#### I. BACKGROUND

The National Agency for Disaster Management (BNPB) recorded 1.958 total disaster events in 2020 which caused 292 deaths and missing and 3.892.372 million people displaced. The challenges of handling disaster emergencies in Indonesia will continue as a consequence of the country's geographical and geological conditions, various environmental problems, climate change, population density with uneven distribution, uncontrolled utilization of natural resources, and uneven distribution of financial resources. Realizing that partnership is key in dealing with disaster management challenges, BNPB is emphasizing its works on building synergy of government, civil society and private sector (or in the new term of BNPB: Pentahelix which consists of government, civil society, academician, media, and private sector). One of the focus areas of the draft *Rencana Induk Penanggulangan Bencana/RIPB* (Indonesia's disaster management master plan) 2015-2045 is the investment needs especially in disaster risk reduction which are jointly supported by the government and other development partners of business community and wider society.

For business, crises such as natural disasters and conflicts can disrupt operations and supply chains, destabilize markets and suppress most areas of formal economic activity. The way businesses prepare for, respond to and recover from humanitarian crises has a strong influence on both the short and long-term impact of crises on business operations and the communities where they operate. In fact, private sector is a major contributor to humanitarian action: local businesses as well as national and multinational companies possess critical skills and resources that can be leveraged to facilitate a more effective humanitarian response

The private sector in Indonesia plays an increasingly active role in supporting emergency preparedness and response. For COVID-19 response, from March to August 2020 alone, private sector contributed up to Rp. 2,634,478,323,330 or equivalent to USD 187,240,819<sup>1</sup>. Their contributions were provided for health, education, food security, WASH (water, sanitation, and hygiene), economy, and multi-purpose cash and voucher assistance. So far, their supports seem to be scattered, individual based on their respective area of works and interest, with no clear understanding of a bigger picture of building resilience of the community towards disasters and the approach for coordination among them.

Connecting Business initiative (CBi), a global joint initiative between UNDP-OCHA is to enhance private sector engagement in disaster management. CBi is now expanding its initiative in Indonesia and finding a private entity to be the CBi network host in Indonesia.

## **Objectives of Assignment**

To provide a comprehensive landscape and analysis of data and information related to private sector's contributions to disaster management supporting the establishment of CBi network in Indonesia.

#### II. SCOPE OF WORK, ACTIVITIES AND DELIVERABLE

Under the overall leadership of the Directorate of Spatial Planning and Disaster Management of Bappenas, the consultant will work closely with the Directorate of Spatial Planning and Disaster Management of Bappenas and be jointly supervised by UNDP-UNOCHA and CBi as stated in the deliverable table below.

The consultant is to conduct the following tasks but not limited to:

1. Information Management Support for Disaster Risk Management (70% of

- Support the design, development and management of databases, spreadsheets and other data tools that are needed in the previously developed Private Sector COVID-19 Contribution Dashboard;
- Provide data and information management support for the Private Sector COVID-19 Contribution Dashboard, including data update and verification of quantitative and qualitative data;
- Identify and integrate additional primary and secondary data sources into information management databases required by evolving needs to support disaster risk analysis by the CBi prospective network and other private sector networks;
- Develop interactive and user-friendly Tableau-based dashboard/s that support private sector risk tracking and analysis based on available data;
- Hazard monitoring, collection, processing, analysis and dissemination of disaster risk reduction information to support the CBi prospective network and other relevant private sector actors in coordinating humanitarian actions;
- Produce and update information products such as maps, charts, and infographics that will help disseminate information and good practices of private sector efforts before, during and after emergencies.
- Produce final draft of the expected deliverables taking inputs and feedbacks from the key stakeholders
- 2. Network Support (30% of the consultancy time)
  - In close coordination with the Local Network Engagement Consultant, design and conduct activities to strengthen the CBi prospective network's preparedness and technical capacity to respond to humanitarian emergencies.
  - To work closely with the Directorate of Spatial Planning and Disaster Management of Bappenas regarding data and information
  - In addition to Bappenas, the consultant will establish close communication with but not limited to BNPB, Ministry of Cooperatives, Ministry of Stateowned Enterprises, Ministry of Social Affairs, Ministry of Home Affairs, etc.
  - Aside from the key stakeholders from Government institutions, the consultant will establish close communication with private sector, media, and academia.
  - Conduct interviews/meetings/discussions with relevant stakeholders particularly from relevant government institutions, business associations/forums, etc., and UNDP-UNOCHA-UNICEF
  - Establish good transparent and pro-active communication and coordination with UNDP-UNOCHA-UNICEF

Performs other related duties as may be assigned by the CBi's Local Network Coordination Specialist, UNDP Technical Analyst and OCHA Humanitarian Affairs Analyst.

All deliverables are submitted to and reviewed by Humanitarian Affairs Analyst, UNOCHA and Technical Analyst UNDP, and approved for payments by CBi's Local Network Coordination Specialist.
