# **Consultancy Title: Audio-Visual Production (International)**

**Project Name:** Enhancing resilience of communities in Solomon Islands to the adverse effects of climate change in agriculture and food security-Strogem Waka Lo Communiti for Kaikai (SWoCK)

# **Objectives:**

- 1. To develop script for five video documentaries
- 2. To shoot video footage for five video documentaries on PMU agreed thematic areas
- 3. To produce one video documentary for 15-20 minutes long on PMU agreed thematic areas
- 4. To produce four short video documentaries (7-10 minutes long) on PMU agreed thematic areas

# **Background**

As a Least Developed Country, Solomon Islands is one of the most vulnerable countries to the predicted impacts of climate change. The Solomon Islands National Adaptation Program of Action (NAPA) to address the effects of climate change (2009) identified agriculture and food security as one of the most vulnerable sectors requiring urgent attention. The project entitled "Enhancing Resilience of Communities in Solomon Islands to the Adverse Effects of Climate Change in Agriculture and Food Security" (or locally "Strogem Waka lo Community fo Kaikai (SWoCK)") addresses the NAPA priority and will contribute to enhancing resilience of the agriculture sector to maintain and improve food security in the country. The objective of the project is to strengthen the ability of communities in Solomon Islands to make informed decisions and manage likely climate change driven pressures on food production and management systems. In particular, the project will lead to the following key results (outcomes);

- 1) Promote and pilot community-adaptation activities enhancing food security and livelihood resilience in pilot communities in at least 3 selected regions;
- 2) Strengthen institutions and adjusted national and sub-national policies related to governing agriculture in the context of a range of climate change futures; and
- 3) Foster the generation and spread of relevant knowledge for assisting decision-making at the community and policy-formulation level.

# **Scope of work/Expected Output:**

The purpose of this consultancy is to produce five high quality video documentaries on agreed themes based on the work of AF-SWoCK Project in selected project sites. Specifically the consultancy must involve:

- Development of clear concepts for five video documentaries based on PMU agreed themes;
- Development of script and storyboard for five video documentaries
- Conducting interviews with relevant individuals, organizations or community representatives
- Field visit to selected project sites ()
- Conduct and manage video shooting
- Submitted draft video documentaries to Practical Action for review and feedback.
- Provide debrief to SWoCK Project on draft videos for review
- Produce 5 high quality video documentaries in both DVD and AVI format

Hence the consultant is expected to contribute to the following results:

#### **Key Deliverables**

- 1. A detailed work-plan for completion of the consultancy
- 2. A detailed concept plan for 5 video documentaries based on agreed themes
- 3. Final script for 5 video documentaries (1x 15-20 minutes long, 4 x 7-10 minutes long)
- 4. Provide a report on field visit and presented copies of draft video footage and interviews to SWoCK Project
- 5. Conduct a debrief meeting with SWoCK Project Team after Practical Action feedback
- 6. Produce a high quality video documentary for 15-20 minutes on agreed theme in DVD and AVI format
- 7. Produce four high quality short video documentaries for 7-10 minutes on agreed themes in DVD and AVI format

## Travel;

All envisaged travel costs must be included in the financial proposal. This includes all travel to join duty station/repatriation travel. In the case of unforeseeable travel, payment of travel costs including tickets, lodging and terminal expenses should be agreed upon, between the respective business unit and Individual Consultant, prior to travel and will be reimbursed.

## **Evaluation Method**

#### **Evaluation**

The proposals will be evaluated using the cumulative analysis method with a split 70% technical and 30% financial scoring. The proposal with the highest cumulative scoring will be awarded the contract. Applications will be evaluated technically and points are attributed based on how well the proposal meets the requirements of the Terms of Reference using the guidelines detailed in the table below: When using this weighted scoring method, the award of the contract should be made to the individual consultant whose offer has been evaluated and determined as:

- a) Responsive/compliant/acceptable, and
- b) Having received the highest score out of a pre-determined set of weighted technical and financial criteria specific to the solicitation.
- \* Technical Criteria weighting; 70%
- \* Financial Criteria weighting; 30%

Only candidates obtaining a minimum of 70% out of 100% in technical evaluation would be considered for the Financial Evaluation
