I. BACKGROUND

The "Partnership Initiative for Institutional Development of Indonesia's South-South and Triangular Cooperation" project is a project implemented by UNDP Indonesia with support from the Royal Norwegian Embassy, under coordination from the Indonesia's Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

The project will be focusing on the achievement of three main outputs: 1) enhanced Institutional capacity in coordinating and managing Indonesia's south-south and triangular cooperation; 2) south-south triangular initiative implemented: peacebuilding through cross-border local economic development between Indonesia and Timor Leste: 3) enhanced Indonesia's role at global SSTC Forum.

The initiatives under the first output seek to support the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MoFA) in its mandate as leading ministry in the establishment of Indonesia's international development cooperation agency, including SSTC initiatives. There is a strong need from MoFA to initiate the exercise to develop Country/Regional Partnership Strategy for Indonesia's SSTC that will serve as the foundation for Indonesia's SSTC initiatives in the given country/region in the mid-term period (five-years). This document will serve as the guide for Indonesia's SSTC activities in the country/region which will be executed as soon as the Presidential Regulation that will regulate funding and programmatic mechanisms of Indonesia's SSTC is signed.

In close consultation with MoFA and other relevant government ministries, UNDP will facilitate the development of the Regional Partnership Strategy (RPS) in the second semester of 2018, which will involve desk review of existing public foreign policy and SSTC documents related to the region, and consultation with relevant units in MoFA and with relevant ministries/agencies involved in priority SSTC activities in the region and with the relevant stakeholders in the region. It is expected that the RPS document will be produced in the fourth quarter of 2018, to be further consulted and reviewed by MoFA and relevant Indonesian stakeholders and eventually adopted as an official document.

Therefore, in response to this need, UNDP Indonesia Country Office will hire an expert to conduct the development of the Regional Partnership Strategy of Indonesia's SSTC.

II. SCOPE OF WORK, ACTIVITIES, AND DELIVERABLES

Scope of Work

The Expert will work closely with the UNDP Country Office (CO), NPM and team of PIID-ISSTC Project to support the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, particularly the Directorate of Technical Cooperation, by conducting a study on the future trajectory of Indonesia's international development cooperation. The expert is expected to produce the following deliverables:

- 1. The inception plan that includes:
 - 1.1. Proposed approach for the RPS development
 - 1.2. The documents that will be reviewed
 - 1.3. The stakeholders that will be consulted
 - 1.4. An annotated outline of the RPS that includes information of the content of each of the parts
- 2. RPS of Indonesia's SSTC, which covers:
 - 2.1. The review of Indonesia's SSTC activities
 - 2.2. The review of Indonesia's foreign policy objectives in the selected region
 - 2.3. The approach of Indonesia's SSTC
 - 2.4. The approach of Indonesia's SSTC in the selected region
 - 2.5. The substantive focus areas of Indonesia's SSTC
 - 2.6. The substantive focus areas of Indonesia's SSTC in the selected region
 - 2.7. The demand and need of the stakeholders in the region
 - 2.8. The capacity of the Indonesian stakeholders in providing supply of technical assistance in the region
 - 2.9. Methodological notes
- 3. Presentation of the study to MoFA, relevant government ministries/agencies and UNDP in a half-day seminar organised by UNDP and MoFA.

III. WORKING ARRANGEMENTS
