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TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR E-YOUTH HUB PLATFORM DEVELOPMENT CONSULTANCY

A. PROJECT TITLE

Youth Employment Programme Initiation Plan

B. PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

The One UN Youth Employment Project which began in 2015 saw many successes over the last four years, however unemployment for youth in Samoa remains high and continues to be a critical challenge to the nation. The Youth Employment Programme Phase II Initiation Plan is a twelve months transition plan to design the second phase. This includes integrating the lessons learnt from the terminal evaluation and consultations with stakeholders, partners and participating UN Agencies. UNDP Samoa is implementing the Initiation plan to continue the momentum of the project while developing a full phase II to be launched with all partners on board in July 2020.

Youth employment has been a priority for the Government of Samoa as stipulated in Samoa National Employment Policy and National Action Plan (2016-2020). This has also been the priority for the UN and UNDP as mentioned in the UN Pacific Strategy and UNDP sub regional programme document (2018-2022 output 3.2) as well the UNDP strategic plan. Despite Samoa's economic and social progress over the years (Upper MIC with 0.713 HDI and categorized as high human development), employment and more particularly youth unemployment and underemployment remain critical development challenges for Samoa. The rural to urban migration of young people for better education and employment opportunities is putting an enormous strain on the Government to generate adequate jobs for new entrants into the labour force and is leading to higher levels of youth unemployment in urban areas. Furthermore, it is likely that the reverse drift of young people who failed to secure jobs in urban areas get pushed back to rural areas where they are engaged in subsistence agriculture. The unemployment rate for youth in Samoa is 16.4 per cent. This is almost double the national unemployment rate of 8.7 per cent. Young women in particular continue to face challenges in securing employment relative to young men.

As part of the transition window, UNDP Samoa is proposing to redesign the eYouth Hub. This TOR is to conduct activity 1.1 'Employment application (E-Youth Hub) is further developed and made accessible by mobile device, with facebook login capabilities' under outcome 1 of the initiation plan. Using the initiation plan to redevelop the online platform allows for Phase II to begin with a fully functioning app that can be used as an integral mechanism for employment in Samoa.

C. SCOPE OF WORKS:



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The consultant will be a developer who will upgrade the current e-Youth Hub website and develop app(s) for Android and iOS. The scope of work is development and technology based on outputs centred around functioning online platforms.

The consultant will work closely with UNDP Samoa MCO as well as partners at the Chamber of Commerce, the Ministry of Women, Community and Social Development and Samoa National Youth Council to ensure the upgraded platform meets the needs of unemployed youth while also providing a relevant and helpful service to the private sector looking to advertise jobs.

During the course of implementation of this consultancy work, any change requested by EAX ICT and Market Data department in respect to the scope of work outlined above, will be executed by the Consultant without any further cost.

Activities

Under the direct supervision of the Governance and Poverty Reduction Unit at UNDP and the consultant will:

- 1. Upgrade the existing e-Youth Hub platform to include:
 - Business facing user login;
 - Job advertisement section;
 - CV like capabilities, and
 - Ensure website security in line with current security standards and best practices
- 2. Conduct software requirement gathering and document the system development specifications document as the inception project report. The system development specifications document is recommended to outline the statement of work to be done, project plan containing milestones and deliverables, required resources and software testing procedures;
- 3. Develop and deploy Mobile application(s) using Android and iOS platforms with facebook login access;
- 4. Ensure all inputs should link to a database, on which all data will be aggregated. Data should be easy to download and upload;
- 5. Develop user manual document and system documentations (inception, mid-term and final); and
- 6. Deliver trainings (technical system administrator and end user) as needed.

D. EXPECTED OUTCOMES AND DELIVERABLES:

The selected consultant will work with UNDP to complete and submit the following deliverables within the timelines specified:



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- 1. Upgraded e-Youth hub platform for unemployed youth including job listing and CV listing pages;
- 2. Mobile app(s) for Android and iOS with Facebook accessible login and business facing access for website and app(s);
- 3. Finished mobile application(s) and ensure all inputs should link to a database, on which all data will be aggregated. Data should be easy to download and upload;
- 4. User manual document and system implementation reports that will include the maintenance plan (inclusive of all source code and database files);
- 5. Provide technical system administrator and end user training as needed.

- Having received the highest score out of a pre-determined set of weighted technical and financial criteria specific to the solicitation.

* Technical Criteria weight 70%

* Financial Criteria weight 30%

Only candidates obtaining a minimum of 70% of the total technical points (49 points) will be considered for the Financial Evaluation. *Interviews may be conducted as part of technical assessment for shortlisted proposals.*

Technical Proposal: 70 marks

- Technical Approach & Methodology (30 marks)
 - i. This explains the understanding of the objectives of the assignment, approach to the services, methodology for carrying out the activities and obtaining the expected output, and the degree of detail of such output. The Applicant should also explain the methodologies proposed to adopt, highlight the compatibility of those methodologies with the proposed approach and provide an indicative work plan and total budget.

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Financial Proposal: 30 marks
