At the time of award of Contract or Purchase Order, UNDP reserves the right to vary (increase or

Schedule of Requirements and Technical Specifications

1. BACKGROUND

The Moldova Disaster and Climate Risk Reduction Project, Phase II, is a 3 year project (October 2013 – September 2016), funded and implemented by UNDP. During the first phase of the project a gradual shift of focus from traditional disaster response towards a more comprehensive approach to Disaster and Climate Risk Management oriented at prevention and preparedness could be observed. Building on this, the second phase will put emphasis on developing disaster risk management capacities, raising awareness of the general population and policy- and decision makers and increasing the level of knowledge of practitioners.

The main implementing partners are the Civil Protection and Emergency Situations Service of the Ministry of Interior and its affiliated training centers, Ministry of Environment, Ministry of Health, Crisis Medicine Training Center, Ministry of Education, LPAs, NGOs and CBOs.

The Government of Moldova has fully embraced the need to promote an agenda that would enable the country to become more resilient in the face of future disaster-related shocks. To achieve these, support will be provided Civil Protection and Emergency Situations Service of the Ministry of Interior for piloting the people centered early warning solutions on community level. Two villages Copanca and Taraclia were preselected by the national authorities being vulnerable for natural and man-made (fires) disasters for piloting the Early Warning Solutions on the local level.

Although a high priority for the Moldovan Civil Protection and Emergency Situations Service, currently no intervention was done on community level to establish early warning people centered solution for community level. The Early Warning Solutions will be used by decision makers, local authorities to perform preparedness and response actions in case of natural and man made disasters.

2. SCOPE OF WORK

UNDP Moldova is seeking for a qualified company to deliver turn-key, integrated early warning system for 2 villages of the Republic of Moldova: Copanca village, and Taraclia village, Causeni district. The Contractor shall furnish all necessary labour, design, engineering, materials, equipment, supplies, transportation, machinery, tools and travel necessary to perform this contract and execute all the works. (Overview of localities and places for installing electronic transmitters (sirens) are presented in Annex 2). Minimum technical requirements for the early warning solutions are presented in Annex A.

The following tasks are envisages for the Company:

- a. Provide, deliver and install the early warning systems for two villages (Copanca and Taraclia) with the Local Command Unit and Control Center on the district level. The system should include the electronic signal transmitters (sirens) installed locally in each village and the Control Center (presenting the specialized software) to be installed in the regional center (Causeni). Hardware for the Control Center (computer with operational system) will be provided by the project, the company will be responsible for installing the software for Control Center.
- b. Conduct the instruction of local personnel to ensure the correct system use provide at least one year of system maintenance and guarantee.

3. KEY ACTIVITIES AND EXPECTED OUTPUTS

It is expected that a Company will supply all necessary equipment and will carry out all the works related to the installation of the early warning solutions including but not limited to the following activities:

1. **Identification of the most appropriate technical solution, design** and coordinate the project with UNDP and beneficiary, taking due consideration of all applicable norms and standards.

2. **Supply and installation of all equipment,** materials and services needed for successful completion of project. Electronic sirens, internal command unit and other necessary items for ensuring the installation should be done by the company.

Detailed technical requirements are described in the Annex A

3. Installation of all equipment.

The company should execute the installation of all equipment in two villages according to the technical design approved on the initial phase. The installation will be done on existing constructions (building or pylon). The Company is solely responsible for complying with the construction norms and standards of the Republic of Moldova in the process of installing equipment.

4. Configuration of software according to the beneficiary's needs.

The program interface should be available in Romanian (obligatory) and English or Russian (as the second) languages. The system should have the possibility to integrate more nodes of the warning systems in localities.

5. Provision of the detailed documentation on the operation and maintenance of the system.

Detailed documentation on the operation and maintenance of the system installed locally (electronic sirens and local control module) and of the Control Center (software installed on the district level) should be done in Romanian and have the second language Russian or English.

6. Provision of basic training and training materials for key persons responsible for the operation of the system.

- A training session (half of the day) for the representatives from two villages on operation of the system in localities (electronic sirens and local control module) should be held (up to 5 persons);
- Two on-job trainings (one per locality) should follow the joint training session. Half of the day each (up to 5 persons);;
- One day training for operation of the Control Center (software) should be held for the representatives from regional and national level (up to 6 persons);
- Provision of the detailed information/instructions in Romanian and/or Russian language on operation of electronic sirens, local control module and the control center (software) should be prepared for the above-mentioned trainings.

7. Commissioning of the system.

The commissioning of the system should be done not later than December 10, 2015. Execution of all works and providing of basis training for responsible persons should be fully completed. The delivery acceptance act should be signed by the company, UNDP Moldova and the Beneficiary of the system.

8. Provision of maintenance assistance and warranty.

- The Company should ensure at least 12 months of maintenance from the date of the Delivery-Acceptance Act signature.
- Software upgrade should not imply the change of the hardware.
- The identified problem is considered to be solved if during the next 30 days it does not appear once again.
- For the effective functioning of the system technical support should be provided during the maintenance period for the users: solving the identified problems, provided the requested guidance and support for the system users, assistance in configuring and support on the local and regional levels.
- Warranty for the parts of the system should be:
 - o Minimum 1 year for installation works;
 - Minimum 3 years for hardware provided;




Overview of communities

Copanca is a village in Causeni district. The total area is 21,28 km with a residential area 5.3 km². Copanca village is located on a distance of 24 km from Causeni and 89 km from Chisinau. Population: 5138 citizens: 48.83% - men and 51.17% - women.

Taraclia is the only one village from the same name community located in Causeni district. The village is located on South East of Causeni district. The total area of the village is 5.51 km² with a perimeter of 15.09 km. The

distance from Copananca village to the central town of the district, Causeni is 26 km, from Chisinau 96 km. Population: 4280 citizens: 49% - men and 51% - women.

General Terms and Conditions

1. ACCEPTANCE OF THE PURCHASE ORDER

This Purchase Order may only be accepted by the Supplier's signing and returning an acknowledgement copy of it or by timely delivery of the goods in accordance with the terms of this Purchase Order, as herein specified. Acceptance of this Purchase Order shall effect a contract between the Parties under which the rights and obligations of the Parties shall be governed solely by the terms and conditions of this Purchase Order, including these General Conditions. No additional or inconsistent provisions proposed by the Supplier shall bind UNDP unless agreed to in writing by a duly authorized official of UNDP.

2. PAYMENT

- 2.1 UNDP shall, on fulfillment of the Delivery Terms, unless otherwise provided in this Purchase Order, make payment within 30 days of receipt of the Supplier's invoice for the goods and copies of the shipping documents specified in this Purchase Order.
- 2.2 Payment against the invoice referred to above will reflect any discount shown under the payment terms of this Purchase Order, provided payment is made within the period required by such payment terms.
- 2.3 Unless authorized by UNDP, the Supplier shall submit one invoice in respect of this Purchase Order, and such invoice must indicate the Purchase Order's identification number.
- 2.4 The prices shown in this Purchase Order may not be increased except by express written agreement of UNDP.

3. TAX EXEMPTION

- 3.1 Section 7 of the Convention on the Privileges and Immunities of the United Nations provides, inter alia, that the United Nations, including its subsidiary organs, is exempt from all direct taxes, except charges for utilities services, and is exempt from customs duties and charges of a similar nature in respect of articles imported or exported for its official use. In the event any governmental authority refuses to recognize UNDP's exemption from such taxes, duties or charges, the Supplier shall immediately consult with UNDP to determine a mutually acceptable procedure.
- 3.2 Accordingly, the Supplier authorizes UNDP to deduct from the Supplier's invoice any amount representing such taxes, duties or charges, unless the Supplier has consulted with UNDP before the payment thereof and UNDP has, in each instance, specifically authorized the Supplier to pay such taxes, duties or charges under protest. In that event, the Supplier shall provide UNDP with written evidence that payment of such taxes, duties or charges has been made and appropriately authorized.

4. RISK OF LOSS

Risk of loss, damage to or destruction of the goods shall be governed in accordance with Incoterms 2010, unless otherwise agreed upon by the Parties on the front side of this Purchase Order.

5. EXPORT LICENCES

Notwithstanding any INCOTERM 2010 used in this Purchase Order, the Supplier shall obtain any export licences required for the goods.

6. FITNESS OF GOODS/PACKAGING

The Supplier warrants that the goods, including packaging, conform to the specifications for the goods ordered under this Purchase Order and are fit for the purposes for which such goods are ordinarily used and

for purposes expressly made known to the Supplier by UNDP, and are free from defects in workmanship and materials. The Supplier also warrants that the goods are contained or packaged adequately to protect the goods.

7. INSPECTION

- 7.1 UNDP shall have a reasonable time after delivery of the goods to inspect them and to reject and refuse acceptance of goods not conforming to this Purchase Order; payment for goods pursuant to this Purchase Order shall not be deemed an acceptance of the goods.
- 7.2 Inspection prior to shipment does not relieve the Supplier from any of its contractual obligations.

8. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY INFRINGEMENT

The Supplier warrants that the use or supply by UNDP of the goods sold under this Purchase Order does not infringe any patent, design, trade-name or trade-mark. In addition, the Supplier shall, pursuant to this warranty, indemnify, defend and hold UNDP and the United Nations harmless from any actions or claims brought against UNDP or the United Nations pertaining to the alleged infringement of a patent, design, trade-name or trade-mark arising in connection with the goods sold under this Purchase Order.

9. RIGHTS OF UNDP

In case of failure by the Supplier to fulfil its obligations under the terms and conditions of this Purchase Order, including but not limited to failure to obtain necessary export licences, or to make delivery of all or part of the goods by the agreed delivery date or dates, UNDP may, after giving the Supplier reasonable notice to perform and without prejudice to any other rights or remedies, exercise one or more of the following rights:

- 9.1 Procure all or part of the goods from other sources, in which event UNDP may hold the Supplier responsible for any excess cost occasioned thereby.
- 9.2 Refuse to accept delivery of all or part of the goods.
- 9.3 Cancel this Purchase Order without any liability for termination charges or any other liability of any kind of UNDP.

10. LATE DELIVERY

Without limiting any other rights or obligations of the parties hereunder, if the Supplier will be unable to deliver the goods by the delivery date(s) stipulated in this Purchase Order, the Supplier shall (i) immediately consult with UNDP to determine the most expeditious means for delivering the goods and (ii) use an expedited means of delivery, at the Supplier's cost (unless the delay is due to <u>Force Majeure</u>), if reasonably so requested by UNDP.

11. ASSIGNMENT AND INSOLVENCY

- 11.1. The Supplier shall not, except after obtaining the written consent of UNDP, assign, transfer, pledge or make other disposition of this Purchase Order, or any part thereof, or any of the Supplier's rights or obligations under this Purchase Order.
- 11.2. Should the Supplier become insolvent or should control of the Supplier change by virtue of insolvency, UNDP may, without prejudice to any other rights or remedies, immediately terminate this Purchase Order by giving the Supplier written notice of termination.

12. USE OF UNDP OR UNITED NATIONS NAME OR EMBLEM

The Supplier shall not use the name, emblem or official seal of UNDP or the United Nations for any purpose.

13. PROHIBITION ON ADVERTISING

The Supplier shall not advertise or otherwise make public that it is furnishing goods or services to UNDP without specific permission of UNDP in each instance.

14. CHILD LABOUR

The Supplier represents and warrants that neither it nor any of its affiliates is engaged in any practice inconsistent with the rights set forth in the Convention on the Rights of the Child, including Article 32 thereof, which, inter alia, requires that a child shall be protected from performing any work that is likely to be hazardous or to interfere with the child's education, or to be harmful to the child's health or physical, mental, spiritual, moral or social development.

Any breach of this representation and warranty shall entitle UNDP to terminate this Purchase Order immediately upon notice to the Supplier, without any liability for termination charges or any other liability of any kind of UNDP.

15. MINES

The Supplier represents and warrants that neither it nor any of its affiliates is actively and directly engaged in patent activities, development, assembly, production, trade or manufacture of mines or in such activities in respect of components primarily utilized in the manufacture of Mines. The term "Mines" means those devices defined in Article 2, Paragraphs 1, 4 and 5 of Protocol II annexed to the Convention on Prohibitions and Restrictions on the Use of Certain Conventional Weapons Which May Be Deemed to Be Excessively Injurious or to Have Indiscriminate Effects of 1980.

Any breach of this representation and warranty shall entitle UNDP to terminate this Purchase Order immediately upon notice to the Supplier, without any liability for termination charges or any other liability of any kind of UNDP.

16. SETTLEMENT OF DISPUTES

- 16.1 **Amicable Settlement.** The Parties shall use their best efforts to settle amicably any dispute, controversy or claim arising out of, or relating to this Purchase Order or the breach, termination or invalidity thereof. Where the Parties wish to seek such an amicable settlement through conciliation, the conciliation shall take place in accordance with the UNCITRAL Conciliation Rules then obtaining, or according to such other procedure as may be agreed between the Parties.
- Arbitration. Unless, any such dispute, controversy or claim between the Parties arising out of or relating to this Purchase Order or the breach, termination or invalidity thereof is settled amicably under the preceding paragraph of this Section within sixty (60) days after receipt by one Party of the other Party's request for such amicable settlement, such dispute, controversy or claim shall be referred by either Party to arbitration in accordance with the UNCITRAL Arbitration Rules then obtaining, including its provisions on applicable law. The arbitral tribunal shall have no authority to award punitive damages. The Parties shall be bound by any arbitration award rendered as a result of such arbitration as the final adjudication of any such controversy, claim or dispute.

17. PRIVILEGES AND IMMUNITIES

Nothing in or related to these General Terms and Conditions or this Purchase Order shall be deemed a waiver of any of the privileges and immunities of the United Nations, including its subsidiary organs.

18. SEXUAL EXPLOITATION:

18.1 The Contractor shall take all appropriate measures to prevent sexual exploitation or abuse of anyone by it or by any of its employees or any other persons who may be engaged by the

Contractor to perform any services under the Contract. For these purposes, sexual activity with any person less than eighteen years of age, regardless of any laws relating to consent, shall constitute the sexual exploitation and abuse of such person. In addition, the Contractor shall refrain from, and shall take all appropriate measures to prohibit its employees or other persons engaged by it from, exchanging any money, goods, services, offers of employment or other things of value, for sexual favors or activities, or from engaging in any sexual activities that are exploitive or degrading to any person. The Contractor acknowledges and agrees that the provisions hereof constitute an essential term of the Contract and that any breach of this representation and warranty shall entitle UNDP to terminate the Contract immediately upon notice to the Contractor, without any liability for termination charges or any other liability of any kind.

18.2 UNDP shall not apply the foregoing standard relating to age in any case in which the Contractor's personnel or any other person who may be engaged by the Contractor to perform any services under the Contract is married to the person less than the age of eighteen years with whom sexual activity has occurred and in which such marriage is recognized as valid under the laws of the country of citizenship of such Contractor's personnel or such other person who may be engaged by the Contractor to perform any services under the Contract.

19. OFFICIALS NOT TO BENEFIT:

The Contractor warrants that no official of UNDP or the United Nations has received or will be offered by the Contractor any direct or indirect benefit arising from this Contract or the award thereof. The Contractor agrees that breach of this provision is a breach of an essential term of this Contract.

20. AUTHORITY TO MODIFY:

Pursuant to the Financial Regulations and Rules of UNDP, only the UNDP Authorized Official possess the authority to agree on behalf of UNDP to any modification of or change in this Agreement, to a waiver of any of its provisions or to any additional contractual relationship of any kind with the Contractor. Accordingly, no modification or change in this Contract shall be valid and enforceable against UNDP unless provided by an amendment to this Agreement signed by the Contractor and jointly by the UNDP Authorized Official.
