4. Conflict of 4.1 Interests

- Bidders must strictly avoid conflicts with other assignments or their own interests, and act without consideration for future work. Bidders found to have a conflict of interest shall be disqualified. Without limitation on the generality of the above, Bidders, and any of their affiliates, shall be considered to have a conflict of interest with one or more parties in this solicitation process, if they:
 - a) Are or have been associated in the past, with a firm or any of its affiliates which have been engaged by UNDP to provide services for the preparation of the design, specifications, Terms of Reference, cost analysis/estimation, and other documents to be used for the procurement of the goods and services in this selection process;
 - b) Were involved in the preparation and/or design of the programme/project related to the services requested under this RFP; or
 - c) Are found to be in conflict for any other reason, as may be established by, or at the discretion of UNDP.
- 4.2 In the event of any uncertainty in the interpretation of a potential conflict of interest, Bidders must disclose to UNDP, and seek UNDP's confirmation on whether or not such a conflict exists.
- 4.3 Similarly, the Bidders must disclose in their proposal their knowledge of the following:
 - a) If the owners, part-owners, officers, directors, controlling shareholders, of the bidding entity or key personnel are family members of UNDP staff involved in the procurement functions and/or the Government of the country or any Implementing Partner receiving services under this RFP; and
 - b) All other circumstances that could potentially lead to actual or perceived conflict of interest, collusion or unfair competition practices.

Failure to disclose such an information may result in the rejection of the proposal or proposals affected by the non-disclosure.

4.4 The eligibility of Bidders that are wholly or partly owned by the Government shall be subject to UNDP's further evaluation and review of various factors such as being registered, operated and managed as an independent business entity, the extent of Government ownership/share, receipt of subsidies, mandate and access to information in relation to this RFP, among others. Conditions that may lead to undue advantage against other Bidders may result in the eventual rejection of the Proposal.

13. Currencies

- 13.1 All prices shall be quoted in the currency or currencies indicated in the BDS. Where Proposals are quoted in different currencies, for the purposes of comparison of all Proposals:
 - a) UNDP will convert the currency quoted in the Proposal into the UNDP preferred currency, in accordance with the prevailing UN operational rate of exchange on the last day of submission of Proposals; and
 - b) In the event that UNDP selects a proposal for award that is quoted in a currency different from the preferred currency in the BDS, UNDP shall reserve the right to award the contract in the currency of UNDP's preference, using the conversion method specified above.

14. Joint Venture, **Consortium** or Association

- 14.1 If the Bidder is a group of legal entities that will form or have formed a Joint Venture (JV), Consortium or Association for the Proposal, they shall confirm in their Proposal that: (i) they have designated one party to act as a lead entity, duly vested with authority to legally bind the members of the JV, Consortium or Association jointly and severally, which shall be evidenced by a duly notarized Agreement among the legal entities, and submitted with the Proposal; and (ii) if they are awarded the contract, the contract shall be entered into, by and between UNDP and the designated lead entity, who shall be acting for and on behalf of all the member entities comprising the joint venture.
- After the Deadline for Submission of Proposal, the lead entity identified to 14.2 represent the JV, Consortium or Association shall not be altered without the prior written consent of UNDP.
- The lead entity and the member entities of the JV, Consortium or 14.3

- Association shall abide by the provisions of Clause 9 herein in respect of submitting only one proposal.
- 14.4 The description of the organization of the JV, Consortium or Association must clearly define the expected role of each of the entity in the joint venture in delivering the requirements of the RFP, both in the Proposal and the JV, Consortium or Association Agreement. All entities that comprise the JV, Consortium or Association shall be subject to the eligibility and qualification assessment by UNDP.
- 14.5 A JV, Consortium or Association in presenting its track record and experience should clearly differentiate between:
 - a) Those that were undertaken together by the JV, Consortium or Association; and
 - b) Those that were undertaken by the individual entities of the JV, Consortium or Association.
- 14.6 Previous contracts completed by individual experts working privately but who are permanently or were temporarily associated with any of the member firms cannot be claimed as the experience of the JV, Consortium or Association or those of its members, but should only be claimed by the individual experts themselves in their presentation of their individual credentials.
- 14.7 JV, Consortium or Associations are encouraged for high value, multi-sectoral requirements when the spectrum of expertise and resources required may not be available within one firm.

15. Only One Proposal

- One 15.1 The Bidder (including the individual members of any Joint Venture) shall submit only one Proposal, either in its own name or as part of a Joint Venture.
 - 15.2 Proposals submitted by two (2) or more Bidders shall all be rejected if they are found to have any of the following:
 - a) they have at least one controlling partner, director or shareholder in common; or
 - b) any one of them receive or have received any direct or indirect subsidy from the other/s; or
 - c) they have the same legal representative for purposes of this RFP; or
 - d) they have a relationship with each other, directly or through common third parties, that puts them in a position to have access to information about, or influence on the Proposal of, another Bidder regarding this RFP process;
 - e) they are subcontractors to each other's Proposal, or a subcontractor to one Proposal also submits another Proposal under its name as lead Bidder: or
 - f) some key personnel proposed to be in the team of one Bidder participates in more than one Proposal received for this RFP process. This condition relating to the personnel, does not apply to subcontractors being included in more than one Proposal.

16. Proposal Validity Period	 Proposals shall remain valid for the period specified in the BDS, common the Deadline for Submission of Proposals. A Proposal valid for a period may be rejected by UNDP and rendered non-responsive. During the Proposal validity period, the Bidder shall maintain its Proposal without any change, including the availability of the Key Pethe proposed rates and the total price. 	
17. Extension of Proposal Validity Period	17.1	In exceptional circumstances, prior to the expiration of the proposal validity period, UNDP may request Bidders to extend the period of validity of their Proposals. The request and the responses shall be made in writing, and shall be considered integral to the Proposal.

	22.3 Bidders must be aware that the mere act of submission of a Proposal, in and of itself, implies that the Bidder fully accepts the UNDP General Contract Terms and Conditions.

with respect to minimum documentary requirements, whether the documents have been properly signed, and whether the Proposals are generally in order, among other indicators that may be used at this stage. UNDP reserves the right to reject any Proposal at this stage.

29. Evaluation of Eligibility and Qualification

- 29.1 Eligibility and Qualification of the Bidder will be evaluated against the Minimum Eligibility/Qualification requirements specified in the Section 4 (Evaluation Criteria).
- 29.2 In general terms, vendors that meet the following criteria may be considered qualified:
 - a) They are not included in the UN Security Council 1267/1989 Committee's list of terrorists and terrorist financiers, and in UNDP's ineligible vendors' list;
 - b) They have a good financial standing and have access to adequate financial resources to perform the contract and all existing commercial commitments,
 - They have the necessary similar experience, technical expertise, production capacity where applicable, quality certifications, quality assurance procedures and other resources applicable to the provision of the services required;
 - d) They are able to comply fully with UNDP General Terms and Conditions of Contract;
 - e) They do not have a consistent history of court/arbitral award decisions against the Bidder; and
 - f) They have a record of timely and satisfactory performance with their clients.

30. Evaluation of Technical and Financial Proposals

- 30.1 The evaluation team shall review and evaluate the Technical Proposals on the basis of their responsiveness to the Terms of Reference and other RFP documents, applying the evaluation criteria, sub-criteria, and point system specified in the Section 4 (Evaluation Criteria). A Proposal shall be rendered non-responsive at the technical evaluation stage if it fails to achieve the minimum technical score indicated in the BDS. When necessary and if stated in the BDS, UNDP may invite technically responsive bidders for a presentation related to their technical proposals. The conditions for the presentation shall be provided in the bid document where required.
- In the second stage, only the Financial Proposals of those Bidders who achieve the minimum technical score will be opened for evaluation. The Financial Proposals corresponding to Technical Proposals that were rendered non-responsive shall remain unopened, and, in the case of manual submission, be returned to the Bidder unopened. For emailed Proposals and e-tendering submissions, UNDP will not request for the password of the Financial Proposals of bidders whose Technical Proposal were found not responsive.
- 30.3 The evaluation method that applies for this RFP shall be as indicated in the BDS, which may be either of two (2) possible methods, as follows: (a) the lowest priced method which selects the lowest evaluated financial proposal of the technically responsive Bidders; or (b) the combined scoring method

which will be based on a combination of the technical and financial score.

30.4 When the BDS specifies a combined scoring method, the formula for the rating of the Proposals will be as follows:

Rating the Technical Proposal (TP):

TP Rating = (Total Score Obtained by the Offer / Max. Obtainable Score for TP) \times 100

31. Due Diligence

- 31.1 UNDP reserves the right to undertake a due diligence exercise, also called post qualification, aimed at determining to its satisfaction, the validity of the information provided by the Bidder. 32. Clarification of Proposals

Engagement of an Organization for Consultancy Services to prepare Master Plan, Design and conduct detail Supervision of "Expansion of Balochistan Provincial Police Training College (PTC), Quetta".

A. Project Title:

Strengthening Rule of Law Project

B. Project Description and Objectives:

The UNDP Strengthening Rule of Law Project (SRLP) in Pakistan aims to promote an enabling environment to support the Government of Balochistan in its on-going efforts to secure peace and stability. Under this project, assistance is provided for the Balochistan Rule of Law Roadmap that is intended to serve as a guiding strategic document and measurable plan for the Government of Balochistan to introduce qualitative and high impact sustainable reforms in the justice sector of the province. The Roadmap aims to strengthen the institutional capacities of the Rule of Law institutions by collaborative, financial and legislative support as well as leadership and management initiatives across these key institutions to enhance institutional response and consequently citizens' trust in the justice system. One of the key priority areas in institutional development includes reforming the Balochistan Provincial Police by focusing on functional specialization, accountability and enhanced allocation of resources and their efficient utilization, digitalization of policing records and services, women representation, strengthening of intelligence-led policing, forensics support to investigations, improved content of training curriculum and quality training facilities, and collaboration with other criminal justice actors.

One particularly weak area in policing in Balochistan that needs capacity building is their training regime. The Balochistan police have four training institutions: Police Training College (PTC) Quetta, Anti-Terrorism Training Centre Quetta, Balochistan Constabulary Training School Kalat and Recruit Training Centre Quetta. These police training institutions face significant challenges such as a lack of basic living and training facilities, and the boundary walls are not sufficiently constructed to provide adequate security to personnel. Lack of secure training space increases the risk of terrorist attacks as witnessed in October 2016 when terrorists attacked the Balochistan Police Training College leaving 61 police dead and 117 injured. The training curriculum is largely outdated which impinges upon the ability of the police to meet basic policing needs, not to mention modern day challenges to combat terrorism and organized and high-tech crimes. The Federal Ombudsman Report of 2016 emphasizes provision of specialized training to officers and noted that it is vital to provide necessary resources and infrastructure to institutionalize and improve the quality of training imparted by the specialist training schools. The report recommends that the budget allocation for training schools should be incrementally increased over the next five years from 1% to 10% of the total police budget.

In 1963, the Regional Training Centre (RTC) in Quetta was established and was eventually upgraded to a Police Training School (PTS) in 1973. In 2003, it was upgraded to Police Training College (PTC) with a training capacity of approximately 600 officers positioned on 172 acres of land. PTC-Q also has a hostel for female constables with a capacity for 50 women police officers. PTC-Q provides training to the Balochistan Provincial Police, the Balochistan Constabulary, the

Balochistan Levies, among other law enforcement agencies. It is headed by a Deputy Inspector General of Police (DIG)-ranked Commandant overseeing a total staff of 174.

The aim of JPTC Quetta is to provide specialized training to the Baluchistan police, Federal Levies, Frontier Constabulary and other law enforcement agencies. This project is extension of the existing Police Lines at Quetta. The current training capacity of the Police Lines Quetta is for 600 trainees; however, the Baluchistan police intends to increase its capacity to at least 1640 trainees through the proposed JPTC Quetta construction. **Estimated Project Cost is PKR 570 Million**

A. Objective of Consultancy

B. The objective of this consultancy is to efficiently manage the project through assistance to UNDP such that envisaged each activity of the project is completed in agreed timeline, within budgeted cost frame and in full compliance with the UNDP guidelines.
