Your Proposal must be expressed in the English, and valid for a minimum period of 120 days

In the course of preparing your Proposal, it shall remain your responsibility to ensure that it reaches the address above on or before the deadline. Proposals that are received by UNDP after the deadline indicated above, for whatever reason, shall not be considered for evaluation. If you are submitting your Proposal by email, kindly ensure that they are signed and in the .pdf format, and free from any virus or corrupted files.

Services proposed shall be reviewed and evaluated based on completeness and compliance of the Proposal and responsiveness with the requirements of the RFP and all other annexes providing details of UNDP requirements.

The Proposal that complies with all of the requirements, meets all the evaluation criteria and offers the best value for money shall be selected and awarded the contract. Any offer that does not meet the requirements shall be rejected.

Any discrepancy between the unit price and the total price shall be re-computed by UNDP, and the unit price shall prevail, and the total price shall be corrected. If the Service Provider does not accept the final price based on UNDP's re-computation and correction of errors, its Proposal will be rejected.

No price variation due to escalation, inflation, fluctuation in exchange rates, or any other market factors shall be accepted by UNDP after it has received the Proposal. At the time of Award of Contract or Purchase Order, UNDP reserves the right to vary (increase or decrease) the quantity of services and/or goods, by up to a maximum twenty-five per cent (25%) of the total offer, without any change in the unit price or other terms and conditions.

Any Contract or Purchase Order that will be issued as a result of this RFP shall be subject to the General Terms and Conditions attached hereto. Annex 2. Terms of Reference

Project Description

The Spotlight Initiative is aimed at deploying targeted, large-scale investments to improve the rights of women and girls, helping them to live lives free of violence. The Spotlight Initiative will support the elimination of specific forms of violence and address other forms of violence against women & girls (VAWG) through strengthening national and sub-national systems and institutions plans and funds to deliver evidence- based programmes that respond to violence against women and girls, including family violence.

A key objective of the Spotlight Initiative is to equip relevant government authorities at national and sub-national levels with better knowledge and capacity to deliver quality and coordinated essential services, including sexual & reproductive health (SRH) services and access to justice, to women and girls' survivors of VAWG.

The Jamaica Constabulary Force (JCF) currently offers limited services to survivors of VAWG, however, data shows police stations are a first point of contact for victims when seeking support. The establishment of Domestic Violence Intervention Centres is a direct response and intervention strategy to strengthen the JCF's ability to respond and support victims of family and domestic violence. These centres achieve the objective of delivering quality and essential services to survivors of VAWG.

This activity falls under Pillar 4 and is designed to fulfill the immediate outcome of:

"Relevant government authorities and women's rights organisations at national and subnational levels have better knowledge and capacity to deliver quality and coordinated essential services, including SRH services and access to justice, to women and girls' survivors of violence(and their families when relevant), especially those facing multiple and intersecting forms of discrimination".

Objective:

To acquire 6 retrofitted containers for use as Domestic Violence Intervention Centres for use by the Jamaica Constabulary Force (Ministry of Justice), its departments and agencies with a view to improving equitable access to essential services and access to justice by victims of VAWG.

Purpose:

The Spotlight Initiative funded by the European Union seeks to equip relevant government authorities at national and sub-national levels with better knowledge and capacity to deliver quality and coordinated essential services, including SRH services and access to justice, to women and girls' survivors of VAWG.

Immediate Outcome 3: Increased delivery of quality and essential services to survivors of VAWG.

The units will provide survivors of VAWG with access to essential support services provided by the Jamaica Constabulary Force. Services will include access to justice, SRH services, counselling and referral pathways. The units will be strategically placed at police stations across the island for women to readily access these services in their respective parishes.

Retrofitting Specifications:

Reception Area

The layout shall include a waiting area that can accommodate:

- A Receptionist's seat and desk/table
- A minimum of 3 seats for waiting clients
- At minimum two electrical outlet(s) and internet port(s)
- One filing cabinet
- One mini refrigerator
- One AC vent
- One fire extinguisher

Interview and Counselling Room

There shall be one partitioned office to be used for interviews, counselling or other related services. Each of these offices shall be able to accommodate:

- An Officer's seat and desk/table (for use by police officers, counsellors, case workers and any other related personnel)
- A minimum of four seats for clients
- LED roof lighting within proximity of the desk/table
- Integrated sound-proofing on walls and doors for auditory privacy
- Tinting on each window for visual privacy
- One AC vent

Wheelchair Access

Each unit shall be fully accessible to a client in a wheelchair and stairs should be suitable for use by the differently-abled. The following fixtures and fittings shall therefore be included in the layout of the bus:

Wheel chair access to all rooms. This will require attention to the size and angle of
entryways as well as the creation of space within all rooms to accommodate a client
seated in his or her own wheelchair.

Mandatory Contractual Requirements:

In addition to meeting the specifications outlined above, each Bidder shall provide or produce the following within the bid documents:

- A Warranty covering the container and all fixtures and fittings for a minimum period of 1 year, with the possibility of an extension/renewal;
- Each bid shall be accompanied by detailed descriptions of the interior of each bus, including drawings and dimensions (using metric measurements) for the retrofitted spaces;
- Bidders will confirm that the electrical system used in the bus can adequately accommodate the potential load from multiple outlets, refrigerator and the use of the Air Conditioning for long periods. This should include best practice options for batteries, invertors, alternators and other electrical components in the engine and/or interior of the bus. The bid shall include a description of the provisions that the bidder will make for accommodating the increased electrical load and requirements.
- Bidders must confirm the accessibility of all parts through their local dealership.
