CONTEXT AND JUSTIFICATION

Within the Regional Program for the Arab States to Prevent and Combat Crime, Terrorism and Health Threats and Strengthen Criminal Justice Systems in line with International Human Rights Standards (2016-2021), Sub-Program 1 on "Organized Crime", UNODC is implementing the regional projects "Strengthening the Framework of the Arab Region to Prevent and Combat Human Trafficking and Migrant Smuggling", and 'Dismantling criminal networks involved in migrant smuggling and human trafficking and operating in North Africa', managed by the UNODC Regional Office for the Middle East and North Africa (ROMENA), based in Cairo.

The project 'Strengthening the Framework of the Arab Region to Prevent and Combat Human Trafficking and Migrant Smuggling' was launched in 2011 with the objective of supporting countries in the MENA region in preventing and combating human trafficking and migrant smuggling. The project is currently focusing on the following areas:

- 1) Promoting harmonized national legislative frameworks in compliance with the requirements of the Trafficking in Persons Protocol, the Smuggling of Migrants Protocol and other relevant international law.
- 2) Building skills of law enforcement practitioners, prosecutors and judges to effectively prevent and investigate human trafficking and migrant smuggling while assisting and protecting victims of human trafficking and smuggled migrants.
- 3) Supporting the development of comprehensive institutional frameworks to prevent and combat human trafficking and migrant smuggling, and to promote interagency cooperation.

The project 'Dismantling criminal networks involved in migrant smuggling and human trafficking and operating in North Africa' consists in a regional intervention covering Egypt, Libya, Morocco and Tunisia, to support the effective dismantling of criminal networks involved in migrant smuggling and human trafficking, while at the same time upholding the rights of migrants, refugees, asylum seekers and vulnerable groups. The overall objective will be achieved through:

- 4) Enhanced detection and interception capacities of frontline officers and agencies at selected border crossing points and key hub cities along smuggling routes.
- 5) Strengthened identification and investigation capacities of first responders (including law enforcement officers, healthcare professionals and social workers, labour inspectors and other relevant practitioners) with regards to migrant smuggling and human trafficking cases while protecting victims.
- 6) Enhanced skills and knowledge of relevant law enforcement agencies on special investigation techniques, allowing relevant authorities to more effectively and rapidly dismantle criminal networks.

7) Strengthened practical expertise and skills of criminal justice practitioners in prosecuting and adjudicating migrant smuggling and human trafficking cases, notably through regional and international cooperation.

JUSTIFICATION AND OBJECTIVES

This position is located at the UNODC Programme Office in Tunis, Tunisia, which falls under the oversight and management of the Regional Office for the Middle East and North Africa (ROMENA) of the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC) based in Cairo, Egypt. Under the overall guidance of the UNODC Regional Representative for the Middle East and North Africa, the consultant will work under the direct supervision of the Programme Coordinator (Anti-Human Trafficking and Migrant Smuggling), as well as in collaboration with technical experts at ROMENA, to support the implementation of selected activities of the UNODC projects "Strengthening the framework of the Arab Region to prevent and combat human trafficking and migrant smuggling" and 'Dismantling criminal networks involved in migrant smuggling and human trafficking and operating in North Africa.

RESPONSIBILITIES

The Consultant will support the team with the delivery of specific outputs of activities under the following projects: 'Strengthening the Framework of the Arab Region to Prevent and Combat Human Trafficking and Migrant Smuggling' and 'Dismantling criminal networks involved in migrant smuggling and human trafficking and operating in North Africa'. This will include:

- Substantive preparation, delivery and facilitation of national capacity building workshops for first responders and service providers from Tunisia and Libya as well as from the wider North Africa region.
- Development of training material for criminal justice practitioners, including programs and training materials, Training of Trainers' guides and mock trial manuals.
- Development of situational analysis in Tunisia and in Libya to guide project implementation, including review of legislation in relation to TIP and SOM.
- Development of a First Aid Kit for first responders on human trafficking for Tunisia.
- Development of roadmap for the promotion of regional cooperation in the North Africa region, including through the development of monitoring tools to track the status of progress and of concrete action-oriented recommendations.
- Development of visibility multimedia material to promote programme activities.
- Development of Theories of Change at regional and national levels, sustainability strategies and outcome monitoring tools for the program.

EXPECTED RESULTS

Prompt delivery of outputs that supports the smooth implementation of human trafficking and migrant smuggling activities in Tunisia and in Libya in line with UNODC's regional strategic objectives and legal and conceptual framework, leading to the provision of increased services to beneficiaries and increasing the program impact in the concerned countries.

- Concept notes, agendas, background material, situational reports, in line with the agreed upon workplan for the Consultancy.
- Legal and situational assessments in Tunisia and Libya.
