A two-stage procedure is utilized in evaluating the submissions, with evaluation of the technical components being completed prior to any price proposals being opened and compared.

The price proposal will be opened only for submissions that passed the minimum technical score of 70% of the obtainable score of 1000 points in the evaluation of the technical component. The technical component is evaluated on the basis of its responsiveness to the Term of Reference (TOR). Maximum 1000 points will be given to the lowest offer and the other financial proposals will receive the points inversely proportional to their financial offers. i.e. Sf = 1000 x Fm / F, in which Sf is the financial score, Fm is the lowest price and F the price of the submission under consideration.

The weight of technical points is 70% and financial points is 30%.

Submission obtaining the highest weighted points (technical points + financial points) will be selected.

Interview with the candidates may be held if deemed necessary.

1. BACKGROUND

Countries and global companies have been increasingly paying attention to and applied circular economy and means to achieve sustainable development. One of the challenges is now to move towards a more systemic circular economy model which focus on creating economic value and reducing environmental impact through design, highest and best use of materials, and efficient use of resources and energy.

Circular economy is an economy, which aims to have a sustainable system and is achieved through maximizing the usage of resources and reducing of waste. In this system, the production and consumption practices not merely target reusing the resources, but also envisions to attain a complete transformation in terms of reduction and recycling of resources. This system might be adopted by a country in certain sector or subsector(s). The circular economy approach includes sustainable practices at every stage including sources, manufacturing, distribution, use, resource efficiency and recycling.

Viet Nam is among the one of the fastest growing economies in the world. However, this drastic change in the GDP has also increased the challenges related to environmental degradation. It is one of the most vulnerable countries to climate change. Even though the country experiences a high rate of solid municipal waste recycling, there is a large proportion of waste ending up in oceans and

landfills affecting the dependent habitants. There is an urgent need to consider reusing, reducing and recycling throughout the life cycle of any product produced within the country.

The Government of Viet Nam has made strong commitment to solid waste management and combating plastic pollution. The Prime Minister of Viet Nam called for greater international cooperation to respond to and prevent plastic waste from getting into oceans at the G7 Summit in June 2018. The Government adopted the amended National Strategy of Integrated Solid Waste Management up to 2025, vision towards 2050 (491/QD-TTg Decision). The Strategy has made clear the integrated approach of solid waste management by which the 3Rs (reduce, reuse, recycle) should be strengthened while landfilling should be limited. It also indicates that 100% of plastic bags are eco-friendly, while 80% of daily solid waste generated in rural residential areas must be collected and handled by 2020. The Government also has plan to review and assess suitable models for circular economy proposed for the next 10-year Socio-economic Development Strategy (SEDS) 2021-2030 and 5-year Socio-economic Development Plan (SEDP) 2021-2025.

UNDP is recruiting an international consultant (IC) and two national consultants (NCs) to team up for an assignment of circular economy. The team will be working in close partnership with a group of experts from the Institute of Strategic Policy for Natural Resources and Environment (ISPONRE) of MONRE.

2. OBJECTIVE OF THE ASSIGNMENT

To conduct a review of the good practices and models of the circular economy in relevant countries and specific cases in Viet Nam, propose a viable approach for Viet Nam to transition to a circular economy and recommend strategic principles and targets with indicators of specific sector/ subsector(s) for inclusion in the next SEDS/SEDP.

3. SCOPE OF WORK AND RESPONSIBILITIES

The international consultant and two national consultants will work closely and share accountability to generate quality deliverables as defined in the Section 5 - Deliverables. The NCs will work under the guidance/advice of the IC and assist in performing the assigned tasks, whereas, the IC will be a team leader and will be responsible for providing guidance/support to the NCs and get the work accomplished as a team.

The consultants will be responsible for conducting an analysis of existing circular economy concepts and good practices in relevant countries and specific to Viet Nam, evaluating opportunities and challenges related to those practices and recommending robust mechanisms and approach for Viet Nam in terms of circular economy. These tasks shall be undertaken by selecting an economic sector or at least five economic sub-sector(s) or value chains (such as food and beverage, agriculture, forestry, fisheries, cotton or plastic, or others), which will be first to switch to a circular economy. This will include developing a report of relevant models/examples and experiments from other countries and specific cases in Viet Nam and accordingly providing recommendations/suggestions. It will also include working on circular economy models and remap/action plan for Viet Nam through a concept. The recommendations/suggestions must include answers to the following questions but may not be limited to:

- What will be the role of the Vietnamese government? How can the policies by the government incentivize the proposed concept of circular economy?
- How can producers, consumers and the government join forces to make the change?
- How can the beliefs, values, attitude and behaviors shift needed in the consumer audience be achieved? How can the direct purchasing decisions of consumers be influenced?

- What kind of regulatory, economic and business shift is needed to achieve the objectives of circular economy?
- What are the barriers or risks to the proposed approach and how can they be tackled?
- What are the mechanisms through which the country's economy considering the interdependency of diverse sectors/sub-sectors and other economic actors can be remapped?

The team will also be responsible for proposing principles, targets and indicators for specific sector/sub-sectors to be included in the next SEDS/SEDP.

During the assignment, the team shall undertake necessary consultation with experts and authorities supported and/or organized by UNDP and ISPONRE/MONRE to elaborate and finalize all the products. The team shall also conduct regular team meetings (once in every two weeks to four weeks) and participate in technical consultation meetings organized by UNDP and ISPONRE.

3.1. FOR IC

The international consultant will be responsible for leading the assignment and maintaining the quality of the deliverables specified in the TOR. The work of IC will be to lead, monitor and advice the NCs and ensure that the materials are delivered before the due date.

Specific tasks for IC to meet the objectives:

a). Research and analysis of the good practices related to circular economy

- Conduct research on circular economy system and concept, which includes investigating specific sector/sub-sector(s) from across the globe and specific to Viet Nam, evaluating the consumption and production patterns specific to the products (reduce) under selected sector/sub-sector(s) and exploring mechanisms (recycle/reuse) to handle those products when they reach the end-of-life (EOL) stage
- Based on the above-mentioned tasks, prepare a short inception report including details of the sector/sub-sectors, countries, stakeholders involved (private sector, government or others) and workplan for the assignment
- Gather and analyze data and accordingly prepare 2-page briefs for each example/success story of the selected sector/sub-sector(s) (minimum 10 from developed and developing countries but they should be replicable in Viet Nam), which will further be used to make a report
- Undertake field visits in Viet Nam to understand the status of circular economy trends in Viet Nam to get insights into the chosen sector/sub-sector(s)
- Collate the inputs provided by the national consultants for the detailed report specific to Viet Nam and prepare a detailed report analyzing each success stories in terms of opportunities and challenges and the scope of replicating some of those models in Viet Nam

b). Formulating the Concept Note, with principles, approach, and proposed actions for Viet Nam

- Discuss with UNDP and MONRE on the suitable approach towards the circular economy model for Viet Nam and different measures including collaboration among government and private players, etc. that can be taken to initiate the adopted model
- With the support of the national consultants, conceptualize a possible circular remap/action plan for Viet Nam in the form of a concept note

c). Proposing principles, targets and indicators for the selected sector/sub-sector(s) to be considered for SEDP/SEDS

- Guide the review and identify opportunities/entry points of the processes through which conclusion/integration of circular economy principles/targets into national and sectoral development plan.
- Develop a brief of principles, and indicators for possible inclusion/integration into the next SEDS/SEDP, which aligns with the relevant SDG goals and targets.

3.2. FOR NCs

The national consultants will be responsible for assisting in the implementation of the assignment and providing inputs to the international consultant for the deliverables specified in the TOR. She or he will work under the leadership of the international consultant and ensure that the materials are delivered before the due date.

Specific tasks for NC 1:

a). Research and analysis of the good practices related to circular economy

- Conduct research on waste management and circular economy system, which includes investigating specific sector/sub-sector(s) in Viet Nam
- Based on the above-mentioned tasks, assist the international consultant in preparing a short inception report including details of the sector/sub-sectors, countries, stakeholders involved and workplan for the assignment
- Review and provide comments on the brief prepared by the IC on the other countries' examples and success stories of circular economy
- Lead and work closely with NC 2 to undertake research to understand the status of circular economy and success stories specific to at least 5 sub-sectors Viet Nam with an analysis of each one of them in terms of opportunities and challenges to get insights into the chosen sector/sub-sector(s)
