I. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

COVID-19 socio-economic impact is heavy, multi-sectorial, long lasting. It not only impacts human health and lives but places a risk on the macro-stability of the economy; impacts economic and social sectors, enterprises (eg, small and medium size ones, which account for 90% of the economic tissue), and has severe impact on the informal sector. The immediate and longer-term impact will also be felt by informal workers-many of them women who account for 57% of the total workforce in Indonesia. The impact will be even stronger on the poor and the vulnerable, including the estimated 40 per cent of the population amounting to about 180 million people living just above the national poverty line and vulnerable to external shocks. Women, especially female-headed households and women working in the large informal economy, day laborers and people with disabilities who are also facing multiple challenges in Indonesia, will be the worst affected. COVID-19 already placed a heavy strain on the national health system and health structures at all levels; health workers lack financial and other incentives, and closure of essential health services delivery.

Given the expected magnitude of the epidemic in a large archipelagic country with a very large population and based on the need assessment made by the Government, UNDP support will have a crucial role in cushioning the impact of the epidemic and in safeguarding the progress of the SDGs, particularly for the poor and the most vulnerable. UNDP will support with immediate and longer-term response to the COVID-19 Pandemics, which is **human development centered and multi-sectoral**, as implied by UNDP's broad development mandate. UNDP's immediate response to COVID-19 is organized in 4 main streams:

1. Immediate strengthening of health systems and health governance and building of their longer-term resilience.
2. Direct support to an inclusive and "whole of society" response for prevention and mitigation at central and local levels.
3. Addressing the socio-economic impacts of COVID-19 to protect the Indonesian people and safeguard progress towards the Sustainable Development Goals.
4. Utilizing digital solutions and big data analysis for enhanced national response.

As part of UNDP support to stream no. 2, the project will support sub-national governments in multi-sectoral coordination for COVID-19 crisis management. For that purposes, the project intends to employ a team of consultants that provides support to provincial authorities to assess and formulate Contingency Plan specifically for pandemic disaster at the selected provinces.

II. SCOPE OF WORK, RESPONSIBILITIES AND DELIVERABLES

The **Consultants for Contingency Plan Formulation (Data Collection)**, will work under the supervision of National Project Manager and will deliver the output through an extensive consultation with all project partners, including government and other related agencies, and working closely with the PMU. Below is the consultant following works:

- Assess the existing contingency plan and Disaster Management related available.
- widely consult with the relevant stakeholders and review existing documents related to prepare the document.
- have to coordinate data/information collection, literature review, and consultations with all relevant agencies at both national and sub-national level.
- In close cooperation with project partners and counterparts, assist in the implementation of project strategies and work-plans for activities under RESTORE program.
- Develop and present a detailed methodology and work plan for the assignment.
- Consult and coordinate inputs from the relevant stakeholders.
- Coordinate consultations with stakeholders and obtain technical inputs.
- Ensure synergy and linkage of the plan with overall sector's legislation, policies, goals and objectives for realistic implementation.
- Organize joint planning meetings involving relevant parties with regard to the work plan of the assignment.
- Liaise and coordinate with other RESTORE team including with partner team dedicated staff to optimise synergy and delivery.

- Full compliance with UN/UNDP rules, regulations, and policies of financial activities, financial recording/reporting system and follow-up on audit recommendations; implementation of effective internal controls, proper functioning of a client-oriented financial resources management system;

III. WORKING ARRANGEMENTS

Institutional Arrangement
