Description of Requirements

Context of the Requirement

The landmine and explosive remnants of war (ERW) problem in Cambodia is the result of a series of internal and regional conflicts that affected the country from the mid-1960s until the end of 1998. The anti-personnel mine problem is concentrated, but not limited to, the north-western provinces bordering Thailand, and is one of the most densely contaminated regions in the world. Other parts of the country, mainly the east, are impacted by ERWs, including cluster munitions.

The number of landmine and ERW accidents has been dropping, from 4,320 in 1996 to 58 in 2018. However, landmines and ERW continue to hinder national reconstruction and development as some 1,734 square kilometers remain impacted by the presence of landmines and ERW, including cluster munitions.

Cambodia adopted a Sustainable Development Goal on landmines and explosive remnants of war – SDG 18: End the negative impact of mines/ERW and promote victim assistance.

However, the Royal Government of Cambodia has a US\$406 million shortfall in its aim to achieve the eight goals outlined in the Strategy, leading to Cambodia mine-free 2025. To raise these kinds of funds requires vast momentum and coalitions to be built on a global scale.

The good news is that the UN family and the Royal Government are primed, ready and committed to begin building global awareness.

Recently, the United Nations Secretary-General António Guterres launched the five-year Safe Ground campaign (2019 – 2023) on the 4 April 2019, the International Day for Mine Awareness and Assistance in Mine Action. The purpose of the Campaign, as he stated, is to raise awareness and resources for the victims and survivors of armed conflict through the promotion of sport and of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). In Cambodia, shortly after Secretary-General announced the Campaign, the UN Country Team was hosted by the Prime Minister and his Cabinet for their annual dialogue. During the discussion, the Prime Minister called on the UN Resident Coordinator and the UN Country Team (UNCT) to support Cambodia to raise global awareness efforts to achieve the mine free vision by 2025.

To do this, the UNCT and Royal Government have agreed to launch the Safe Ground Campaign, turning minefields into playing fields by leveraging partnerships with Member States, donors, celebrities, civil society, sport federations and the private sector, to clear existing playing fields of explosive ordnances, and identify new areas that can become sports facilities. These reclaimed areas will bring communities together, to raise awareness about victims/survivors of war and act as a catalyst to raise the much-needed resources for the continued mine clearance.

The video will give a global audience insight into the continued danger of landmines in Cambodia, and the impact on local communities. It will
