Annex 1: Terms of Reference

Film Documentaries for CEDAW Advocacy

Background

The Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women (CEDAW), often referred to as the international women's bill of rights, provides a powerful framework and legal obligation for countries to move towards achieving gender equality and the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs). To date, CEDAW has been ratified by 186 countries. Despite widespread ratification of the Convention, however, full implementation of its provisions has lagged. Concluding Observations by the CEDAW Committee, the 15-year Review of the Beijing Platform for Action in 2010 (Beijing+15), and the reviews of the achievements of the MDGs all stress that State Parties need to improve the implementation of CEDAW in order to make gender equality reality.

The Regional Programme "Facilitating CEDAW Implementation towards the Realization of Women' Human Rights in Southeast Asia (CEDAW SEAP)" has been implemented by the United Nations Development Fund for Women (UNIFEM) – now UN Women – since mid-2004. Supported by the Foreign Affairs, Trade and Development Canada (DFATD), the programme covers eight countries including Cambodia, Indonesia, the Lao People's Democratic Republic (Lao PDR), Myanmar, the Philippines, Thailand, Timor-Leste and Viet Nam. The first phase of the programme focused on raising awareness of CEDAW Convention among stakeholders, catalyzing actions for the legislative change, and capacity development for more effective implementation and monitoring of CEDAW commitments.

The CEDAW SEAP's second phase, now renamed "Improving Women's Human Rights in Southeast Asia" builds on the results of the first phase. It will focus on knowledge generation and exchange, stock taking and priority setting for advancing the implementation of CEDAW in the region. The Goal /Ultimate Outcome of the Programme is to reduce discrimination against women in Southeast Asia. Given an intermediate outcome, the programme aims to achieved "Enhanced Southeast Asia regional processes that facilitate CEDAW implementation" by 2016 through following aspects;

- Increased skills and knowledge of government officials and civil society gender experts on CEDAW compliance in development and monitoring new and revised legislative frameworks.
- Increased awareness among formal and informal justice system actors of CEDAW commitments.
- Strengthened monitoring and accountability mechanisms for implementation of CEDAW commitments

Objectives and purposes

In order to maximize awareness raising among formal and informal justice system actors including effectiveness of knowledge exchange through various media tools, UN Women will hire a company to produce media outreach tools that consist of 2 video documentaries on UN Women's events in November and on the issue of CEDAW.

Scope of work

The company will work together with UN Women Regional Office for Asia and the Pacific to produce a documentary film with 10 -15 minute length and short film with 3 minute length on promoting women's access to justice and gender-equality based legislation. The stories will be featuring short interview/key message of CEDAW's stakeholders towards changes of perception, social values and norms that enhance accessibility of women to justice systems and way forward to gender equality-based legislation.

Following are the tasks

- To meet and discuss with UN Women Regional Office for Asia and the Pacific on parameters of the project.
- To develop scripts for the two videos and revise by incorporating comments from UN Women and produce story boards
- To shoot the events, edit and do needed post production tasks.
- To produce video film documentaries, and develop a broadcasting plan
- To design layout of electronic newsletter and propose platform for distribution
- To revise e-newsletter design upon received comments from UN Women

The company will be requested to attend the regional events in October – November 2014 to interview key stakeholders of UN Women for documentary footages.

Qualifications

- Any legally registered organization, Business Company, non-governmental organization and academic institution with requisite experience and background.
- Minimum 10 years experience in communications, information technology, social media and other relevant areas.
- Experience in consultancy work with multi-national organizations, inter-government organizations, business companies, and the United Nations Agencies is an advantage
- Evidences on past achievement and work portfolio.

Roles and responsibilities of the parties

UN Women will cover cost of professional fee that already included personnel, communications, IT equipment, stationeries, materials and travel costs to meetings. Once the quotation and programme proposal is accepted by UN Women, an Institutional Contract will be offered to the selected service provider.

The selected service provider will work under supervision of the Regional Programme Manager – CEDAW SEAP.

Timeframe

The contract will start on 12 October 2014 to 15 January 2015.
