1) GENERAL BACKGROUND

The United Nations Action for Cooperation against Trafficking in Persons (UN-ACT) is a regional, UNDP-managed project on human trafficking in Southeast Asia, supporting a more coordinated response to trafficking in persons and prioritizing capacity building amongst key stakeholders. UN-ACT is Secretariat to the sub-regional inter-governmental Co-ordinated Mekong Ministerial Initiative against Trafficking in Persons (COMMIT) Process, supporting the six governments of the Mekong Sub-region in collaboration against trafficking in persons.

The National Project Coordinator (NPC) for the UN Action for Cooperation against Trafficking in Persons (UN-ACT) will report to the Regional Project Manager (RPM) at the Regional Management Office (RMO) located in Bangkok. The NPC for Myanmar will support the government and other stakeholders in implementing and coordinating counter-trafficking initiatives within Myanmar, and with other partners in the region.

2) OBJECTIVES OF THE ASSIGNMENT

The Consultant will support:

- Provide technical support to the National COMMIT Taskforce and partners
- Development and implementation of UN-ACT Myanmar workplan for 2019

3) SCOPE OF WORK

The Consultant will work under the direct supervision of the Regional Project Manager (RPM). S/he will also collaboratively work with the Regional Management Office (RMO) in performing his/her duties.

The tasks of the consultant will be to support the following activities planned under UN-ACT Myanmar's workplan:

- Operationalise the COMMIT M&E framework for Myanmar with the Government;
- Support to / participation in National Taskforce meeting and CBTIP meeting;

- Provide technical support to the National COMMIT Task Force for the COMMIT Senior Officials Meeting and Regional Taskforces;
- Facilitate two advocacy workshops on national referral mechanisms;
- Conduct two capacity building workshops with community based watch group members and relevant stakeholders in victim identification and referral mechanisms;
- Coordinate with human trafficking working group members;
- Provide inputs to research relevant to trafficking in Myanmar;
- Support development of the UN-ACT Myanmar and COMMIT workplans for 2019

Duty Station and Expected Place of Travel: Yangon, Myanmar, with some travel to Naypyidaw
