I. BACKGROUND

Indonesia is one of the world's largest producers of palm oil, and has received much attention in recent years particularly from the global community concerned about the sustainability of palm oil production. In response, the Government of Indonesia is taking steps towards building a greener economy that promotes growth, equity, improved livelihood and environmental integrity. In order to promote sustainable palm oil production and operation in Indonesia, the Ministry of Agriculture, UNDP and several multinational companies have launched the Sustainable Palm Oil Initiative (SPOI). The SPO initiative aims to improve the capacity of palm oil smallholders and conserve natural resources together with the Government of Indonesia's Sustainable Palm Oil (ISPO) system, a mandatory national sustainable palm oil certification scheme managed by the Ministry of Agriculture, and through working with the Ministry of Forestry and relevant Government of Indonesia institutions.

The SPO Initiative with the Ministry of Agriculture is organized around five components: (1) Strengthen smallholders focusing on productivity and environmental management, 2) Strengthen ISPO to protect forests, enhance biodiversity conservation and mitigate and monitor GHG emissions, (3) Facilitate social responsibility, empowering related communities and mediation systems, (4) Reinforce ISPO framework and clarify ISPO standards for wider acceptance, and (5) Establish SPO national and provincial multi-stakeholder platforms to facilitate sustainable palm oil in Indonesia.

In order to support component (2), the project will address major environmental concerns by strengthening the ISPO framework through policy interventions and pilot projects. Since ISPO is based on existing Indonesian legislation including those implemented by ministries, other than MoA, the project has established a multi-stakeholder platform to facilitate discussions with relevant line ministries such as the Ministry of Environment and Forestry and the National Land Agency. Pilot projects in the three pilot provinces of Riau, South Sumatra and West Kalimantan will be carried out in parallel with the policy interventions.

In order to achieve the goals and targets of component (2), an Environment specialist is being sought to develop key components of the project and support the development of the platform environment working group and a new project with the ministry of environment and forestry regarding forest planning. This position is located primarily in the SPO project office under the overall guidance of the UNDP programme manager and NPD.

II. SCOPE OF WORK, RESPONSIBILITIES AND DESCRIPTION OF THE PROPOSED ANALYTICAL WORK

The objective of this assignment is to (1) support the development of the initial action plan and policy brief of the platform environment working group, and (2) strengthen collaboration and cooperation regarding the UNDP - GEF project ('Strengthening forest area planning in Kalimantan') with the ministry of environment and forestry, and (3) ensuring alignment between SPOI and the GEF global project 'taking deforestation out of commodity supply chains'.

This assignment requires collaboration with national government bodies especially the Ministry of Agriculture (MoA) and the Ministry of Environment and Forestry (KLHK), and also members of the palm oil platform environment working group members which consists of government bodies, companies, and CSOs.

Under the supervision of the Program Manager and on the collaboration with the Ministry of Agriculture, the incumbent shall:

• facilitate and ensure the environmental working group (E-WG) activities under the platform are in line with the planning and the objectives, obtain relevant input from all E-WG members, produce recommendations on oil palm plantation sustainability and

- environment-related issues.
- analyze related environment studies and recommendations on sustainability of oil palm plantations for both companies and smallholders and ensure best practices and key issues are reflected into the above planning process
- Support the development of the platform environment working group, study including a monitoring framework for later activities carried out in accordance with plans and objectives of the working group
- provide recommendations and guidance to decision-making based on focus group discussions on global issues related to sustainability of palm oil and local issues based on the Indonesia circumstances
- On the collaboration with KLHK, the incumbent shall:
- facilitate the development of the forest area planning project within the ministry of environment and forestry, including an assessment of the optimal institutional arrangement considering the ministry has recently been restructured
- Initiate discussions on HCV/HCS, Land swaps, spatial planning and design of incentives for stakeholders to reduce deforestation from agricultural land expansion
- Together with KLHK and SPOI team, develop a draft project document for the project
- On the GEF global project 'taking deforestation out of commodity supply chains', the incumbent shall:
- facilitate the development of the Indonesian component of the GEF project, in full coordination with the Ministry of Agriculture and Ministry of Environment and Forestry.
