#### 1. Background

The Rakhine Area-Based Project contributes to the new UNDP Country Programme 2018-2022 and its flagship projects, including the Support to Effective and Responsive Institutions Project (SERIP), Strengthening Accountability and Rule of Law Project (SARL), Governance for Resilience and Sustainability Project (GRSP), and Peace and Access to Justice Project. The Township Democratic Local Governance project (TDLG project) contributes to UNDP Country Programme (2018-2022) *Output 1.1. Effective public institutions enabled to develop and implement evidence-based policies and systems that respond to the needs of the people*, and Support to Effective and Responsive Institutions Project (SERIP).

The TDLG component of the RABP covers 5 townships (Thandwe, Ponnagyun, Gwa, Toungup, Ramree) but has been requested by Rakhine state government to expand the project to two additional townships, Munaung and Pauktaw in FY 2019/20. UNDP is therefore looking for a local Consultant to by providing technical support (a) in the expansion to the two new townships, and (b) in implementing the activities in Thandwe township.

The Consultant will work under direct supervision of Senior Technical and Management Specialist based in Rakhine State Government Office in Sittwe and in close collaboration with UNDP Field Office in Sittwe, UNDP TDLG team in Yangon, Government officials, technical advisors and experts, implementing partners, beneficiaries and civil society to support implementation of activities envisaged in Thandwe, as well as in Munaung and Pauktaw townships. The Consultant will be based in Sittwe with travels to Thandwe, Pauktaw and Munaung and other TDLG Townships in Rakhine, as required.

#### 2. Objectives of the Assignment

The Consultant will be responsible for providing technical assistance in engaging with Township department officials and to some extent Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) based in Thandwe township, Rakhine State. S/he will report directly to the Senior Technical Specialist in Rakhine State, who will provide overall guidance and direction on the assignment. The incumbent will be required to operate in challenging environments and demonstrate his/her ability in dealing with sensitive issues and building effective partnerships in support of the project's outputs and strategic objectives. The scope of work for this assignment will include:

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- Provide technical support to Thandwe Township Planning and Implementation Committee from November 2019 to February 2020;
- Provide coordination support to the government counterparts and Civil Society Organizations as part of the extension to Two New Townships in Rakhine State, from December to end of March 2020.
- To produce the work outputs as mentioned in detail deliverables of each month from November 2019 to end of March 2020.

- Fluency in Myanmar and local language spoken in Rakhine is a must.

- There is no international travel assumed for this ToR, given that the ToR is looking for experts who are already based in Myanmar.
- UNDP will book and arrange in-country travels.
- When missions outside the specified duty stations are agreed between UNDP and the expert, UNDP will arrange and cover the transportation.
- UNDP will arrange translator(s) and interpreter(s) if and when required.
