the Bid Validity specified in the BDS, or;
- b) In the event the successful Bidder fails:
 - i. to sign the Contract after UNDP has issued an award; or
 - ii. to furnish the Performance Security, insurances, or other documents that UNDP may require as a condition precedent to the effectivity of the contract that may be awarded to the Bidder.

13. Currencies

- All prices shall be quoted in the currency or currencies indicated in the BDS.
 Where Bids are quoted in different currencies, for the purposes of comparison of all Bids:
 - a) UNDP will convert the currency quoted in the Bid into the UNDP preferred currency, in accordance with the prevailing UN operational rate of exchange on the last day of submission of Bids; and
 - b) In the event that UNDP selects a Bid for award that is quoted in a currency different from the preferred currency in the BDS, UNDP shall reserve the right to award the contract in the currency of UNDP's preference, using the conversion method specified above.

Joint Venture, Consortium or Association

- If the Bidder is a group of legal entities that will form or have formed a Joint Venture (JV), Consortium or Association for the Bid, they shall confirm in their Bid that: (i) they have designated one party to act as a lead entity, duly vested with authority to legally bind the members of the JV, Consortium or Association jointly and severally, which shall be evidenced by a duly notarized Agreement among the legal entities, and submitted with the Bid; and (ii) if they are awarded the contract, the contract shall be entered into, by and between UNDP and the designated lead entity, who shall be acting for and on behalf of all the member entities comprising the joint venture.
- After the Deadline for Submission of Bid, the lead entity identified to represent the JV, Consortium or Association shall not be altered without the prior written consent of UNDP.
- The lead entity and the member entities of the JV, Consortium or Association shall abide by the provisions of Clause 15 herein in respect of submitting only one Bid.
- The description of the organization of the JV, Consortium or Association must clearly define the expected role of each of the entities in the joint venture in delivering the requirements of the ITB, both in the Bid and the JV, Consortium or Association Agreement. All entities that comprise the JV, Consortium or Association shall be subject to the eligibility and qualification assessment by UNDP.
- A JV, Consortium or Association in presenting its track record and experience should clearly differentiate between:
 - a) Those that were undertaken together by the JV, Consortium or Association; and
 - Those that were undertaken by the individual entities of the JV, Consortium or Association.
- Previous contracts completed by individual experts working privately but who are permanently or were temporarily associated with any of the member firms cannot be claimed as the experience of the JV, Consortium or Association or those of its members, but should only be claimed by the individual experts themselves in their presentation of their individual credentials



 JV, Consortium or Associations are encouraged for high value, multi-sectoral requirements when the spectrum of expertise and resources required may not be available within one firm.

15. Only One Bid

- The Bidder (including the individual members of any Joint Venture) shall submit only one Bid, either in its own name or as part of a Joint Venture.
- Bids submitted by two (2) or more Bidders shall all be rejected if they are found to have any of the following:
 - a) they have at least one controlling partner, director or shareholder in common; or
 - b) any one of them receive or have received any direct or indirect subsidy from the other/s; or
 - c) they have the same legal representative for purposes of this ITB; or
 - d) they have a relationship with each other, directly or through common third parties, that puts them in a position to have access to information about, or influence on the Bid of another Bidder regarding this ITB process;
 - e) they are subcontractors to each other's Bid, or a subcontractor to one Bid also submits another Bid under its name as lead Bidder; or some key personnel proposed to be in the team of one Bidder participates in more than one Bid received for this ITB process. This condition relating to the personnel, does not apply to subcontractors being included in more than one Bid.

16. Bid Validity Period

- Bids shall remain valid for the period specified in the BDS, commencing on the Deadline for Submission of Bids. A Bid valid for a shorter period may be rejected by UNDP and rendered non-responsive.
- During the Bid validity period, the Bidder shall maintain its original Bid without any change, including the availability of the Key Personnel, the proposed rates and the total price.

17. Extension of Bid Validity Period

- In exceptional circumstances, prior to the expiration of the Bid validity period, UNDP may request Bidders to extend the period of validity of their Bids. The request and the responses shall be made in writing, and shall be considered integral to the Bid.
- If the Bidder agrees to extend the validity of its Bid, it shall be done without any change to the original Bid.
- The Bidder has the right to refuse to extend the validity of its Bid, in which case, the Bid shall not be further evaluated.

18. Clarification of Bid (from the Bidders)

- Bidders may request clarifications on any of the ITB documents no later than
 the date indicated in the BDS. Any request for clarification must be sent in
 writing in the manner indicated in the BDS. If inquiries are sent other than
 specified channel, even if they are sent to a UNDP staff member, UNDP shall
 have no obligation to respond or confirm that the query was officially
 received.
- UNDP will provide the responses to clarifications through the method specified in the BDS.
- UNDP shall endeavour to provide responses to clarifications in an
 expeditious manner, but any delay in such response shall not cause an
 obligation on the part of UNDP to extend the submission date of the Bids,
 unless UNDP deems that such an extension is justified and necessary.

19. Amendment of Bids

At any time prior to the deadline of Bid submission, UNDP may for any

reason, such as in response to a clarification requested by a Bidder, modify the ITB in the form of an amendment to the ITB. Amendments will be made available to all prospective bidders.

- If the amendment is substantial, UNDP may extend the Deadline for submission of Bid to give the Bidders reasonable time to incorporate the amendment into their Bids.
- 20. Alternative Bids
- Unless otherwise specified in the BDS, alternative Bids shall not be considered. If submission of alternative Bid is allowed by BDS, a Bidder may submit an alternative Bid, but only if it also submits a Bid conforming to the ITB requirements. Where the conditions for its acceptance are met, or justifications are clearly established, UNDP reserves the right to award a contract based on an alternative Bid.
- If multiple/alternative bids are being submitted, they must be clearly marked as "Main Bid" and "Alternative Bid"
- 21. Pre-Bid Conference
- When appropriate, a pre-bid conference will be conducted at the date, time and location specified in the BDS. All Bidders are encouraged to attend. Non-attendance, however, shall not result in disqualification of an interested Bidder. Minutes of the Bidder's conference will be disseminated on the procurement website and shared by email or on the e-Tendering platform as specified in the BDS. No verbal statement made during the conference shall modify the terms and conditions of the ITB, unless specifically incorporated in the Minutes of the Bidder's Conference or issued/posted as an amendment to ITB.

C. SUBMISSION AND OPENING OF BIDS

- 22. Submission
- The Bidder shall submit a duly signed and complete Bid comprising the documents and forms in accordance with requirements in the BDS. The Price Schedule shall be submitted together with the Technical Bid. Bid can be delivered either personally, by courier, or by electronic method of transmission as specified in the BDS.
- The Bid shall be signed by the Bidder or person(s) duly authorized to commit the Bidder. The authorization shall be communicated through a document evidencing such authorization issued by the legal representative of the bidding entity, or a Power of Attorney, accompanying the Bid.
- Bidders must be aware that the mere act of submission of a Bid, in and of itself, implies that the Bidder fully accepts the UNDP General Contract Terms and Conditions.

Hard copy (manual) submission

- Hard copy (manual) submission by courier or hand delivery allowed or specified in the BDS shall be governed as follows:
 - a) The signed Bid shall be marked "Original", and its copies marked "Copy" as appropriate. The number of copies is indicated in the BDS. All copies shall be made from the signed original only. If there are discrepancies between the original and the copies, the original shall prevail.
 - (b) The Technical Bid and Price Schedule must be sealed and submitted together in an envelope, which_shall:
 - Bear the name of the Bidder; i.
 - Be addressed to UNDP as specified in the BDS; and ii.
 - Bear a warning not to open before the time and date for Bid opening as specified in the BDS.

If the envelope with the Bid is not sealed and marked as required, UNDP shall assume no responsibility for the misplacement, loss, or premature opening of the Bid.

Email and eTendering submissions

- Electronic submission through email or eTendering, if allowed as specified in the BDS, shall be governed as follows:
 - a) Electronic files that form part of the Bid must be in accordance with the format and requirements indicated in BDS;
 - b) Documents which are required to be in original form (e.g. Bid Security, etc.) must be sent via courier or hand delivered as per the instructions in BDS.
- Detailed instructions on how to submit, modify or cancel a bid in the
 eTendering system are provided in the eTendering system Bidder User
 Guide and Instructional videos available on this link:
 http://www.undp.org/content/undp/en/home/operations/procurement/business/procurement-notices/resources/

23. Deadline for Submission of Bids and Late Bids

- Complete Bids must be received by UNDP in the manner, and no later than the date and time, specified in the BDS. UNDP shall only recognise the actual date and time that the bid was received by UNDP
- UNDP shall not consider any Bid that is received after the deadline for the submission of Bids.

24. Withdrawal, Substitution, and Modification of Bids

- A Bidder may withdraw, substitute or modify its Bid after it has been submitted at any time prior to the deadline for submission.
- Manual and Email submissions: A bidder may withdraw, substitute or modify
 its Bid by sending a written notice to UNDP, duly signed by an authorized
 representative, and shall include a copy of the authorization (or a Power of
 Attorney). The corresponding substitution or modification of the Bid, if any,
 must accompany the respective written notice. All notices must be
 submitted in the same manner as specified for submission of Bids, by clearly
 marking them as "WITHDRAWAL" "SUBSTITUTION," or "MODIFICATION"
- eTendering: A Bidder may withdraw, substitute or modify its Bid by Cancelling, Editing, and re-submitting the Bid directly in the system. It is the responsibility of the Bidder to properly follow the system instructions, duly edit and submit a substitution or modification of the Bid as needed. Detailed instructions on how to cancel or modify a Bid directly in the system are provided in the Bidder User Guide and Instructional videos.
- Bids requested to be withdrawn shall be returned unopened to the Bidders (only for manual submissions), except if the bid is withdrawn after the bid has been opened.

25. Bid Opening

- UNDP will open the Bid in the presence of an ad-hoc committee formed by UNDP of at least two (2) members.
- The Bidders' names, modifications, withdrawals, the condition of the envelope labels/seals, the number of folders/files and all other such other details as UNDP may consider appropriate, will be announced at the opening. No Bid shall be rejected at the opening stage, except for late submissions, in which case, the Bid shall be returned unopened to the Bidders.
- In the case of e-Tendering submission, bidders will receive an automatic



notification once the Bid is opened.

D. EVALUATION OF BIDS

26. Confidentiality

- Information relating to the examination, evaluation, and comparison of Bids, and the recommendation of contract award, shall not be disclosed to Bidders or any other persons not officially concerned with such process, even after publication of the contract award.
- Any effort by a Bidder or anyone on behalf of the Bidder to influence UNDP in the examination, evaluation and comparison of the Bids or contract award decisions may, at UNDP's decision, result in the rejection of its Bid and may subsequently be subject to the application of prevailing UNDP's vendor sanctions procedures.

27. Evaluation of Bids

- UNDP will conduct the evaluation solely on the basis of the Bids received.
- Evaluation of Bids shall be undertaken in the following steps:
 - a) Preliminary Examination including Eligibility
 - b) Arithmetical check and ranking of bidders who passed preliminary examination by price.
 - c) Qualification assessment (if pre-qualification was not done)
 - a) Evaluation of Technical Bids
 - b) Evaluation of prices

Detailed evaluation will be focussed on the 3 - 5 lowest priced bids. Further higher priced bids shall be added for evaluation if necessary

28. Preliminary Examination

 UNDP shall examine the Bids to determine whether they are complete with respect to minimum documentary requirements, whether the documents have been properly signed, and whether the Bids are generally in order, among other indicators that may be used at this stage. UNDP reserves the right to reject any Bid at this stage.

29. Evaluation of Eligibility and Qualification

- Eligibility and Qualification of the Bidder will be evaluated against the Minimum Eligibility/Qualification requirements specified in the Section 4 (Evaluation Criteria).
- In general terms, vendors that meet the following criteria may be considered qualified:
 - They are not included in the UN Security Council 1267/1989 Committee's list of terrorists and terrorist financiers, and in UNDP's ineligible vendors' list;
 - b) They have a good financial standing and have access to adequate financial resources to perform the contract and all existing commercial commitments,
 - They have the necessary similar experience, technical expertise, production capacity, quality certifications, quality assurance procedures and other resources applicable to the supply of goods and/or services required;
 - d) They are able to comply fully with the UNDP General Terms and Conditions of Contract;
 - e) They do not have a consistent history of court/arbitral award decisions against the Bidder; and
 - f) They have a record of timely and satisfactory performance with their clients.

30. Evaluation of Technical Bid and prices

The evaluation team shall review and evaluate the Technical Bids on the basis of their responsiveness to the Schedule of Requirements and Technical Specifications and other documentation provided, applying the procedure



indicated in the BDS and other ITB documents. When necessary, and if stated in the BDS, UNDP may invite technically responsive bidders for a presentation related to their technical Bids. The conditions for the presentation shall be provided in the bid document where required.

31. Due diligence

- UNDP reserves the right to undertake a due diligence exercise, aimed at
 determining to its satisfaction, the validity of the information provided by
 the Bidder. Such exercise shall be fully documented and may include, but
 need not be limited to, all or any combination of the following:
 - a) Verification of accuracy, correctness and authenticity of information provided by the Bidder;
 - b) Validation of extent of compliance to the ITB requirements and evaluation criteria based on what has so far been found by the evaluation team;
 - c) Inquiry and reference checking with Government entities with jurisdiction on the Bidder, or with previous clients, or any other entity that may have done business with the Bidder;
 - d) Inquiry and reference checking with previous clients on the performance on on-going or completed contracts, including physical inspections of previous works, as deemed necessary;
 - e) Physical inspection of the Bidder's offices, branches or other places where business transpires, with or without notice to the Bidder;
 - f) Other means that UNDP may deem appropriate, at any stage within the selection process, prior to awarding the contract.

32. Clarification of Bids

- To assist in the examination, evaluation and comparison of Bids, UNDP may, at its discretion, request any Bidder for a clarification of its Bid.
- UNDP's request for clarification and the response shall be in writing and no change in the prices or substance of the Bid shall be sought, offered, or permitted, except to provide clarification, and confirm the correction of any arithmetic errors discovered by UNDP in the evaluation of the Bids, in accordance with the ITB.
- Any unsolicited clarification submitted by a Bidder in respect to its Bid, which
 is not a response to a request by UNDP, shall not be considered during the
 review and evaluation of the Bids.

33. Responsiveness of Bid

- UNDP's determination of a Bid's responsiveness will be based on the contents of the bid itself. A substantially responsive Bid is one that conforms to all the terms, conditions, specifications and other requirements of the ITB without material deviation, reservation, or omission.
- If a bid is not substantially responsive, it shall be rejected by UNDP and may not subsequently be made responsive by the Bidder by correction of the material deviation, reservation, or omission.

34. Nonconformities, Reparable Errors and Omissions

- Provided that a Bid is substantially responsive, UNDP may waive any nonconformities or omissions in the Bid that, in the opinion of UNDP, do not constitute a material deviation.
- UNDP may request the Bidder to submit the necessary information or documentation, within a reasonable period, to rectify nonmaterial nonconformities or omissions in the Bid related to documentation requirements. Such omission shall not be related to any aspect of the price of the Bid. Failure of the Bidder to comply with the request may result in the rejection of its Bid.
- For the bids that have passed the preliminary examination, UNDP shall check



and correct arithmetical errors as follows:

- a) if there is a discrepancy between the unit price and the line item total that is obtained by multiplying the unit price by the quantity, the unit price shall prevail and the line item total shall be corrected, unless in the opinion of UNDP there is an obvious misplacement of the decimal point in the unit price; in which case, the line item total as quoted shall govern and the unit price shall be corrected;
- b) if there is an error in a total corresponding to the addition or subtraction of subtotals, the subtotals shall prevail and the total shall be corrected; and
- c) if there is a discrepancy between words and figures, the amount in words shall prevail, unless the amount expressed in words is related to an arithmetic error, in which case the amount in figures shall prevail.
- If the Bidder does not accept the correction of errors made by UNDP, its Bid shall be rejected.

E. AWARD OF CONTRACT

- 35. Right to Accept, Reject, Any or All Bids
- UNDP reserves the right to accept or reject any bid, to render any or all of the bids as non-responsive, and to reject all Bids at any time prior to award of contract, without incurring any liability, or obligation to inform the affected Bidder(s) of the grounds for UNDP's action. UNDP shall not be obliged to award the contract to the lowest priced offer.
- 36. Award Criteria
- Prior to expiration of the period of Bid validity, UNDP shall award the contract to the qualified and eligible Bidder that is found to be responsive to the requirements of the Schedule of Requirements and Technical Specification, and has offered the lowest price.
- 37. Debriefing
- In the event that a Bidder is unsuccessful, the Bidder may request for a debriefing from UNDP. The purpose of the debriefing is to discuss the strengths and weaknesses of the Bidder's submission, in order to assist the Bidder in improving its future Bids for UNDP procurement opportunities. The content of other Bids and how they compare to the Bidder's submission shall not be discussed.
- 38. Right to Vary
 Requirements at the
 Time of Award
- At the time of award of Contract, UNDP reserves the right to vary the quantity of goods and/or services, by up to a maximum twenty-five per cent (25%) of the total offer, without any change in the unit price or other terms and conditions.
- 39. Contract Signature
- Within fifteen (15) days from the date of receipt of the Contract, the successful Bidder shall sign and date the Contract and return it to UNDP. Failure to do so may constitute sufficient grounds for the annulment of the award, and forfeiture of the Bid Security, if any, and on which event, UNDP may award the Contract to the Second highest rated or call for new Bids.
- 40. Contract Type and General Terms and Conditions

Description of the Service

1.1 Background

Access to Information (a2i) Program has undertaken an initiative to develop generic payment system framework for the country that will primarily be used for social security beneficiaries and processing agencies. This will be a new payment service for the citizens of Bangladesh having bank account by using NID card. This shall be known as NID Enabled Payment System' and may also be referred to as "NEPS". NID number is a unique identification number issued by Election Commission of Bangladesh to the resident of Bangladesh. Any resident of Bangladesh holding NID number and having a bank account may be a part of the NID Enabled Payment System. The main objective of NEPS is as follows:

- To empower a bank customer to use NID as his/her identity to access his/her respective NID enabled bank account and perform basic banking transactions like balance enquiry, Cash deposit, cash withdrawal, remittances that are intrabank or interbank in nature, through MFS/ bank agent.
- To leapfrog the expansion of Digital Financial Inclusion in Bangladesh.
- To sub-serve the goal of Bangladesh Bank in electrification of retail payments.
- To enable banks to route the NID initiated interbank transactions through National Payment Switch of Bangladesh.
- To facilitate disbursements of Government entitlements such as Social Security pension, Handicapped Old Age Pension etc. of any Government bodies, using NID and authentication.
- To facilitate inter-operability across banks in a safe and secured manner.
- To build the foundation for a full range of NID enabled Banking services.

UNDP is interested to procure Servers, Network Switches and Installation, configuration and maintenance of these to host the NID enabled payment system into these servers.

1.2. Scope of Services

Supply, install, configure and maintenance of Servers, Network Switches and relevant works:

- a) One time Data Center Equipment cost for providing hardware such as Network Switch, Servers, Rack, Power & Network Connectivity items, Firewall Server, appropriate network Cabling etc. at Dhaka in purchaser's settled location including on premise and on call (including emergency) hardware support resource person on 24x7 basis
- b) One time on-site Installation price for hardware installation, accessories such as Switch, Servers, Rack CAT-6 cable/fiber patch cords, Data Center Supported SFP modules, Necessary works to establish power connectivity from within data center power room & Network Connectivity, Router and Switch Configurations, Firewall Server Preparations, appropriate network Cabling for server array and peering network inside the facility etc. in purchaser's settled location. Preferred installation site will be in a reputed ready built Telecom or Data Center infrastructure facility.
- c) NOC Monitoring System installation on purchaser's preferred location within Dhaka, Bangladesh



- d) The bidder will be responsible to provide/ supply all types of equipment/ spares that may be required for repair/ restoration of the said systems during maintenance period. Purchaser will not bear any logistics or any other cost for such activity. The bidder will keep sufficient amount of spares in stock, which are critical in nature at all times. Replacement of any hardware should not take more than 06 (Six) hrs.
- e) Bidder to propose and submit a high level design of Rack Diagram, Cable and Power Design along with technical proposal. The technical proposal should disclose the needed amount of electrical power consumption for obtaining uninterrupted services from collocation data center.
- f) The bidder will be responsible to carry out periodical routine check and system tuning as recommended by the original equipment manufacturer or best practices in this industry to ensure smooth, efficient and continuous operation of all times. Periodic preventive maintenance will be made quarterly.
- g) Upon successful installation, commissioning of the delivered system, a performance acceptance test (PAT) will be conducted to ensure the quality and availability of all required goods and services.

Tenure of the maintenance support/ service shall be for 03 (three) years with effect from the date of signing of the contract.
