A two-stage procedure is utilized in evaluating the submissions, with evaluation of the technical components being completed prior to any price proposals being opened and compared.

The price proposal will be opened only for submissions that passed the minimum technical score of 70% of the obtainable score of 1000 points in the evaluation of the technical component. The technical component is evaluated on the basis of its responsiveness to the Term of Reference (TOR). Maximum 1000 points will be given to the lowest offer and the other financial proposals will receive the points inversely proportional to their financial offers. i.e. Sf = 1000 x Fm / F, in which Sf is the financial score, Fm is the lowest price and F the price of the submission under consideration.

The weight of technical points is 70% and financial points is 30%.

<u>Submission obtaining the highest weighted points (technical points + financial points) will be selected subject to positive reference checks on the consultant's past performance.</u>

Interview with the candidates may be held if deemed necessary.

**Title:** Production of a chapter on the Tourism Impacts of a 2°C global warming for Viet Nam

Project: Special Report on Climate Impacts of Global Warming in Viet Nam

#### 1. BACKGROUND

At the Conference of Parties of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC), countries have adopted the Paris Agreement and have agreed to develop an action plan to keep global warming well below 2 degrees above pre-industrial levels, while pursuing efforts to limit it to 1.5°C. In the aftermath of the COP 21, the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) prepared a Special Report (SR 1.5) on the impacts of global warming of 1.5°C above pre-industrial level, in the context of strengthening the global response to the threat of climate change, sustainable development, and efforts to eradicate poverty<sup>1</sup>.

The SR 1.5 report was launched in October 2018 in Korea and assessed projected impacts at global average warming of 1.5°C and higher levels of warming. It highlighted that human-induced warming reached approximately 1°C above pre-industrial levels in 2017; while warming greater than the global average has already been experienced in many regions. In particular, climate-related risks to health, livelihoods, food security, water supply, human security, and economic growth are projected to increase with global warming of 1.5°C and increase further with 2°C (IPCC, 2018).

Viet Nam is among the countries most vulnerable to the impacts of climate change. With its long coastline, the country is heavily affected by extreme weather events whose frequency and intensity are on the rise. Temperature and rainfall variability put further pressure on the population, especially on the rural population whose livelihoods depend on small scale agriculture. Moreover, Viet Nam will need to cope with long term risks such as sea-level rise, saline intrusion and ocean acidification.

The Government of Viet Nam has been active in mainstreaming climate change into national policies, with the promulgation of the National Strategy on Climate Change in 2011, followed by the National Action plan on Climate Change 2012-2020, in 2012. The country also ratified the Paris Agreement in 2015 and is currently finalising its revised Nationally Determined Contribution (NDC), while advancing the formulation of its National Adaptation Plan (NAP).

In line with the findings from the IPCC, the Ministry of Environment and Natural Resources (MONRE), in partnership with UNDP, is preparing a *Special Report on Climate Impacts of Global Warming in Viet Nam*. This report will provide a comprehensive outlook on the impacts of climate change in Viet Nam if global warming is to be contained below 2°C degrees above pre-industrial levels. Building on the IPCC Special Report 1.5°C, this report will synthesise the implications for Viet Nam across a range of sectors. Similar to the SR 1.5, the Vietnamese report will be informed by scientific evidence on climate projections and associated impacts, vulnerabilities to climate change, together with knowledge extracted from the perceptions of risk, as well as governance systems. The report will be highly relevant for policymakers in setting a long-term vision and defining objectives and targets for the upcoming climate change laws and policies. The findings of this report will also guide future sectoral adaptation planning, as such, it will include sectoral chapters in the following sectors: Health, Transport, Tourism and Agriculture.

The tourism sector has enjoyed a high growth rate over the past decade in Viet Nam and is projected to continue being a significant source of revenue and livelihoods for the local population. The Strategy on Vietnam's Tourism Development until 2020, Vision to 2030 (adopted in 2011), followed by the Decision 1861/QD-TTg (in 2017), both position the tourism industry as an engine for growth. By 2025, the Government of Viet Nam (GoV) aims to generate US\$45 billion (\$26.75 billion in 2017) in revenue from this industry, which would represent 10 percent of the GDP, and account for over six million direct and indirect jobs (Viet Nam Briefing, 2019).

However, tourism is a highly sensitive sector and extreme weather events combined with long term risks undermine his potential in Viet Nam. Climate change affects a range of environmental resources that are pivotal for tourism, such as biodiversity, wildlife, and coral reefs. Extreme weather events pose serious risks to vital transport infrastructures while requiring extensive and costly emergency preparedness measures. Finally, climate change leads to adverse impacts that may deter tourists such as infectious diseases, waterborne pests, and heat waves. In particular, island and coastal tourism are extremely vulnerable to sea level rise, flooding and storms. Accounting for climate risks is not common practice in the tourism sector, yet risk-informed adaptation strategies have the potential to foster sustainable growth.

In this context, UNDP is looking for a Climate Adaptation expert to contribute to the production of this special report, with an analytical chapter looking at the effects of global warming on the tourism sector in Viet Nam. This *Special Report on Climate Impacts of Global Warming in Viet Nam* aims to build the scientific knowledge base that will support investments in tourism adaptation to climate change and ultimately improve planning mechanisms to integrate climate considerations into the tourism sector development.

This ToR specifies objectives, the scope of work and the tasks required to carry out the assignment.

#### 2. OBJECTIVE

The objective of this assignment is to produce a technical chapter presenting the magnitude of the effects of a 2°C global warming in Viet Nam for the tourism sector, including key findings and recommendations; aiming to feed these recommendations into the overall report.

#### 3. SCOPE OF WORK

The multi-disciplinary nature of this assignment will require tight coordination with several consultants and organisations simultaneously undertaking tasks and completing deliverables. The consultant will be expected to work with: the technical consultants from IMHEN, the team leader and the senior reviewer, and other sectoral consultants (e.g. Tourism, Transport). Annex 1 presents the indicative outline of the report, which includes four major analytical components.

The consultant will collect and compile available information on the impacts of climate change on the tourism sector in Viet Nam. S/he will utilise information from:

- Qualitative and quantitative surveys,
- Downscaling scenarios produced by the technical teams,
- Field visits, interviews including with business,
- Provincial development plans,
- Consultations with relevant experts and stakeholders,
- Reports from UNDP and other development partners.

Impacts of global warming on the tourism sector in Viet Nam shall be adequately described (nature, scale and implications of identified impacts), both positive and negative impacts, most affected provinces/ districts. The analysis shall be complemented with projections and, monetised or expressed in economic terms.

To deliver the objective of the assignment, the consultant will undertake the following tasks (but not limited too):

- 1. Review and synthesize existing literature on the nexus tourism-climate change in Viet Nam and in other climate-vulnerable countries (if relevant).
- 2. Access downscaling scenario of predicted climate change from different sources, including IMHEN (MONRE) and the Viet Nam's Climate Risk Index (hosted by UNDP).
- 3. Based on these projections, model the impacts of climate change on (i) tourism, and (ii) infrastructures vital to tourism.
- 4. Based on the strategies and plans of the Ministry of Culture, Sport and Tourism (MOCST), estimate the growth in emissions directly associated with the tourism sector and potential mitigation options.
- 5. Review and synthesise current and relevant adaptive strategies of the tourism sector in Viet Nam and in other countries. An analysis of the adaptation strategies carried out by the Small Island States may be conducted, if relevant.
- 6. Identify potential barriers (technological, financial, capacity), and provide opportunities and recommendations for developing climate-resilient tourism responses.
- 7. Produce a final technical chapter of approximately 10-15 pages directed to the team leader which will be integrated into the final report.
- 8. Create a PowerPoint Presentation with key findings and present the conclusions in different regional workshops and high-level events.

#### 4. OUTPUTS / DELIVERABLES

# Output 1: Inception report of technical chapter

The consultant will prepare an inception report that will include the proposed contents of each section. It will also include the proposed approach to collect information, outlining an indicative methodology (which potentially could be scaled up) for primary data collection, if necessary.

#### Output 2. Draft Technical Chapter

The consultant will prepare the draft technical chapter, including all the elements mentioned in the scope of work.

### Output 3. Final Technical Chapter and PowerPoint presentation

The final draft policy paper will be reviewed and commented by a UNDP Climate Change advisor and

an Economic advisor. The Consultant will incorporate suggestions and address comments from UNDP to finalise the technical chapter. The consultant will also prepare a PowerPoint presentation with key findings for use by UNDP and at high-level events.
