1. Introduction	1.1	Bidders shall adhere to all the requirements of this RFP, including any amendments in writing by UNDP. 	1.2	Any Proposal submitted will be regarded as an offer by the Bidder and does not constitute or imply the acceptance of the Proposal by UNDP. UNDP is under no obligation to award a contract to any Bidder as a result of this RFP.
	1.3	As part of the bid, it is desired that the Bidder registers at the United Nations Global Marketplace (UNGM) website (<u>www.ungm.org</u>). The Bidder may still submit a bid even if not registered with the UNGM. However, if the Bidder is selected for contract award, the Bidder must register on the UNGM prior to contract signature.
2. Fraud & Corruption, Gifts and Hospitality	2.1	UNDP strictly enforces a policy of zero tolerance on proscribed practices, including fraud, corruption, collusion, unethical or unprofessional practices, and obstruction of UNDP vendors and requires all bidders/vendors observe the highest standard of ethics during the procurement process and contract implementation. UNDP shall not be responsible or liable for those costs, regardless of the conduct or outcome of the procurement process.
7. Language	7.1	The Proposal, as well as any and all related correspondence exchanged by the Bidder and UNDP, shall be written in the language (s) specified in the BDS.

	10.2 The Technical Proposal shall not include any price or financial information. A Technical Proposal containing material financial information may be declared non-responsive.
	10.3 Samples of items, when required as per Section 5, shall be provided within the time specified and unless otherwise specified by UNDP, and at no expense to UNDP
	10.4 When applicable and required as per Section 5, the Bidder shall describe the necessary training programme available for the maintenance and operation of the services and/or equipment offered as well as the cost to the UNDP. Unless otherwise specified, such training as well as training materials shall be provided in the language of the Bid as specified in the BDS.
11. Financial Proposals	11.1 The Financial Proposal shall be prepared using the Standard Form provided in Section 6 of the RFP. It shall list all major cost components associated with the services, and the detailed breakdown of such costs.
	11.2 Any output and activities described in the Technical Proposal but not priced in the Financial Proposal, shall be assumed to be included in the prices of other activities or items, as well as in the final total price.
	11.3 Prices and other financial information must not be disclosed in any other place except in the financial proposal.

26. Confidentiality	26.1	Information relating to the examination, evaluation, and comparison of Proposals, and the recommendation of contract award, shall not be disclosed to Bidders or any other persons not officially concerned with such process, even after publication of the contract award.
	26.2	Any effort by a Bidder or anyone on behalf of the Bidder to influence UNDP in the examination, evaluation and comparison of the Proposals or contract award decisions may, at UNDP's decision, result in the rejection of its Proposal and may be subject to the application of prevailing UNDP's vendor sanctions procedures.
27. Evaluation of Proposals	27.1	The Bidder is not permitted to alter or modify its Proposal in any way after the proposal submission deadline except as permitted under Clause 24 of this RFP. UNDP will conduct the evaluation solely on the basis of the submitted Technical and Financial Proposals.

Preliminary Examination	28.1	UNDP shall examine the Proposals to determine whether they are complete with respect to minimum documentary requirements, whether the documents have been properly signed, and whether the Proposals are generally in order, among other indicators that may be used at this stage. UNDP reserves the right to reject any Proposal at this stage.
29. Evaluation of Eligibility and Qualification	29.1	Eligibility and Qualification of the Bidder will be evaluated against the Minimum Eligibility/Qualification requirements specified in the Section 4 (Evaluation Criteria).
	29.2	 In general terms, vendors that meet the following criteria may be considered qualified: a) They are not included in the UN Security Council 1267/1989 Committee's list of terrorists and terrorist financiers, and in UNDP's ineligible vendors' list; b) They have a good financial standing and have access to adequate financial

	 resources to perform the contract and all existing commercial commitments, c) They have the necessary similar experience, technical expertise, production capacity where applicable, quality certifications, quality assurance procedures and other resources applicable to the provision of the services required; d) They are able to comply fully with UNDP General Terms and Conditions of Contract; e) They do not have a consistent history of court/arbitral award decisions against the Bidder; and f) They have a record of timely and satisfactory performance with their clients.
30. Evaluation of Technical and Financial Proposals	 30.1 The evaluation team shall review and evaluate the Technical Proposals on the basis of their responsiveness to the Terms of Reference and other RFP documents, applying the evaluation criteria, sub-criteria, and point system specified in the Section 4 (Evaluation Criteria). A Proposal shall be rendered non-responsive at the technical evaluation stage if it fails to achieve the minimum technical score indicated in the BDS. When necessary and if stated in the BDS, UNDP may invite technically responsive bidders for a presentation related to their technical proposals. The conditions for the presentation shall be provided in the bid document where required. 30.2 In the second stage, only the Financial Proposals of those Bidders who achieve the minimum technical score will be opened for evaluation. The Financial
	Proposals corresponding to Technical Proposals that were rendered non- responsive shall remain unopened, and, in the case of manual submission, be returned to the Bidder unopened. For emailed Proposals and e-tendering submissions, UNDP will not request for the password of the Financial Proposals of bidders whose Technical Proposal were found not responsive.
	30.3 The evaluation method that applies for this RFP shall be as indicated in the BDS, which may be either of two (2) possible methods, as follows: (a) the lowest priced method which selects the lowest evaluated financial proposal of the technically responsive Bidders; or (b) the combined scoring method which will be based on a combination of the technical and financial score.

	Combined Score = (TP Rating) x (Weight of TP, e.g. 70%) + (FP Rating) x (Weight of FP, e.g., 30%)
31. In the First Stage, the technical proposal is evaluated on the basis of its responsiveness to the Terms of Reference (TOR) and as per below Evaluation Criteria.

In the Second Stage, the price proposals of all offerors, who have attained minimum 70% score in the technical evaluation, will be reviewed.

1. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Human Rights for Ukraine Project (2019-2023) is funded by the Danish Ministry of Foreign Affairs and implemented by UNDP in cooperation with the Ukrainian Parliament Commissioner for Human Rights. The Project's overall goal is to promote human rights through strengthening capacities of the national actors effectively promote, protect and observe human rights and integrate HRBA into the national and local policies all over Ukraine including conflict area.

Among project objectives are:

- Building the capacities of duty-bearers, to provide effective inputs into integration of a human rights-based approach into the decentralization process, with a focus on social and economic rights;
- Reaching out to men and women across Ukraine, including remote communities, to empower them to exercise their rights
- Promotion of human rights values, tolerance, and respect to ensure that everyone ensuring that the gender, age, vulnerability dimensions are integrated in decision making process

Promotion of the inclusive, free of stereotypes society is one of the key objectives for the Human Rights for Ukraine project. In 2018, the Human Rights for Ukraine project supported the All-Ukrainian Sociological Study to identify what Ukrainians know and think about human rights.

As the research showed, the value of tolerance is only important to every fourth Ukrainian. The readiness of the population to restrict the rights of vulnerable populations remains quite substantial, and is almost unchanged over the past two years. As many as 66 per cent of respondents believe that the rights of persons with drug addictions can be restricted, 56 per cent justify restricting the rights of former convicts, and 51 per cent are ready to restrict the rights of people with unpopular political views. Intolerance of the Roma and LGBT communities is also high (47 per cent each). In addition, Ukrainians tend to be negative or cautious about accepting refugees from other countries, with 28 per cent of respondents clearly opposed and 31 per cent undecided.

Meanwhile, perceptions of discrimination are quite widespread in Ukrainian society, with 55 per cent of respondents believing that it exists. According to the respondents, the most common reasons for discrimination are age (40 per cent), disability (32 per cent), sexual orientation (24 per cent), health status (25 per cent) and sex (25 per cent). Also, every fifth respondent believes that discrimination occurs in Ukraine on the basis of political views and property status.

The educational courses on inclusiveness will help to promote human rights values among Ukrainians, raise their knowledge on inclusiveness, and promote human rights based approach at local and national level.

2. MAIN OBJECTIVES OF THE ASSIGNMENT

The overall objective of this assignment is to create two training video courses on inclusiveness to enhance the capacity and knowledge of: 1) civil servants, 2) Ukrainian citizens.

For this purpose, the Contractor shall develop:

- 1) A training course on inclusiveness for Ukrainian citizens. The course title is "What everyone should know about inclusiveness"
- What is the inclusiveness/non-inclusiveness
- Basic principles of inclusiveness
- Who can promote inclusiveness?
- Inclusiveness in education, at work, city spaces, and services provision
- The culture of inclusiveness
- What do we know about the inclusiveness and how do we perceive it?
- Stereotypes
- What everyone can do to make our society inclusive?

4. SPECIFICATIONS, FEATURES AND EXPECTED RESULTS

4.1. Development of training programmes

The contractor should convert the content developed by the human rights experts into the scenario, organize and conduct testing of the scenario and piloting series with at least two focus-groups with

experts and representatives of the target audience. Each educational series should include the following parts and follow the following requirements:

- The course should be in Ukrainian language and the contractor should check that all speakers can speak Ukrainian language fluently and it looks and sounds good
- All the videos should be produced in three variants: 1) basic version in Ukrainian language,
 2) the version with the sign language interpretation and subtitles, 3) the version with the audio description
- Each video should be up to 10 minutes, recommended time 6-7 minutes
- The educational courses should be developed in the format of a dialogue
- It should be written in a simple language easy to understand for everyone
- In the course "Inclusive State" each video will be followed up by 3-5 questions, and there will be a final test with up to 15 questions different from the questions following each video

 the contractor needs to place all the questions at the educational course;
- The tests will be in Ukrainian in Word format with "yes/no" questions, multiple choice questions etc.
- The course should be in line with other educational series on the platform "Dia. Digital education" https://osvita.diia.gov.ua/.

Additional materials. Materials for self-study should be prepared for each section. This can include both

4.2. Production of training video content
