1.	Please confirm the expected date of commencement of contract, since the listed in the bid docs is March 18, 2019 and the bid submission deadline is March 15, 2019?	Deadline for Bid submission is March 15 ^{th,} 2019 at 4:00 PM EST. Contract commencement will be changed to April 1, 2019.
2.	Can you confirm who owns the 'code' developed as part of this project?	The code will be owned by the Project Sponsors: UNDP / CARISECURE / Member Governments.
3.	Are projects in the "Support" phase, for which Implementation is completed acceptable under this criterion?	UNDP will accept as Past History/Experience projects which are currently engaged which are in the "Support Phase".
4.	Can you share an indication of the engagement value or budget at this stage? This will help us to provide only projects of "similar value".	UNDP can provide no details with respect to the budget under this solicitation.

5.	We are aware of two potentially similar applications in use now - OTRIS and PATRIOT is this project in any way related to these?	CariSECURE is not related to projects being referenced.
6.	Separate system for each target country will be developed, deployed and hosted in respective country. System functionalities will be applicable uniformly to all the countries. Is this correct assumption?	One System will be developed. The system will be deployed as different instances, in each target country (SLU, SKN, GUY). Each instance across countries should be identical.
7.	In case we use copywrite product and the customized part codes are shared, is this enough for source code sharing, or all the application codes, including all used copywrite protected licensed software source codes should be shared?	Any technology stack or configuration proposed must meet two basic criteria. [1] there are no on-going software license fees to be paid [2] the code can be accessed and modified by project sponsors without encumbrances. Quoting from the TOR under the Section "Overview of Functional & System Requirements" and Sub-section "Open Source Platform" it states: "The system will be developed using Open Source technologies as opposed to proprietary systems. This will eliminate the requirement for payment of annual software license fees and will ensure that, on hand-over, the primary stakeholder organisations can access the system's code base and APIs to further build and/or modify the system as new needs arise."(Pg 32) On pg 35 Section "Proposed Software Architecture/Technology Stack" sub-section" System Software Architecture" the TOR fur ther states: "The proposed Police IMS should be built upon an Open Source technology stack as mentioned in previous sections of this RFP. In this regard the Linux, Apache, MySQL and PHP (LAMP) architecture is preferred; however, the chosen firm may propose an alternative

	technology stack, or mix and match the above preferences with other open source technologies. In the event that the Company proposes other technologies, detailed and specific reasons for the choice/s should be communicated [incl. of an explanation of how such technologies meet pre-set requirements as per above]."
8. Are there any exceptions to the IP ownership? For example, Commercial Off the Shelf (COTS) products.	See response to Question 9 above.
9. Please confirm if the Overall project should be completed within a period of nine (9) months	Yes. This is the intention. As such bidders should propose at a resource level which will allow the project to be completed in this timeframe. Unforeseen delays are indeed just that. Unforeseen. But the project should be planned and proposed to allow it to remain on the schedule indicated in the TOR.

UNDP will accept as Past History/Experience projects which are currently engaged which are in the "Support Phase".

If it is yes, we understand that for a Joint Venture, compliance with the criteria about Section 4 (Evaluation Criteria-Qualification), will be calculate by adding the individual data of each participant. Is that correct?	Absolutely. Potential bidders are permitted to form consortiums to respond to this solicitation. Kindly reference to Section 2. Instruction to Bidders, sub-section 14 "Joint Venture, Consortium or Association.
12. There will be one deployment or 3 deployments (that 3-application instance)?	There will be one application and three application deployments. See response to Question 8 above.

Pricing for this RFP will not include cost towards Support of 3 year and implementation of any country other than 3 targets mentioned in this RFP.	Bidders will provide two (2) components in the financial proposal as follows: (i) Provision of the Police Management Information System (PIMS); and (ii) Three (3) year support service.
14. Who would be responsible for providing infrastructure for deployment and hosting of application. Who would be responsible for establishing high availability environment.	All infrastructure will be supplied by the host country in collaboration with the UNDP. The bidder will not be responsible for the provision of hardware or any equipment infrastructure at the deployment sites.
15. Is submission only through e-tendering or can it also be done through an e-mail/ If by e-tendering do you require a password for the submitted documents?	Yes. The higher weighting on this criterion will be applied to organizations who possess ISO standard and at least one of other criteria indicated.
17. We understand "PIMS' in each country will act as a central repository and facilitate information sharing with other external system in future. There will not be a separate Central system for data exchange among different entities within each country or for UNDP users to access data across the 3 countries and generate reports, etc.". Please confirm	The bidder will be responsible only for delivery of the PIMS application along with relevant API / web services / data exchange capabilities which will allow the Police to share information with other allied agencies, stakeholders, and countries. The bidder will not be responsible any other system.

	There will be a "separate Central system for data exchange among different entities within each country or for UNDP users to access data across the 3 countries and generate reports, etc.", however this is a separate project.

20. Can you please advise on envisioned number of concurrent users?	It is envisioned that there will be 50 concurrent users anticipated per country.
21. Is the Prison project just mentioned currently un If so what vendor was awarded that contract?	nderway? UNDP expects to publish EOI within the very near term.

24. And of the 4 work packages (police, prisons, DPP & integration), police is the first? what is the timeframe for issuing the other rfp's?	UNDP will publish all solicitation within a 30 day period.
25. Can we assume that there will be no external concurrent projects impacting the execution of this PIMS project, other than implementing the data integration you just discussed? e.g. critical dependencies downstream.	There are four projects which will be underway within roughly overlapping periods. These are software build / deploy projects for Police, Prisons, DPP, and a fourth for Connectivity across all applications.
	During the business requirements phase the PIMS vendor will ascertain the data exchange requirements with regard to the other institutions (DPP, and Prisons) and will liaise with the Connectivity project.
	Once the business requirements have been approved the application will be expected to facilitate the data exchange requirements ascertained.
26. Can you please specify whether there are envisioned site visits for assessments and trainings? And whether this should be included in the price proposal?	Yes.
27. Digitization of Current Offline Data. It is our understanding that the bidder will provide a bulk upload facility as well as a specified electronic template to capture the historical data, however actual data entering/upload will be carried out by UNDP (or any entity identified by UNDP for this work).	 The TOR states that the vendor is responsible for the " Design of formatted bulk upload sheets and / or the definition of the acceptable format for data-sets that will be used to bulk upload historical and currently offline data onto the system. The digitization (as required) and upload of at least one (1) month of currently off-line existing data from at least one of the pilot countries for use as test data." The UNDP may be in a position to assist in gathering this data. However, the bidder should take ownership of this requirement.

Yes. If your solution includes provision for a Disaster recovery site, and such a site is prepared and available in-country, then an instance must be deployed and relevant fail-over / backup procedures put in
place.
These sites are currently being identified and assessed. Further information on the location and current state of the sties will be communicated to the successful bidder. For proposal purposes however, the bidder should assume sites are available. (see also response to Qu 33)
