I. BACKGROUND

The Arafura and Timor Seas are extremely rich in living and non-living marine resources. Through implementation of the Arafura and Timor Seas Ecosystem Action (ATSEA) Program (2010-2014), there have been several environmental barriers identified in applying sustainable management approach to these resources. These issues can be tackled through a coordinated implementation of the Strategic Action Program (SAP) that was developed by ATSEA to remove the key barriers to sustainable ecosystem-based management of the Arafura and Timor Seas (ATS). The SAP was endorsed and adopted by the governments of Indonesia, Timor Leste and Australia at the ministerial level on May 15, 2014 that was reflected in the signed Ministerial Declaration of the Arafura and Timor Seas.

The 10-year vision for the ATS and the long-term objective of the SAP is 'to promote sustainable development of the Arafura-Timor Seas region to improve the quality of life of its inhabitants through conservation and sustainable management of marine-coastal ecosystems'. This corresponds to the desired status of the ATS ecosystem, which will be pursued through achievement of five medium-term environmental quality objectives:

- Recovering and sustaining fisheries
- Restoring degraded habitats for sustainable provision of ecosystem services
- Reducing land-based and marine sources of pollution
- Protecting key marine species
- Adaptation to the impacts of climate change

In October 2014, GEF approved the SAP implementation project¹ concept for the Arafura and Timor Seas entitled: "Implementation of the Arafura and Timor Seas Regional and National Strategic Action Programs". The main objective of this project mirrors that of the SAP and is to enhance sustainable development of the Arafura-Timor Seas (ATS) region to protect biodiversity and improve the quality of life of its inhabitants through conservation and sustainable management of marine-coastal ecosystems. A project preparation grant (PPG) was also approved and this phase is now underway to develop a full set of project documentation for the new UNDP/GEF Full Sized Project that are necessary for final approval by UNDP and GEF.

During the PPG period, a number of studies and stakeholder consultations will be undertaken with the view to further develop the approved project concept into a fully formulated project document through appropriate situation analysis with extensive and broad stakeholder consultations. A main objective of the PPG is to establish clear, accurate baseline information, clarify GEF incremental reasoning, and design and plan activities that will deliver on the outputs, outcomes and objectives of the project.

There are four main components that will be covered in this preparation phase, including:

Component A: Technical review, field surveys and preliminary studies

Component B: Institutional arrangements, monitoring and evaluation

Component C: Financial planning and co-financing investments:

The Consultant will:

- b) review and analyse baseline information delivered by the local experts;
- c) develop the full logical framework of the project based on the project framework, with SMART indicators, baseline and targets;
- d) develop the threats and root causes matrix, and the description of the barriers to the sustainable ecosystem-based management of the Arafura and Timor Seas (ATS);
- e) assess global environmental benefits sought from the Project;
- f) Lead the PPG team in the developing the UNDP project document, the GEF CEO endorsement document, GEF Tracking Tools, and all required annexes;

g)Liaise with UNDP Country Offices in Indonesia and Timor Leste and Asia-Pacific Regional Center in Bangkok, Government of Indonesia, Timor-Leste and Australia, and other partners.
