Is it possible to have a correct link for an example of what you desire on this part?</p>	<p>Indeed, the Solution Exchange website is temporary out of service. We are checking the reasons. The Solution Exchange model is based on <u>moderated</u> thematic communities of practice, which communicate mainly via a moderated e-mail group. Questions received from community members were processed by the moderator and posted for community responses (direct responses, information sources, contacts, literature, etc.), having collected the individual responses the moderator prepares a consolidated response with structured information received from members. On the on-line platform: community members are registered, questions are posted (and disseminated via e-mail group), consolidated responses are posted are stored. Search of information across consolidated responses is possible through a system of tags (by topic and by type of information). There was also a searchable library of relevant materials, documents, regulations relevant to a thematic community.
