A two-stage procedure is utilized in evaluating the submissions, with evaluation of the technical components being completed prior to any price proposals being opened and compared. The price proposal will be opened only for submissions that passed the minimum technical score of 70% of the obtainable score of 1000 points in the evaluation of the technical component.

The technical component is evaluated on the basis of its responsiveness to the Term of Reference (TOR).

Maximum 1000 points will be given to the lowest offer and the other financial proposals will receive the points inversely proportional to their financial offers. i.e. Sf = 1000 x Fm / F, in which Sf is the financial score, Fm is the lowest price and F the price of the submission under consideration.

The weight of technical points is 70% and financial points is 30%.

Submission obtaining the highest weighted points (technical points + financial points) will be selected.

Interview with the candidates may be held if deemed necessary.

1) GENERAL BACKGROUND

Viet Nam Academy of Science and Technology is implementing the Project "Local Development and Promotion of LED Technologies for Advanced General Lighting in Viet Nam" funded by GEF/UNDP and co-financing by Viet Nam agencies/institutions.

The objective of the Project is to mitigate GHG emissions through transformation of the lighting market towards greater usage of locally produced LED lighting products in Viet Nam. This objective will be achieved by removing barriers to increased production and utilization of locally produced LED lighting products in Viet Nam through two components:

- (i) The transfer of skills, knowledge and technology for the manufacturing of LED lamps in Viet Nam; and
- (ii) The demonstration of cost-effective local commercial production of LED lighting devices.

The Project will be implemented over a 4-year period and is expected to achieve GHG emission reductions through the displacement of electricity generation from fossil-fuel power plants.

The local LED manufacturers have made modest investments into their own R&D facilities, staffed with local lighting experts. Their current research and development includes design of new LED lighting devices for various indoor and outdoor usages without appropriate design standards. These baseline activities will be complemented and scope expanded through the following incremental GEF assistance on R&D lighting technology training programs for professionals of RALACO, DIEN QUANG and other related LED lighting companies:

- Enabling them to design LED based lighting products for general lighting use. These training
 programs will also include lighting engineers, environmental engineers, climate change
 professionals, electricians, contractors, and suppliers to design, develop and implement training
 programs specifically tailored for LED lamp manufacturing activities;
- Facilitating dialogue between themselves and national R&D centers of LED lighting products to ensure that R&D concepts are disseminated to the production level, and properly researched for design and possible pilot production.

VAST and UNDP are looking for a qualified international consultant to provide technical assistance in development and implementation of R&D training program on LED Lighting Technologies (IRDT).

2) OBJECTIVES OF THE ASSIGNMENT

The objective of this assignment is to provide technical advice to the national consultant on the development and implementation of R&D training program on LED Lighting Technologies. This training program will enhance the capacities of relevant national lighting R&D organizations as well as R&D centers of local manufacturers (lighting engineers, lighting products designers, LED lighting suppliers) to produce high quality LED lighting products meeting the Vietnamese and international standards.

3) SCOPE OF WORK

The IRDT consultant will be responsible for the following tasks and activities:

Quarter 3-4/2016 (09 home-based days)

- + Work with PMU and a relevant national consultant to prepare a Work Plan for the whole contract duration;
- + Provide technical inputs/advices to the National Consultant, who is in-charge of development and implementation of R&D Training Program on Basic and Advanced LED lighting technologies (NRDT), to develop the draft training program developed by the NRDT, including: (a)- the training needs; (b)- the targeted groups of trainees; (c)- training module contents; (d)- the courses duration; (e)- the TORs of trainers; and (g)- the methodology of training courses results assessment;
- + Review and provide comments on the R&D training programme developed by the NRDT;
- + Support the NRDT consultant to identify and recommend a list of international and national (if any) lecturers to prepare and deliver lectures;
- + Support NRDT consultant to finalize the training program and training curriculum.

Quarter 1/2017 (2 mission working days, 01 home-based working day)

- Conduct a first mission to Viet Nam to:
 - + Give a lectures/presentations on the international experiences and the best practices in EE lighting technology (incl. with focus on LED lighting technology) R&D at a training course in Ha Noi City;
 - + Support the NRDT consultant and PMU to assess the results of the first training course and provide lesson learned for the second training course to be organized in Ho Chi Minh City; and
 - + Prepare a first mission results report to be submitted to PMU.

Quarter 2/2017 (02 mission working days, 01 home-based day)

- Conduct a second mission to Viet Nam to:

<u>Methodology</u>: The selected consultant will propose and discuss with PMU the approach in undertaking the assignment. This shall include: i) desktop review of the project documents and related information within the LED Lighting R&D and Training sector; ii) meet and interview with key project partners including Lighting Training institutions, Lighting R&D institutions, manufacturers, relevant experts, and PMU staff as agreed with VAST and UNDP.
