1. BACKGROUND

In November 2013 during COP 19, a decision on "Intended Nationally Determined Contributions" (INDCs) was adopted. This decision invited "all Parties to initiate or intensify domestic preparations for their intended nationally determined contributions, without prejudice to the legal nature of the contributions, in the context of adopting a protocol, another legal instrument or an agreed outcome with legal force under the Convention for the period post 2020 applicable to all Parties towards achieving the objective of the Convention as set out in its Article 2 and to communicate them well in advance of the twenty-first session of the Conference of the Parties (by the first quarter of 2015 by those Parties ready to do so) in a manner that facilitates the clarity, transparency and understanding of the intended contributions, without prejudice to the legal nature of the contributions." (Dec.1/CP19).

Due to the fact that this decision of the COP did not provide any further guidance or information on INDCs and there was a lack of specific financial support mechanisms to non-Annex I Parties for the initiation and/or intensification of domestic preparations for INDCs, the Project on "Thailand's Domestic Preparation for Post 2020 Contributions" was developed under the collaboration between ONEP and UNDP countries to engage the country in the exercise of identifying, consulting, preparing, and communicating INDCs in advance of the COP21, with support from GEF STAR allocations. The Project supports Thailand to ensure solid technical ground in preparation for ratification process and

formulate concrete roadmap to guide INDC/NDC implementation, in line with agreements reached or to be reached further in UNFCCC.

Although Thailand successfully submitted its INDC to UNFCCC on 1st October 2015 with the technical supports under this Project, the implementation of this new climate change action plan is still a challenge. In order to reduce its greenhouse gas emissions by 20 per cent from the projected business-as-usual (BAU) level by 2030, a clear roadmap to guide INDC implementation is essential. With the combined financial supports from the Projects on "Thailand's Domestic Preparation for Post 2020 Contributions" and "Strengthening Thailand's Capacity to Link Climate Policy and Public Finance", UNDP, in this regards, is seeking a climate change mitigation specialist to formulate the INDC implementation roadmap, particularly for key sectors e.g. energy, transport, waste, and industry, in order to guide related planning and sectoral agencies in Thailand to embark on the implementation, in accordance with the Paris Agreement.

2. SCOPE OF WORK

Scope of Work:

Under the guidance of ONEP's Office of Climate Change Coordination and UNDP's Inclusive Green Growth & Sustainable Development Unit, the Climate Change Mitigation Specialist will undertake the followings:

I. Preparation for INDC Implementation roadmap (Energy, transport, waste, and industry)

- Define mitigation reduction target in energy, transport, waste, and industry;
- Consult with agencies related to these sectors on the progress of implementation and also perform the need and gap assessments;
- Develop a framework for INDC implementation roadmap containing CC mitigation measures and targets (20% from BAU) based on AIM modelling.

II. Development of INDC Implementation roadmap (Energy, transport, waste, and industry)

- Organize a kick off meeting to consider the draft framework for INDC implementation roadmap;
- Consult with each sectoral working group in order to seek comments/suggestions and subsequently develop the detailed CC mitigation measures for each respective sector;
- Develop detailed INDC implementation roadmap;
- Hold consultations on the draft roadmap and subsequently revise the draft;
- Draft Policy matrix and identify cross-cutting measures, and organize workshops for consultations;
- Finalize the draft INDC implementation roadmap.

III. Stocktaking on GHG mitigation potential in Agriculture and forestry

 Hold consultation with related agencies on the current implementation – progress and challenges;

- Review domestic related policy/plan (including international good practice);
- Develop a report/recommendation on the potential CC mitigation.

3. REQUIRED SKILLS AND EXPERIENCE

The consultant should possess the following expertise and qualifications:

Education:

• Advanced University degree in industrial engineering, environmental science, environmental engineering, economics, social sciences, or other related field.

Experience:

- Thai nationality;
- At least 10 year experiences in climate change researches, particularly GHG mitigation works in energy, transport, wastes, and related sectors;
- Familiar with government institutions and coordination mechanism;
- Possess working experience with government institutions, international organization, or international conference is preferable;
- Ability to use computer especially Microsoft office software applications;
- Good written and oral communication skills;
- Good human relationship and able to coordinate with other related agencies.

Language Requirements:

• Fluency in written and spoken English.

8. FINANCIAL PROPOSAL

The method of payment is **output-based lump-sum scheme**. The total amount quoted shall be all-inclusive and include all costs components required to perform the deliverables identified in the TOR, including professional fee, travel costs, living allowance (if any work is to be done outside the IC's duty station) and any other applicable cost to be incurred by the IC in completing the assignment. The contract price will be fixed output-based price regardless of extension of the herein specified duration. Payments will be done upon completion of the deliverables/outputs and as per below percentages:

- Deliverable 1: Submission of work plan 10% of total payment;
- Deliverable 2: Submission of a report related to the preparation for INDC implementation roadmap. The report shall contain a draft framework for INDC implementation roadmap for energy, transport, waste, and industry sectors, and the draft framework shall indicate CC mitigation measures and targets (20% from BAU) based on AIM modelling – 25% of total payment;
- Deliverable 3: Submission of a progress report related to the development of INDC implementation roadmap and the stocktaking on GHG mitigation potential in agriculture and forestry. The progress report shall contain a draft of INDC implementation roadmap for energy, transport, waste, and industry sectors and a review of GHG mitigation potential in agriculture and forestry 40% of total payment;
- Deliverable 4: Submission of a final report related to the development of INDC implementation roadmap and the stocktaking on GHG mitigation potential in agriculture and forestry. The final report shall contain the final draft of INDC implementation roadmap for energy, transport, waste, and industry sectors reflecting comments and suggestions gathered through a series of consultations with relevant sectoral working group. It shall also contain recommendations on

GHG mitigation potential in agriculture and forestry sectors- 25% of total payment.

9. EVALUATION

Individual consultants will be evaluated based on the following methodology

Cumulative analysis

The award of the contract shall be made to the individual consultant whose offer has been evaluated and determined as a) responsive/compliant/acceptable; and b) having received the highest score out of set of weighted technical criteria (70%). and financial criteria (30%). Financial score shall be computed as a ratio of the proposal being evaluated and the lowest priced proposal received by UNDP for the assignment.

Technical Criteria for Evaluation (Maximum 500 points)

- Criteria 1 : Relevance of Education/ Degree max 75 points;
- Criteria 2: Years of Relevant Experience max 175 points;
- Criteria 3: Familiar with government institutions/ international organization and coordination mechanism and possess working experience with the government institutions, international organization, or international conference:- max 150 points;
- Criteria 4: Adequacy of key Competencies for the Assignment max 100 points.

Only candidates obtaining a minimum of 350 points (70% of the total technical points) would be considered for the Financial Evaluation.
