II. BACKGROUND / RATIONALE

Ethiopia set out a strategy for building a Climate Resilient Green Economy (CRGE) in 2011. The CRGE strategy has identified a set of target sectors to foster economic growth through a carbon neutral path. These target sectors are: agriculture (crop and livestock), forestry, energy, industry, transport and buildings. Within these sectors, the CRGE has identified over 60 initiatives with at least 3 initiatives under each sector.

The health sector is one of the sectors which are not included in the CRGE Strategy since it is not a source of GHG emissions (other than through energy use, like any end-user). The recently conducted CRGE/NDC assessment recommends that future revisions and updates of the CRGE Strategy should take a holistic approach to a green and climate-compatible economy, and integrate both low-carbon development (mitigation) and climate resilience (adaptation).

The CRGE assessment also noted that in the urban (buildings and cities) sector, the CRGE strategy opted for mitigation options such as accelerating the transition to high-efficiency light bulbs for residential, commercial, and institutional buildings; adopting and enhancing landfill gas management technologies (e.g., flaring) to reduce emissions from solid waste; and reducing methane production and emissions from liquid waste. The greatest emphasis was placed on the deployment of energy efficient light bulbs, even though energy efficiency was one of the least relevant sources of abatement. The

largest contributor to the urban sector's GHG emissions was the generation and disposal of solid and liquid waste, followed by using off-grid power generators (run on diesel and kerosene). Given that solid and liquid waste were the largest sources of urban emissions and emissions growth, the CRGE strategy should have focused more on reducing waste related GHGs. The CRGE strategy's mitigation options in this sector should be updated and enhanced to include more interventions on urban and health waste management.

It is due to these limitations of NDC in the urban and health sector that updating of information and scope in these two sectors becomes a necessity. The update of information and scope in these two sectors must be done in line with the Health and Urban waste issues including a focus on urban areas and the health sectors' adaptation and mitigations plans/strategies/programs and also with the 10 years perspective and GTP III plans. The update of information and scope on waste management in urban sectors and in the health sector must be done in close consultation with the directorate and bureau responsible for coordinating climate change in those respective ministries.

Purpose

The purpose of this consultancy work is to update information and scope of NDC in the Urban and Health waste management issues. For this purpose the consultant is expected to review the CR strategies of the two sectors, ULGDP and NAMA Projects, health & other urban sector programs, international best practices on these sectors and other relevant documents.

III.Scope of Work

- To undertake mitigation and adaptation potential analyses in the health sector, identify options for enhancement and incorporate high potential mitigation and adaptation components to enhance the updated NDC
- To undertake mitigation and adaptation potential analyses in the waste sector, identify options for enhancement and incorporate the high potential mitigation and adaptation components to enhance the updated NDC
- Identify enabling Policies and national long-term mitigation and adaptation goals that incentivize cities, the waste and the health sectors to reduce emissions and promote adaptation and reflect these in the updated targets and goals to enhance the NDCs
- Assess and indicate the emission reduction and vulnerability reduction / resilience building potential and optimum contributions to emissions reductions from the health sector based on

proposed mitigation and adaptation options recommended

- Assess and indicate the emission reduction and vulnerability reduction / resilience building potential from the waste sector and urban areas based on proposed mitigation and adaptation options recommended
- To review programs and projects relevant for urban and health waste management issues and incorporate best practices during updating NDC information in the health and urban settings
