#### 1. BACKGROUND

Under UNDP Myanmar's Pillar 1 Local Governance Programme, Output 2 focuses on Civil Society and Media support. The effective participation of Civil Society Organizations (as representatives of the people) and the Media (as one of the organizations concerned with transparent, credible and accurate reporting of local news) is an integral element of sustainable human development and local governance. UNDP's overall programme strategy for Myanmar (2013 – 2015) is aligned with the priorities of the Myanmar government and aims to support an enabling environment for development to reach out to all, democracy to flourish and citizens to realize their basic human rights.

As highlighted by UNDP's Local Governance Mapping and other studies, women's engagement with and participation in local governance remains extremely low in Myanmar, and particularly in rural areas. This holds back achievement of Myanmar's broader development goals. Output 2 places special emphasis on empowering rural women's leadership in communities and their engagement in local development and monitoring of public service delivery, working with the federated Self-Reliant Groups (SRGs), represented at township level by Township Leading Groups

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(TLGs), and increasingly supporting women's leadership development through CSO and Media networks.

# **5. FINANCIAL PROPOSAL**

## **Fees**

The financial proposal shall specify the consultancy fees and all costs in relation to the scope of work.

## **Travels**

All envisaged travel costs must be included in the financial proposal. This includes all travel to join duty station/repatriation travel. In general, UNDP will not accept travel costs exceeding those of an economy class ticket.

In the case of unforeseeable travel, payment of travel costs including tickets, lodging and terminal expenses will be agreed upon, between the respective business unit and Individual Consultant, prior to travel and will be reimbursed.

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#### 6. EVALUATION

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Criteria for Technical Evaluation and Obtainable Score (Total 70 points)

- a) Educational Qualifications- 10 points
- b) International Development Work Experience (Myanmar) -15 points
- c) Experience in founding/leading social initiatives (to inspire, motivate women)-10 points
- d) Demonstrated familiarity with women's issues, women's organizations/networks, and women's empowerment approaches (Myanmar or similar)- 10 points
- e) Demonstrated creative talent/experience working with inspiring, creative figures, (Myanmar or similar) -10%
- f) Innovation and creativity demonstrated in technical- 25%
- g) Soundness of Technical Proposal Methodology and approach- 20%

Individual Consultants will be evaluated based on the following methodology.

#### Cumulative analysis

The award of the contract shall be made to the individual consultant whose offer has been evaluated and determined as:

- a) Responsive/compliant/acceptable, and
- b) Having received the highest score
- \* Technical Criteria weight;70%
- \* Financial Criteria weight; 30%

Only candidates obtaining a minimum of 70 points in the technical evaluation will be considered for the Financial Evaluation
