Justification and	The United Nations Human Settlements Programme (UN-Habitat) is the		
background	United Nations agency for human settlements. It is mandated by the UN		
	General Assembly to promote socially and environmentally sustainable		
	towns and cities with the goal of providing adequate shelter for all.		
	This international consultancy is located at the UN-Habitat Iraq Programme		
	based in Erbil, Iraq, for six months from 1 February 2015.		
	The most recent hostilities in Irag have led to 2 million Iragi Internally		
	Displaced Person's (IDPs). Almost 600,000 IDPs are residing in Kudish Region		
	in Iraq (KRI). The United Nations has recently declared a Level 3 Emergency,		
	to launch a more urgent and scalable response to meet life-saving needs,		
	with food, shelter, protection and health interventions as priorities.		
	UN-Habitat has been engaged in emergency response projects in KR-I since		
	2013 through UNHCR funding in supporting shelter and WASH for refugees.		
	In 2012, UN-Habitat developed the durable shelter solutions for people		
	affected by displacement in Iraq after the completion of large shelter project		
	in 2011 for IDPs/returnees in Erbil, Babylon, Wasit and Thi-Qar. The		
	implemented project provided shelters for 296 IDP/returnee families		
	through constructing core houses on public allocated land. In response to		
	the current IDP crisis, UN-Habitat has already agreements with the		
	concerned authorities of Erbil, Sulaimanieh and Duhok to allocate lands for		
	the establishments of Prefab Shelter Units for the most vulnerable refugees.		
	Aside from the crisis, UN-Habitat's Programme is working with central and		
	local government partners to support them, in strengthening relevant		
	aspects of governance and management in the following urban areas:		
	Effective urbanization, urban planning, and local governance

	<ul> <li>Increased emphasis on pro-poor housing</li> </ul>		
	<ul> <li>Improved infrastructure and basic services</li> </ul>		
	The Safer Cities Programme was launched in 1996 by UN-HABITAT in order		
	to seek sustainable urban management to tackle urban crime and violence in		
	cities. To date UN-HABITAT has supported 77 cities in 24 countries all over		

the world. Under the Kurdistan development vision 2020, UN-Habitat has launched recently a project in Sulaymaniya aims to be a good practice on the Safer Cities Programme in the Kurdistan Region of Iraq. The project encourages cooperation among the various key stakeholders to promote urban safety particularly for women and girls in the city to secure human rights and enhance the rule of law in the KRI. The project also support the establishment of a safer cities platform between citizens, civil society organizations, local authorities and security institutions in Sulaymaniya, and implement a series of physical interventions in public spaces to prevent and reduce crime in the centre of Sulaymaniya city. The project is jointly implemented by UN agencies including UNDP and UNWOMEN
