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SECTION 2. INSTRUCTION TO BIDDERS

GENERAL PROVISIONS		
1. Introduction	1.1	Bidders shall adhere to all the requirements of this RFP, including any amendments in writing by UNDP. This RFP is conducted in accordance with the UNDP Programme and Operations Policies and Procedures (POPP) on Contracts and Procurement which can be accessed at https://popp.undp.org/SitePages/POPPBSUnit.aspx?TermID=254a9f96-b883-476a-8ef8-e81f93a2b38d Any Proposal submitted will be regarded as an offer by the Bidder and does not constitute or imply the acceptance of the Proposal by UNDP. UNDP is under no obligation to award a contract to any Bidder as a result of this RFP. As part of the bid, it is desired that the Bidder registers at the United Nations Global Marketplace (UNGM) website (www.ungm.org). The Bidder may still submit a bid even if not registered with the UNGM. However, if the Bidder is selected for contract award, the Bidder must register on the UNGM prior to contract signature.
2. Fraud & Corruption, Gifts and Hospitality	2.1	UNDP strictly enforces a policy of zero tolerance on proscribed practices, including fraud, corruption, collusion, unethical or unprofessional practices, and obstruction of UNDP vendors and requires all bidders/vendors observe the highest standard of ethics during the procurement process and contract implementation. 	2.2	Bidders/vendors shall not offer gifts or hospitality of any kind to UNDP staff members including recreational trips to sporting or cultural events, theme parks or offers of holidays, transportation, or invitations to extravagant lunches or dinners.
	2.3	In pursuance of this policy, UNDP (a) Shall reject a proposal if it determines that the selected bidder has engaged in any corrupt or fraudulent practices in competing for the contract in question; (b) Shall declare a vendor ineligible, either indefinitely or for a stated period of time, to be awarded a contract if at any time it determines that the vendor has engaged in any corrupt or fraudulent practices in competing for, or in executing a UNDP contract.

3. Eligibility	3.1	A vendor should not be suspended, debarred, or otherwise identified as ineligible by any UN Organisation or the World Bank Group or any other international Organisation. Vendors are therefore required to disclose to UNDP whether they are subject to any sanction or temporary suspension imposed by these organisations.
	3.2	It is the Bidder's responsibility to ensure that its employees, joint venture members, sub-contractors, service providers, suppliers and/or their employees meet the eligibility requirements as established by UNDP.

4. Conflict of Interests

- 4.1 Bidders must strictly avoid conflicts with other assignments or their own interests, and act without consideration for future work. Bidders found to have a conflict of interest shall be disqualified. Without limitation on the generality of the above, Bidders, and any of their affiliates, shall be considered to have a conflict of interest with one or more parties in this solicitation process, if they:
 - a) Are or have been associated in the past, with a firm or any of its affiliates which have been engaged by UNDP to provide services for the preparation of the design, specifications, Terms of Reference, cost analysis/estimation, and other documents to be used for the procurement of the goods and services in this selection process;
 - b) Were involved in the preparation and/or design of the programme/project related to the services requested under this RFP; or
 - c) Are found to be in conflict for any other reason, as may be established by, or at the discretion of UNDP.
- In the event of any uncertainty in the interpretation of a potential conflict of interest, Bidders must disclose to UNDP, and seek UNDP's confirmation on whether such a conflict exists.
- 4.3 Similarly, the Bidders must disclose in their proposal their knowledge of the following:
 - a) If the owners, part-owners, officers, directors, controlling shareholders, of the bidding entity or key personnel are family members of UNDP staff involved in the procurement functions and/or the Government of the country or any Implementing Partner receiving services under this RFP; and
 - b) All other circumstances that could potentially lead to actual or perceived conflict of interest, collusion or unfair competition practices.

Failure to disclose such an information may result in the rejection of the proposal or proposals affected by the non-disclosure.

4.4 The eligibility of Bidders that are wholly or partly owned by the Government shall be subject to UNDP's further evaluation and review of various factors such as being registered, operated and managed as an independent business entity, the extent of Government ownership/share, receipt of subsidies, mandate and access to information in relation to this RFP, among others. Conditions that may lead to undue advantage against other Bidders may result in the eventual rejection of the Proposal.

PREPARATION OF PROPOSALS

5. **General Considerations**

- In preparing the Proposal, the Bidder is expected to examine the RFP in detail. Material deficiencies in providing the information requested in the RFP may result in rejection of the Proposal.
- 5.2 The Bidder will not be permitted to take advantage of any errors or omissions in the RFP. Should such errors or omissions be discovered, the Bidder must notify the UNDP

6. Cost of Preparation of Proposal

6.1 The Bidder shall bear any and all costs related to the preparation and/or submission of the Proposal, regardless of whether its Proposal was selected or not. UNDP shall not be responsible or liable for those costs, regardless of the conduct or outcome of the procurement process.

7. Language

7.1 The Proposal, as well as any and all related correspondence exchanged by

		the Bidder and UNDP, shall be written in the language (s) specified in the BDS.
8. Documents Comprising the Proposal	8.1	 The Proposal shall comprise of the following documents: a) Documents Establishing the Eligibility and Qualifications of the Bidder; b) Technical Proposal; c) Financial Proposal; d) Proposal Security, if required by BDS; e) Any attachments and/or appendices to the Proposal.
9. Documents Establishing the Eligibility and Qualifications of the Bidder		The Bidder shall furnish documentary evidence of its status as an eligible and qualified vendor, using the Forms provided under Section 6 and providing documents required in those forms. In order to award a contract to a Bidder, its qualifications must be documented to UNDP's satisfaction.
10. Technical Proposal Format and	10.1	The Bidder is required to submit a Technical Proposal using the Standard Forms and templates provided in Section 6 of the RFP.
Content	10.2	The Technical Proposal shall not include any price or financial information. A Technical Proposal containing material financial information may be declared non-responsive.
	10.3	Samples of items, when required as per Section 5, shall be provided within the time specified and unless otherwise specified by UNDP, and at no expense to UNDP
	10.4	When applicable and required as per Section 5, the Bidder shall describe the necessary training programme available for the maintenance and operation of the services and/or equipment offered as well as the cost to the UNDP. Unless otherwise specified, such training as well as training materials shall be provided in the language of the Bid as specified in the BDS.
11. Financial Proposals	11.1	The Financial Proposal shall be prepared using the Standard Form provided in Section 6 of the RFP. It shall list all major cost components associated with the services, and the detailed breakdown of such costs.
	11.2	Any output and activities described in the Technical Proposal but not priced in the Financial Proposal, shall be assumed to be included in the prices of other activities or items, as well as in the final total price.
	11.3	Prices and other financial information must not be disclosed in any other place except in the financial proposal.
12. Proposal Security	12.1	A Proposal Security, if required by BDS, shall be provided in the amount and form indicated in the BDS. The Proposal Security shall be valid up to thirty (30) days after the final date of validity of the Proposal.
	12.2	The Proposal Security shall be included along with the Technical Proposal. If Proposal Security is required by the RFP but is not found along with the Technical Proposal, the Proposal shall be rejected.
	12.3	If the Proposal Security amount or its validity period is found to be less than what is required by UNDP, UNDP shall reject the Proposal.

- 12.4 In the event an electronic submission is allowed in the BDS, Bidders shall include a copy of the Bid Security in their proposal and the original of the Proposal Security must be sent via courier or hand delivery as per the instructions in BDS. The Proposal Security may be forfeited by UNDP, and the Proposal rejected, in the event of any one or combination, of the following conditions: a) If the Bidder withdraws its offer during the period of the Proposal Validity specified in the BDS, or; b) In the event if the successful Bidder fails: i. to sign the Contract after UNDP has issued an award; or 12.6 to furnish the Performance Security, insurances, or other documents that UNDP may require as a condition precedent to the effectivity of the contract that may be awarded to the Bidder. All prices shall be quoted in the currency or currencies indicated in the BDS. 13. Currencies Where Proposals are quoted in different currencies, for the purposes of comparison of all Proposals: a) UNDP will convert the currency quoted in the Proposal into the UNDP preferred currency, in accordance with the prevailing UN operational rate of exchange on the last day of submission of Proposals; and b) In the event that UNDP selects a proposal for award that is quoted in a currency different from the preferred currency in the BDS, UNDP shall reserve the right to award the contract in the currency of UNDP's preference, using the conversion method specified above. If the Bidder is a group of legal entities that will form or have formed a Joint 14. Joint Venture, Venture (JV), Consortium or Association for the Proposal, they shall confirm **Consortium or** in their Proposal that: (i) they have designated one party to act as a lead **Association** entity, duly vested with authority to legally bind the members of the JV, Consortium or Association jointly and severally, which shall be evidenced by a duly notarized Agreement among the legal entities, and submitted with the Proposal; and (ii) if they are awarded the contract, the contract shall be entered into, by and between UNDP and the designated lead entity, who shall be acting for and on behalf of all the member entities comprising the joint venture.
 - 14.2 After the Deadline for Submission of Proposal, the lead entity identified to represent the JV, Consortium or Association shall not be altered without the prior written consent of UNDP.
 - 14.3 The lead entity and the member entities of the JV, Consortium or Association shall abide by the provisions of Clause 9 herein in respect of submitting only one proposal.
 - 14.4 The description of the organisation of the JV, Consortium or Association must clearly define the expected role of each of the entity in the joint venture in delivering the requirements of the RFP, both in the Proposal and the JV, Consortium or Association Agreement. All entities that comprise the JV, Consortium or Association shall be subject to the eligibility and qualification assessment by UNDP.
 - 14.5 A JV, Consortium or Association in presenting its track record and experience should clearly differentiate between:

a) Those that were undertaken together by the JV, Consortium or Association; and b) Those that were undertaken by the individual entities of the JV, Consortium or Association. 14.6 Previous contracts completed by individual experts working privately but who are permanently or were temporarily associated with any of the member firms cannot be claimed as the experience of the JV, Consortium or Association or those of its members, but should only be claimed by the individual experts themselves in their presentation of their individual credentials. 14.7 JV, Consortium or Associations are encouraged for high value, multisectoral requirements when the spectrum of expertise and resources required may not be available within one firm. The Bidder (including the individual members of any Joint Venture) shall 15. Only One Proposal 15.1 submit only one Proposal, either in its own name or as part of a Joint Venture. 15.2 Proposals submitted by two (2) or more Bidders shall all be rejected if they are found to have any of the following: a) they have at least one controlling partner, director or shareholder in common; or b) any one of them receive or have received any direct or indirect subsidy from the other/s; or c) they have the same legal representative for purposes of this RFP; or d) they have a relationship with each other, directly or through common third parties, that puts them in a position to have access to information about, or influence on the Proposal of, another Bidder regarding this RFP process; e) they are subcontractors to each other's Proposal, or a subcontractor to one Proposal also submits another Proposal under its name as lead Bidder; or some key personnel proposed to be in the team of one Bidder participates in more than one Proposal received for this RFP process. This condition relating to the personnel, does not apply to subcontractors being included in more than one Proposal. 16.1 Proposals shall remain valid for the period specified in the BDS, 16. Proposal Validity commencing on the Deadline for Submission of Proposals. A Proposal valid Period for a shorter period may be rejected by UNDP and rendered nonresponsive. 18.Clarification of Proposal	18.1	Bidders may request clarifications on any of the RFP documents no later than the date indicated in the BDS. Any request for clarification must be sent in writing in the manner indicated in the BDS. If inquiries are sent other than specified channel, even if they are sent to a UNDP staff member, UNDP shall have no obligation to respond or confirm that the query was officially received.
	18.2	UNDP will provide the responses to clarifications through the method specified in the BDS.
	18.3	UNDP shall endeavour to provide responses to clarifications in an expeditious manner, but any delay in such response shall not cause an obligation on the part of UNDP to extend the submission date of the Proposals, unless UNDP deems that such an extension is justified and necessary.

21.Pre-Bid Conference	21.1	When appropriate, a Bidder's conference will be conducted at the date, time and location specified in the BDS. All Bidders are encouraged to attend. Non-attendance, however, shall not result in disqualification of an interested Bidder. Minutes of the Bidder's conference will be disseminated on the procurement website and shared by email or on the e-Tendering platform as specified in the BDS. No verbal statement made during the conference shall modify the terms and conditions of the RFP, unless specifically incorporated in the Minutes of the Bidder's Conference or issued/posted as an amendment to RFP.

The Bidder shall submit a duly signed and complete Proposal comprising 22. Submission the documents and forms in accordance with the requirements in the BDS. The submission shall be in the manner specified in the BDS. 22.2 The Proposal shall be signed by the Bidder or person(s) duly authorized to commit the Bidder. The authorization shall be communicated through a document evidencing such authorization issued by the legal representative of the bidding entity, or a Power of Attorney, accompanying the Proposal. 22.3 Bidders must be aware that the mere act of submission of a Proposal, in and of itself, implies that the Bidder fully accepts the UNDP General Contract Terms and Conditions. Hard copy (manual) Hard copy (manual) submission by courier or hand delivery allowed or submission specified in the BDS shall be governed as follows: g) The signed Proposal shall be marked "Original", and its copies marked "Copy" as appropriate. The number of copies is indicated in the BDS. All copies shall be made from the signed original only. - Complete Proposals must be received by UNDP in the manner, and no later than the date and time, specified in the BDS. UNDP shall only recognize the date and time that the bid was received by UNDP
- 23.2 UNDP shall not consider any Proposal that is submitted after the deadline for the submission of Proposals.

24. Withdrawal, Substitution, and Modification of Proposals

- A Bidder may withdraw, substitute or modify its Proposal after it has been submitted at any time prior to the deadline for submission.
- 24.2 Manual and Email submissions: A bidder may withdraw, substitute or modify its Proposal by sending a written notice to UNDP, duly signed by an authorized representative, and shall include a copy of the authorization (or a Power of Attorney). The corresponding substitution or modification of the Proposal, if any, must accompany the respective written notice. All notices must be submitted in the same manner as specified for submission of proposals, by clearly marking them as "WITHDRAWAL" "SUBSTITUTION," or "MODIFICATION"
- 24.3 eTendering: A Bidder may withdraw, substitute or modify its Proposal by Canceling, Editing, and re-submitting the proposal directly in the system. It is the responsibility of the Bidder to properly follow the system instructions, duly edit and submit a substitution or modification of the Proposal as needed. There is no public bid opening for RFPs. UNDP shall open the Proposals in 25. Proposal Opening 25.1 the presence of an ad-hoc committee formed by UNDP, consisting of at least two (2) members. In the case of e-Tendering submission, bidders will receive an automatic notification once their proposal is opened. **EVALUATION OF PROPOSALS** 26. Confidentiality Information relating to the examination, evaluation, and comparison of Proposals, and the recommendation of contract award, shall not be disclosed to Bidders or any other persons not officially concerned with such process, even after publication of the contract award. 26.2 Any effort by a Bidder or anyone on behalf of the Bidder to influence UNDP in the examination, evaluation and comparison of the Proposals or contract award decisions may, at UNDP's decision, result in the rejection of its Proposal and may be subject to the application of prevailing UNDP's vendor sanctions procedures. Preliminary UNDP shall examine the Proposals to determine whether they are complete **Examination** with respect to minimum documentary requirements, whether the documents have been properly signed, and whether the Proposals are generally in order, among other indicators that may be used at this stage. UNDP reserves the right to reject any Proposal at this stage. Eligibility and Qualification of the Bidder will be evaluated against the 29. Evaluation of **Eligibility and** Minimum Eligibility/Qualification requirements specified in the Section 4 Qualification (Evaluation Criteria). 29.2 In general terms, vendors that meet the following criteria may be considered qualified: a) They are not included in the UN Security Council 1267/1989 Committee's list of terrorists and terrorist financiers, and in UNDP's ineligible vendors' list; b) They have a good financial standing and have access to adequate financial resources to perform the contract and all existing commercial commitments, c) They have the necessary similar experience, technical expertise, production capacity where applicable, quality certifications, quality assurance procedures and other resources applicable to the provision of the services required: d) They are able to comply fully with UNDP General Terms and Conditions e) They do not have a consistent history of court/arbitral award decisions against the Bidder; and

They have a record of timely and satisfactory performance with their clients. The evaluation team shall review and evaluate the Technical Proposals on 30. Evaluation of **Technical and** the basis of their responsiveness to the Terms of Reference and other RFP **Financial** documents, applying the evaluation criteria, sub-criteria, and point system **Proposals** specified in the Section 4 (Evaluation Criteria). A Proposal shall be rendered non-responsive at the technical evaluation stage if it fails to achieve the minimum technical score indicated in the BDS. When necessary and if stated in the BDS, UNDP may invite technically responsive bidders for a presentation related to their technical proposals. The conditions for the presentation shall be provided in the bid document where required. In the second stage, only the Financial Proposals of those Bidders who achieve the minimum technical score will be opened for evaluation. The Financial Proposals corresponding to Technical Proposals that were rendered non-responsive shall remain unopened, and, in the case of manual submission, be returned to the Bidder unopened. Youth Empowerment Programme

2. B. Project Description

With a large portion (32%) of youth in Pakistan being poverty-stricken and uneducated with no vocational and life skills, a big segment of the society remains vulnerable to violence and extremism. Investment in skills development, employment and entrepreneurship opportunities for youth is needed to reduce conflict but also to help establish a foundation for long-term economic growth and prosperity in Pakistan. UNDP's Youth Empowerment Programme caters to the comprehensive global strategy that places youth at the forefront of its development work. It is a multi-pronged strategy aimed at creating pathways for the economic empowerment and constructive engagement of youth in Sindh and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP).

However, the National Human Development Report (2017) highlights several social, cultural, and economic barriers preventing youth from setting up sustainable, responsible businesses, pointing to an urgent need to invest in facilitating young potential entrepreneurs.

For this purpose, YEP is promoting social entrepreneurship (SE) through targeted outreach programmes for innovative youth to become social entrepreneurs. The programme currently promotes entrepreneurship through targeted interventions aiming to equip young people with the necessary skills to start their own businesses and grow enterprises that will create more employment while providing opportunities to otherwise disadvantaged young people, directly contributing to Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) 8 – Decent Work and Economic Growth. YEP is playing a pioneering role in supporting the emerging entrepreneurship ecosystem in Pakistan by facilitating the next generation of social entrepreneurs to accelerate their initiatives in achieving the SDGs. YEP has had extensive experience working with young entrepreneurs in all sectors at various stages of business growth through scouting for good ideas, turning them into viable business solutions, providing effective mentoring and attracting investors to invest in enterprises.

UNDP Pakistan's YEP in collaboration with Youth Co:Lab co-created a first-of-its kind entrepreneurship bootcamp for young social entrepreneurs, between the ages of 18 and 29, whose enterprises target the country's pressing development challenges. Through the SDG Bootcamps, UNDP is helping young entrepreneurs turn innovative ideas into viable business solutions contributing to the achievement of some of the 17 SDGs. UNDP has held two SDG Bootcamps so far (national and KP) and through these, UNDP has supported 41 social ventures, engaged over 100 Changemakers, reached 1.2 million people through the social media campaigns and worked with 25 local partners.

In view of the above, UNDP Pakistan aims to create a supply chain of social entrepreneurs through sustained engagement with talented youth from all over Pakistan, with a focus on women. UNDP will expand its partnership with academia in KP particularly by exploring innovative pathways for students' active involvement in the 2030 Agenda. For this purpose, UNDP seeks to organize at least 60 one-day awareness sessions in selected educational institutions of KP to raise awareness about and promote social entrepreneurship. Furthermore and in parallel, UNDP seeks to conduct a total of 10 rigorous five-day SE trainings (similar to SDG Bootcamps) in educational institutes from all over Pakistan with an emphasis on women participation to promote innovative business solutions to

resolve real life SDG challenges; a total of 3,000 youth are expected to participate in the SE awareness sessions and 400 youth in the SE workshops.

- 4. Report to the Youth Empowerment Programme team on the final results and success stories of the SE awareness sessions and coordinate future efforts.
- 5. Carry out effective monitoring and evaluation of the conduct of SE awareness sessions and suggest improvements.

Social Enterprise (SE) Bootcamps:

- 1. Identify public universities, NICs, BICs and other potential partners in Pakistan for engagement of youth through social enterprise workshops with an emphasis on women.
- 2. Identify and select potential youth (age between 15 and 29 years) based on selection criteria agreed with UNDP. The trainees will be selected from all over Pakistan with minimum 50% candidates being women. Develop highly engaging content that is based on market demand, practical experience from the field and cutting edge in the social enterprise ecosystem for the bootcamps in coordination with UNDP. Include assignments and practical exercises in the course content to make it more meaningful. The course content should have business applicability in the market for trainees.
- 3. Conduct at least 10 five-day social enterprise workshops with 400 youth (recommended batches of 40) over a period of 9 months. *These Bootcamps should be conducted online*. The workshops must be as per the following breakdown:
 - 04 Thematic SE workshops (e.g. Health, Education, Climate Change, etc. related to a particular SDG and to be decided in collaboration with UNDP)
 - 05 Bootcamps with women-only (01 in KP, 01 in Punjab, 01 in Sindh, 01 in Balochistan, 01 in either AJK, GB, or Islamabad)
 - 01 final national level SE bootcamp that hosts the top participants from each of the earlier SE workshops ending the programme.

- 4. Devise a robust mentorship plan where market-based business experts are hired to engage young social entrepreneurs in meaningful exercises to apply skills gained during the training in real market-based setting.
- 5. Report to the Youth Empowerment Programme team on the final results and success stories of the workshops and coordinate future efforts. Provide post-event support in the form of mentoring, in-kind prizes, and regular follow-ups with the trainees.
- 6. Carry out effective monitoring and evaluation of the conduct of workshops and suggest improvements.
