Background

The current funding baseline for the PA system, and the capacities to administer and improve PA revenue streams, are still well below the levels required to ensure that the PA system can properly serve its function as an important tool to protect biodiversity; thus, the actual GEF/UNDP project seeks to assist the PA administrations, in reducing existing funding gaps, improving the management and conservation efforts, increasing cost-efficiencies and the capacity of the central and local staff.

Some of the sites administered by NAPA /RAPAs have received a lot of attention and support last years, due to rare habitats and diverse ecosystem they host; even though, for some of them, there are management plans developed, the link with actual state budget allocations remains insignificant, with serious constraints in accomplishing established management and conservation objectives; notwithstanding, the management plans are approved, yet this is not a guarantee of adequate funding for implementation of priority actions; in addition, there is limitation in strategic planning, financial management systems and cost-effective approaches to operate the needful conservation actions;

Rationale

The Albanian framework for protection of wildlife, i.e. the species of mammals & birds of which there are populations living permanently or temporarily in a state of natural freedom in the national territory, defines wildlife "the state's unavailable heritage and therefore subject to its protection" [law no. 10006 dt. 23.10.2008 amended [..."Fauna e egër janë të gjitha llojet e nënllojet e vertebrorëve, jovertebrorëve dhe popullatat e tyre, që jetojnë në gjendje të lirë në habitatin e tyre natyror, të vendosura në mënyrë të përkohshme ose të përhershme në një territor të dhënë...], and provides for protection, management and control of wild fauna, in order to enable protection of types, populations and habitats they live in, migration corridors, as well as to fulfil their need for food, shelter and breeding conditions;

Despite the progress that this law has brought about, and the numerous bylaws issued in recent decades, the real logistic and infrastructure pertinent to custody, care and rehabilitation of fauna are still missing This proposal intend=s to provide the technical bases and encourage methodological application necessary to ensure specialist medical services and the correct performance of health protocols.

The UNDP therefore is keen to procure service that support NAPA, and assist in improving habitat conservation and rehabilitation means, as part of wider aim for strengthening the management structure and resource mapping for this administration, namely by establishing wildlife fauna rehabilitation mean in DKNP;

Site selection

All assessment of the most suitable site was made vis a vis suitability of management system & processes, particularly assessment of resources needed to carry out site management and administration; in that respect, funds allocation, staff time and in-house infrastructure to fulfil management & conservation needs are considered vs planning decisions; this has allowed, in joint workshops and discussions with NAPA and RAPA authorities, to identify shortfalls in funds and equipment in relation to planned activities, particularly for habitat rehabilitation and maintenance, namely most sensitive and rare species; Although the management plan rarely provides specific commitments of funds and staff, it was considered important, as the basis for short-term operation planning, to allocate the financial support; in view of these, DKNP was though as the best place to implement this habitat habitation activity

DKNP

The DKNA is proclaimed through a DCM No. 687, Date 19.10.2007, with coverage of 22,230.24 ha, divided in four subzones, such as core subzone, sustainable use subzone, traditional use subzone and the recreation subzone; the area of DKNP is also proclaimed as Ramsar Site by the decision of the Council of Ministers no. 413, dated 22.08.1994"11. The management Committee of DKNP is established and operates based on the Decision of the Council of Ministers no. 86, dated 11.02.2005; the area of DKNP is considered as one of areas with specific natural and biodiversity values and one of the tourism destinations in coastal zone of Albania for beach tourism, ecotourism, recreation, research and studies; The national park area is distinguished for the diverse floristic and fauna populations, endemic, sub endemic, rare, threatened and endangered species 12; Karavasta lagoon is the biggest and the most important one of the Adriatic coast, the most important ecosystem for water birds¹³; it harbours the only coastal breeding site of Dalmatian Pelicans (Pelecanus crispus), a globally threatened species¹⁴; Divjaka is mentioned for breeding the buffalo cow (Bubalus bubalis) which is found only in this area and it is a protected species in Albania; For some of the species the area represents a very important breeding site for more than 30% of their breeding population in Albania. This is the case of the Dalmatian Pelican (100%), Oystercatcher (75%), Collared Pratincoles (53%), Redshank (62%), Common Sandpiper (32%), Yellow-legged Gull (67%), Common Tern (59%) and Little Tern (46%). While, 89 different species representing groups of molluscs, insects, amphibians, reptiles, birds, and mammals present in the park area are considered as threatened in Albania. 42 species belong to highly endangered categories including Critically Endangered, Endangered and Vulnerable.

Establishing the centre in DLKNP with not only serve to rehabilitation of wildlife fauna of this ecosystem, but also it allows for quite appropriately assisting other ecosystems in the country; it will enrol veterinary services, naturalists, marine / biologists, trainees and interns from university locations with which collaboration protocols will be signed. The centre will also be equipped with specific needful instruments and equipment, whereas collaboration, with biodiversity cathedra from the main universities in the country will become integral part of the structure

Objective

The main objection of this support programme is to affirm and consolidate the role of NAPA as the key state body offering a qualified service to the recovery and reintroduction in nature of species / habitats belonging to wild fauna,

providing specialized medical services and first aid, emergency medicine, internal medicine, surgery and medical therapy.

Another activity embodied in this rehabilitation centre will be the health monitoring of wild animals, and important biological indicators. The examination of the health status of injured, sick or in distress animals/birds that are found in the territory, as well as providing important data on the health of wild populations, makes it possible to assess the state of health of the environment in which these animals live and which we share with.

The facility will also play an important educational role. The possibility of closely observing wild animals represents an emotion and an opportunity for unique cognitive growth and above all an important tool for raising awareness of environmental issues and the work of recovering fauna.

Schedule of workplan and description of the facilities required

Relevance of the DKNPA to host the Birds Habitat Rehabilitation Centre

The DKNP is the most important area for bird habitats in Albania with over 250 species observed from around 340 that are present in our country. In addition to the number of specimens, the park is at the same time the area with the highest abundance of wintering, breeding and migratory birds. During the winter in the Park, there are on average about 40,000 winter-water birds with a maximum of 84,000 birds recorded in 2000. During the spring-summer season, the Park serves as a nesting place for 7-12 thousand birds, namely water birds, birds of prey, sparrows etc. Likewise, the Park is an important hub for migrating birds because of its location on the Western Adriatic migration corridor, as well as preserved with natural habitats in a relatively good condition. It is this season that the park turns into the centres of migratory birds with several hundred thousand birds that are temporarily sheltered in the pursuit of the migration journey; In this exceptional biological diversity, occasionally, animals and birds are damaged due to weather conditions or human disturbances; Likewise, due to its reputation, the Park often becomes a shelter for injured birds that are brought to the Park by nature lovers.

Missing facilities

Despite the dedication of the park staff, the tools available to recover the injured or mutilated birds are almost inexistent. In the absence of treatment, the damaged birds die without recovery. Such cases include pelicans, stork, flamingo, herons, vultures, other birds of prey etc. In the above conditions, it is necessary to set up a sufficiently appropriate bird rehabilitation centre that will serve not only for the healing of wounded birds but will also provide appropriate survival conditions.

Intended outputs:

This support program will provide a higher survival rate for birds in the Park and outside it through care that can only be provided in a suitable habitat rehabilitation facility; as such, the following actions will be taken:

- 1. preparation of the site for establishing the facility
- 2. design and construction of a bird rehabilitation centre at the DKNP
- 3. On-the-job training of veterinarians for the survival of wild birds and enhance the staff capacities with at least two veterinarians' expertise
- 4. Ensuring the full or partial recovery of all damaged birds in and outside the park; and
- 5. Increasing awareness of the local population and numerous visitors on the protection of wild birds and wild nature; envisaged more than 2000 visits per year.

The assistance intended for the DKNP includes provision for a rehabilitation centre with needful facilities for maintaining, protecting and rehabilitating rare and endangered habitats; This will cover all necessary tools, logistic, equipment and tools that enable habitat restoration, recuperations, care and conservation; The DKNP will provide all its support in staff and logistic to empower accomplishment of this activities; These results will add on already existing conservation measure undertaken such as Video Monitoring system for observation and monitoring of pelican colony at Pelican Island in DKNP. This would satisfy the need of the park administration vis a vi all other the ornithologist and stakeholder, NAPA needs and other RAPAs requirements;

In this case, the DKNP administration will also evaluate the effectiveness of the new facility at the end of annual management terms (namely estimating the reduced number of recovered birds or habitats); The DKNP will provide all its support in staff and logistic to empower accomplishment and sustained implementation of this conservation measure

All these will support accomplishment of the following stages:

- Admission, treatment and rehabilitation of birds; this will capture the procedure for care, rehabilitation and release for wild and heterothermic animals; Collection of information on the wildlife fauna from the person who found it or brought it to the facility; Report all the information obtained as per NAPA the specific forms; Photographing the animal; Provide the person who brought the bird at the facility, the material or information relating to the activities of the DKNP rehabilitation facility and the methods of recovery of wild animals found in difficulty; Handle the animal in safe conditions and with due precautions (shirts and gloves) as the health status of the specimen is unknown.
- Quarantine; Animals that are accepted at the facility MUST ALWAYS BE PLACED IN QUARANTINE, in isolated structures and separated from all other animals; The purpose of the quarantine is to allow the detection of infections in incubation or overshadowed by the emergency situation linked to hospitalization (trauma, poisoning, etc.); Stabilization of the general conditions of the animal; Clinical examination; First aid; Intensive rehabilitation therapy (housing); Pre-release rehabilitation therapy (aviary); Pre-release

conditioning: hacking technique in the mobile aviary; Release (site selection as optimal for the release, evaluating first of all the suitability of the site where the animal was found); Provide appropriate transport in safe conditions for the animal and persons; Choose a season or period of the year appropriate for the species to be released that takes into account the migratory period (if any) or the breeding season; In any case, the animal should be released when the environmental conditions are more favourable for its survival; Choose the most appropriate time of day; If necessary, provide additional food sources in the release area; Monitor the animal for a reasonable period of time after release;

collection and management of information related to hospitalized individuals; The entry of each animal into the structure will be recorded and maintained on the DKNP Register. This will also include the respective medical record for each hosted animal, in order to maintain a timely documentation of the activities performed; The key information to collect will be: Species, Date of entry into the structure, Where and when the animal was found, Name, address and telephone number of the person who found it, Injuries or traumas evident upon acceptance into the facility, Weight upon entry into the facility, Entry number assigned, Presence of markings, microchips or identification rings, Results of the first reception visit, Practiced therapy (medical and / or surgical) with the dates of the treatments, Final destination including date of exit from the facility as well as other information related to the results of collateral tests carried out, weight at the time of leaving the facility.

For this purpose, we estimate that contracting procurement of such goods / services would be the appropriate way forward.
