	1.2 Any Proposal submitted will be regarded as an offer by the Bidder and does not constitute or imply the acceptance of the Proposal by UNDP. UNDP is under no obligation to award a contract to any Bidder as a result of this RFP.
	1.3 As part of the bid, it is desired that the Bidder registers at the United Nations Global Marketplace (UNGM) website (<u>www.ungm.org</u>). The Bidder may still submit a bid even if not registered with the UNGM. However, if the Bidder is selected for contract award, the Bidder must register on the UNGM prior to contract signature.
2. Project Title: Sustaining Peace in South Sudan – Community level peacebuilding support from the UN Peacebuilding Fund.

1. Project Background

After the signing of the Cessation of Hostilities Agreement (CoHA) in December 2017 and several rounds of high-level negotiations in the following year, the Revitalised Agreement on the Resolution of the Conflict in the Republic of South Sudan (R-ARCSS) was signed on 12 September 2018. Since then significant progress towards peacebuilding has been made with a considerable reduction in conflict-related violence throughout the country. While the 12 May 2019 deadline for the formation of the transitional government was extended by six months to 12 November, parties to the conflict continue to work towards resolving the deadlock over outstanding issues, including security arrangements and the demarcation of land and boundaries.

The peace agreement outlines general commitments made in six substantive chapters i) governance ii) security, iii) humanitarian assistance and reconstruction; iv) resources, economic and financial management; v) transitional justice, accountability, reconciliation and healing; and vi) constitutional matters. R-ARCSS provides a roadmap for the Revitalised-Transitional Government of National Unity (R-TGNOU) to govern South Sudan during the transitional period until national elections can be held in 2022 when an elected government can be established. In the meantime, implementation of the R-ARCSS will require substantial peacebuilding investments that involve international technical and financial assistance to institutions, and logistical support.

Despite the significant reduction of armed conflict, 7 million people are considered to be in need of humanitarian assistance and protection. More people than ever before are also facing 'crisis' levels of food insecurity. South Sudanese women and girls also continue to experience gender-based violence at unprecedented levels with 65% of females said to have undergone some form of physical violence in their lifetime which exacerbates inequality and prevents participation in political processes. Concerningly, there has been a considerable rise in local-level violence, including cattle-related conflicts, which have had a significant impact on civilian populations and threatens to reverse some of the gains made towards peace at the national level. Much of this violence is driven by unaddressed grievances between communities, feelings of marginalization, long-standing disputes over land and resources and a desire to recover assets lost during years of fighting.

In terms of civilian casualties, data shows that in 2018, 724 civilian casualties reported were a result of communal violence, whereas 1648 civilian casualties reported were attributed to parties to the conflict. Thus, intercommunal violence accounted for 31% of civilian casualties. Conversely, in 2019 available data (Jan-July) shows that 1112 civilian casualties were attributed to communal violence whereas 414 civilian casualties were attributed to parties to the conflict. Available data for 2019 shows that inter-communal violence accounts for 73% of reported civilian casualties which indicates a change towards a need for localized and targeted peacebuilding.

Traditional community structures including those related to justice and accountability, cultural and social norms have defined communities in South Sudan and enabled them to prevent, mediate and mitigate violence in the past and to reconcile conflicting parties when violence has occurred. As a result of civil war and protracted crisis at the national level, community structures have been weakened considerably; reducing communities' capacity to prevent, mediate and mitigate conflict leading to increased levels of violence, especially towards vulnerable populations. One way of understanding the surge in localized/communal violence contra the reduction of violence between parties to the conflict is through analysis of and support to those community structures, practice and traditions that have historically prevented violence. Instead of examining the causes of conflict, capacity building and analysis of the attitudes, institutions and structures that prevent violent conflict from erupting in the first place is an untapped, locally led and participatory approach to sustaining peace in South Sudan.

Peacebuilding efforts in South Sudan therefore work towards rebuilding community mechanisms that support peace, strengthening structures where they exist and creating new ones where they are lacking. Engendering an approach to sustaining peace at the grassroots will be critical to the full realization of peace in the country moving forward beyond the implementation of R-ARCSS.

Strategic Frameworks for Sustaining Peace and Peacebuilding in South Sudan

The twin resolutions by the Security Council (resolution 2282) and UN General Assembly (resolution 70/262) on Sustaining Peace and Peacebuilding, emphasise that peace:

- Is not merely a post-conflict priority but also encompasses prevention of violent conflict;
- Requires a comprehensive and coherent approach between and among actors and all parts of the UN system;
- Calls for inclusive national ownership and partnerships for sustaining peace.

The UN in South Sudan has integrated the twin resolutions on Peacebuilding and Sustaining Peace into its strategic planning framework, the UN Cooperation Framework (UNCF) 2019-2021 as well as the UN wide Peacebuilding Plan for South Sudan. The UNCF focuses on four main priority areas: 1) building peace and strengthening governance 2) improving food security and recovering local economies 3) strengthening social services 4) empowering women and youth.

The UN wide Peacebuilding Plan and a report called 'Mapping of Community Level Peacebuilding Mechanisms in South Sudan' have been developed and were approved in May 2018 by the South Sudan UN Senior Management Group and the UN Country Team, they now form the basis for ongoing prioritization and support to the National Development Strategy (NDS). These peacebuilding priorities are broadly aligned to the UNCF and especially priority area 1 'Building Peace and Strengthening Governance. These strategic documents form the basis of UN aligned support to sustaining peace and peacebuilding in South Sudan.

As part of the Agreement for the Resolution of Conflict in the Republic of South Sudan (August 2015), the government has developed the NDS for the period July 2018 to June 2021. The National Development Strategy will be a tool for delivering South Sudan's commitment to the Sustainable Development Goals. The overall goal of the NDS is to consolidate peace and stabilize the economy. The process of articulating the strategy involved a review of the progress with Peacebuilding and State-building goals, which had reversed to crisis levels. The Government of South Sudan determines the success of the NDS on the basis of three parameters: 1) whether people feel safe to go about their business, 2) whether people enjoy stable prices, and 3) whether people increasingly have access to basic services. The plan aims to address these issues through enhanced governance, economic, and social services institutions in the country. The NDS is therefore an important instrument to operationalize and implement the peace agreement and to guide the country's investment in national priorities. However, the implementation of the strategy requires not only the guns to fall silent but requires an enabling environment for strengthening South Sudan's pillars of peace.

Against this backdrop, South Sudan is currently eligible to apply for funding from the peacebuilding fund (PBF) under a request for eligibility made in 2012. South Sudan's current eligibility will expire in December 2019. The Government of South Sudan has requested support from the UN to prepare an application for reeligibility to apply for funding from the PBF. The UN has committed to supporting the government and will take lead in preparing the application to be submitted to PBF.

Through this request for proposals, The UN Country Team in South Sudan is planning to engage an expert to support the country team prepare key elements of the re-eligibility application for the Peacebuilding Fund. The consultant will support the Resident Coordinator's Office and the established inter-agency reference group to prepare an application for eligibility of South Sudan to the Peacebuilding Fund.

2. Objectives and Outputs

1. Peace and conflict analysis

A detailed and joined up peace and conflict analysis should be developed. The analysis should reference existing relevant analysis and reference documents such as the 2017 conflict analysis, peacebuilding plan and mapping of peacebuilding mechanisms. The peace and conflict analysis must be gender and age sensitive and provide an assessment of the peacebuilding situation, conflict factors, drivers, triggers, dynamics and actors/stakeholders, including an assessment of vulnerabilities. A validation workshop is anticipated.

2. Draft concept notes

Provide recommendations to project intervention areas in collaboration with UN agencies and an outline of four concept notes to be finalised by UN agencies funds and programmes. The concept notes will be proposed for project funding by PBF under the new eligibility. The concepts notes will be preliminary and should provide the main information on the project idea with further detail to be provided by implementing UN agencies.

3. Sustaining Peace and Positive Peace capacity building workshop.

A technical workshop on sustaining peace and positive peace will be facilitated by the expert to build capacity of project and programme managers, conflict analysts and other relevant staff on these core concepts. The technical workshop should be directly relevant to identification and formulation of peacebuilding projects, especially analytical approaches to identifying key intervention areas. The workshop should support staff working on developing projects for the peacebuilding fund.
