1	Q	Do you need groin protection to vest? (as said no neck-shoulder protection needed)
	Α	No. No groin and neck protection required.
2	Q	You mention that the hard armour upgrade panels are to be constructed of material similar to monolithic polyethylene. Our level IV plates are constructed using Alumina Ceramic with a pressed aramid backing system, would this be ok for you?
	A	Bidders must provide test reports (certification) from an accredited ballistic laboratory on the ballistic integrity of the plates. The maximum weight of each of the main ballistic panels (front or rear) is 2.5kg and maximum weight for each of the side ballistic panels is 0.7 kg. If bidders can provide panels that satisfy the certification required and which weight does not go beyond the maximum limit, then UNDP will evaluate their submission during the technical evaluation. Bidders also need to provide precise description of the hard armour upgrade panels that are being proposed. In particular, the materials and the weight of the ballistic panels must be indicated in their submission.
3	Q	The Unit Price stated in the Price Schedule Form (Section 7 of the Invitation to Bid document) for the Hard Armour Upgrade Panels level III and IV refer to "set" correct?
	A	Yes. The Hard Armour Upgrade Panels must be supplied in sets consisting of one front, one rear and two side panels. Front panel to be multi-curve panel, rear and side panels to be single-curve. Please use the REVISED Price Schedule Form when submitting the bid price.
