So, it is crucial to diversify the labour force from agricultural sector to manufacturing and service sectors, especially to provide meaningful employment opportunities to approximately 300,000 young Cambodians (aged 15-30) who join the labour force every year. However, there are two key barriers to this proposed transition: Cambodian youth are inadequately skilled to fulfill the requirements of the industrial and service sectors, and there is a huge information gap about employment prospects of these sectors.	
	The long-term vision of the United Nations in Cambodia is to enhance collaboration and synergies between its agencies and development partners in order to give young women and men access to the right conditions and relevant skills to achieve decent employment and continual growth opportunities.
