#### I. BACKGROUND

Substance/Drug Use Disorders (S/DUDs) are a public health, developmental and security problem both in industrialized and developing countries. It is associated with health problems, poverty, violence, criminal behaviour and social exclusion. Prevention and treatment of drug dependence are essential demand reduction strategies of significant public health importance. Therefore, the implementation of adequate programmes is key in ensuring an appropriate balance between the need for evidence-based prevention and treatment interventions and the need of people at risk or affected by S/DUDs.

Through its global programmes on drug dependence treatment and care, with funding support from the Government of Japan, developed a science-informed, skills-based and practical treatment training package with elements of family therapy for adolescents with S/DUDs including those in contact with or at risk in contact with the criminal justice system (Treatnet Family<sup>1</sup>), which is to be integrated with UNODC TreatNet programme<sup>2</sup>. The overall goal is to create societies resilient to drugs and crime by enhancing ties in families and systems surrounding adolescents affected by S/DUDs.

After the feasibility study conducted in North and East Jakarta with successful result, means this module can be effectively used by practitioners in community settings, and that adolescents/clients showed a significant reduction in substance use and substance-use related problems and in mental health problems through the implementation of the treatnet Family.

UNODC is planning to scale-up the Treatnet Family programme in Indonesia with online mechanism in collaboration with National Narcotics Board and Indonesian Association of Addiction Counsellors to explore its further findings for the treatment of adolescent substance use disorder.

#### Scope of Work

- Contribute to adapt Treatnet Family feasibility study protocol for new implementation round;
- Obtain local ethics approval;
- Contribute to the Treatnet Family remote training implementation;
- Ensure data collection in line with adapted study protocol and data submission in timely manner to UNODC and international PI;
- Provide supervision at selected Treatnet Family sessions conducted by trained practitioners;
- Contribute and review draft and final study report;
- Provide overall guidance, supervision and technical assistance for the Treatnet Family study
