I. BACKGROUND

The Indonesian Correction services has requested support for the development of a risk assessment tool for violent extremist offenders. Although Indonesian authorities have been successful in identifying, capturing, prosecuting and sentencing violent extremist offenders, a tradition of relatively short sentences for terrorism-related crimes, as well as multiple opportunities for remission, means that the actual period of time an offender spends incarcerated is often less than ten years. Some offenders use prisons as a place to plan future attacks, while others try to win new adherents to their cause from among the general population. Indonesian Corrections recognizes that it needs to enhance its capacity to assess the kinds of risks that violent extremist offenders pose within Indonesian prisons.

Risk assessment plays a central role in the management of terrorist offenders in the criminal justice system, impacting every level of decision-making - the identification of appropriate treatment opportunities in prison, the specification of the prisoner's placement in prison, the determination of parole eligibility and the allocation of resources in monitoring and supervising offenders in the community.

UNICRI continues its assistance and support to Indonesian Corrections in the development of its own culturally and linguistically appropriate violent extremist risk assessment tool/protocol. The final output of the project will be the risk assessment tool for violent extremist offenders (improved LITMAS) tested in a number of selected prisons. The activities aim to test the final draft of the risk assessment tool (improved LITMAS).

II. SCOPE OF WORK, ACTIVITIES, AND DELIVERABLES

Under the supervision of the National Project Officer and UNICRI Headquarter and upon consultation with the Directorate General of Correction of Republic of Indonesia, the consultant/expert should provide his/her expertise to the development of training modules on administering improved LITMAS as well as facilitate the training for prison and parole staff. In performing his/her duties, the consultant/expert is required to collaborate with other consultants with different expertise under the same project.

The consultant with expertise in related fields is expected to support in the following tasks:

- Study and review the interactive training modules and material aimed at enhancing capacity of correction staff on implementation of the risk assessment tool taking into consideration international best practices;
- Determine key leanings and design of module to be used as fundamentals of module to be used as fundamentals to implementation of risk assessment tool (improved LITMAS);
- Facilitate discussion with relevant technical directorate for the training need as well as assessing the level of knowledge of the participant to ensure the training module fits with the need;
- Review, facilitate and organise series of training to enhance capacity of correction staff to be able to use improved LITMAS tool;
- Advise UNCIRI and DGC for the sustainability of training module to ensure continuation of implementation of improved LITMAS within correctional system

Specifically for utilisation purposes, the consultant is expected to support the project in:

- Drafting training module on improved LITMAS
- Preparing training material including:
 - a) group work and interactive materials

b) facilitators notes

- c) handouts,
- d) identification of further reading / references,
- e) any other supporting materials identified as necessary for the achievement of the training objectives.
