Procurement unit seizes this opportunity to provide clarifications to various questions received from potential bidders.

 Local company for installation and after sales service/support: the tender asks for installation of sirens, training and after sales services and support. Such services should be done by a local company which will be trained and supported by the supplier during the installation and commissioning process.

We therefore are looking for a Haiti based company with experience in electrical installations and/or radio communications.

Do you have any preferred installer, based in Haiti for such installations? Could you recommend some companies? Contact details?

Response: We do not have a preferred installer for this work. We cannot interfere in any stage of completion of work. You have to find the partnership to realize the contract. If you choose to do a consortium, it should be legally constituted. But you can also choose to subcontract one part of the work to a local supplier. In any case, you have to present all documentation for the chosen company or firm to be analyzed in terms of compliance.



2) Control Centre: We understand the sirens shall be controlled (activated) and monitored centrally. Is there already an existing control centre to which the sirens have to be connected? If not, is there any specification for a new a control centre, from where all sirens can be monitored, controlled and activated?

Response: It could be locally using a local control panel connected to the siren by cable. Each siren will have its own control and that operator will control that only siren and no others.
