2. Project Description

The Disability Action Council (DAC) is the national advisory and coordination body on disability and rehabilitation and assisting line ministries and other institutions to promote the implementation of the national disability law, UNCRDP and NDSP, proposing revision and amendments or new policies/legal frameworks related to disability, and monitoring/evaluating these legal frameworks. 19 disability action working groups (DAWG) at line ministries were established and 21 DACs at the provincial level have been established to support the same mandate and work at the sub-national level.

The DAC, as a responsible institution for coordinating and developing the next strategic plan of disability, had conducted regular national workshops to review the current NDSP to ensure it is well implemented within the sector as well as across the government line ministries. The NDSP was recognized as a legal roadmap to provide directions to government ministries and institutions, development partners, civil society organisations, disabled people's organizations and private sector to improve the quality of lives of persons with disabilities.

The Royal Government of Cambodia (RGC) in partnership with the United Nations (UN) have been supporting the promotion of the rights of persons with disabilities through the joint Disability Rights Initiative Cambodia (DRIC) programme since 2014 ended in mid-2018 and follow by another UN Joint Programme titled "Access to Justice without Barriers for Persons with Disabilities", which was developed with the focus on one of the major gaps of the DRIC programme: access to justice and accessible mechanisms to protect the rights of persons with disabilities, including in detention. The Programme will ensure that specific actions on access to justice are included in the National Disability Strategic Plan (NDSP2) 2019-2023.

UNDP has been working with DAC for more than five years to support the implementation of the UNCRPD and NDSP 2014-2018. As NDSP 2014-2018 is ended, the NDSP2 is now being developed by the disability working group led by DAC. To ensure that the NDSP2 is well designed including the clear M&E framework, the project seeks to engage an International Consultant who experienced in

designing the strategic plan in particularly within the national framework to assist the disability technical working group to develop and finalize the NDSP2.

3. Scope of Work

The assignment aims to provide technical and secretary assistance to the disability working group in finalizing the current draft of the NDPS2.

The assignment will be expected to:

- Assist the Disability Working Group to finalize the draft NDSP2 and play as secretary role in consolidating inputs and feedbacks and address those feedbacks/comments as concluded by the disability working group.
- Develop a concrete M&E framework of the NDSP2 that can be effectively applied for the monitoring and evaluating during the NDSP implementation stage
- Conduct a desk review on key relevant international and national documents related to disability such as CRPD, SDGs, national disability laws and policies, and other related reports for verification and fit into the current drafted NDSP2
- Update the draft narrative sections of the NDSP2 for the disability working group to review for endorsement and approval.
- Conduct meetings and workshops with key relevant ministries, institutions and development partners as required from the disability working group
