## I. BACKGROUND / PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Green Climate Fund (GCF) was established in 2010 as an operating entity of the financial mechanism of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC), designed to disburse new and additional resources for addressing climate change. Access to Fund resources is through national, regional and international implementing entities accredited by the Board. The Fund liaises with individual countries through a nominated national institution known as the National Designated Authority (NDA). In Ghana, the Government nominated the Economic Strategy and Research Division (ESRD) at the Ministry of Finance to be its NDA.

In line with the GCF's business model, access to their resources is through entities accredited by the GCF Board to deliver approved funded activities referred to as Accredited Entities (AE) or Direct Access Entities (DAEs). Specifically, the AE is responsible for the overall management, implementation and oversight of climate change projects and programmes in line with the GCF fiduciary principles and standards, environmental and social safeguards standards and Gender Policy (all of which are standards for GCF accreditation), and other relevant GCF policies and requirements, in accordance with the relevant legal agreements (accreditation master agreements and funded activity agreements).

In 2019, Ecobank Ghana Limited (EGH) became Ghana's first direct access entity to the GCF. As per the GCF Programming Manual (<a href="https://www.greenclimate.fund/document/programming-manual">https://www.greenclimate.fund/document/programming-manual</a>), AEs (including DAEs) are expected to develop entity work programmes. In the case of DAEs, the EWP can be developed by the AE and included in the country programme or as a standalone document. EWPs are intended to foster a proactive, strategic and country-owned approach to pipeline development and programming with GCF. They play an important role as a strategic tool in providing insights on project ideas and programmes being developed by DAEs, regional DAEs and IAEs which will eventually contribute towards high-quality, climate-focused funding proposals at entry.

## **Objective of the Assignment**

The purpose of the consultancy assignment is to develop an accredited entity work programme for Ghana's first accredited entity to the GCF, Ecobank Ghana Limited. The EWP is expected to capture an overview of the envisaged partnership of EGH with GCF, areas of work and priority sectors in line with Ghana's Country Programme and country programming processes as well as GCF sectoral guidance on the eight GCF results

areas, and its experience in implementing projects and programmes across the eight GCF results areas. In addition, the EWP is expected to align with national priorities, particularly the NDCs as well as the GCF's Country Programming Guidelines and programming directions for the first replenishment period of the GCF (identified in Strategic Plan for the GCF: 2020-2023: <a href="https://www.greenclimate.fund/sites/default/files/document/gcf-b25-09.pdf">https://www.greenclimate.fund/sites/default/files/document/gcf-b25-09.pdf</a>) and other related board decision providing guidance on the development of EWPs.

#### II. SCOPE OF WORK AND EXPECTED DELIVERABLES

The Consultant will undertake this assignment with the support of a national consultant and in close consultation with Ecobank Ghana Limited, the Economic Strategy and Research Division at the Ministry of Finance (Ghana NDA) and its Technical Advisory Committee, UNDP Country Office, as well as other relevant national stakeholders in climate change policy and finance. The Consultants will also work with the various teams of consultants undertaking the revision of Ghana's NDCs and the development of Ghana's GCF Country Programme Document to ensure synergies on national climate change project/ programme priorities.

### **Specific Tasks**

- Define strategy or approach in the development of the entity work programme, in line with best national and international practices among others, which would also be clearly outlined at the inception phase;
- Draft the entity work programme to cover (among others) the following elements:
  - i. An overview of the envisaged partnership between the EGH and GCF and the overall climate finance landscape, strategies and plans to address climate change, comparative advantages of the AE, areas of work and priority sectors of the AE, and alignment with Ghana's Country Programmes and country programming processes as well as GCF sectoral guidance on the eight GCF results areas;
  - ii. Information on the AE's experience in implementing projects and programmes across the eight GCF results areas; and
  - iii. Indicative projects/programmes as well as relevant GCF readiness and an outline of an action plan for engagement with GCF for each GCF replenishment period (covering four years), especially between the period of implementation of Ghana's NDCs.
- Submit and address comments on the draft EWP from EGH, GCF (particularly the Climate Investment Committee)
- Finalize EWP based on inputs received from the GCF, EGH, Ghana's NDA and relevant stakeholders

#### **Deliverables**

- **1. Inception Report**: The Consultants will clearly articulate how they would complete the tasks, 1 week after signing of contract.
- **2. Draft Entity Work Programme**: To be submitted to the GCF for review.
- 3. Final EWP: reflecting inputs and comments received on the draft report (only electronic copies).
- 4. Report of relevant stakeholder workshops/meetings (or webinar as appropriate).

## III. INSTITUTIONAL ARRANGEMENT / REPORTING RELATIONSHIPS

- Duty station: Home based
- This consultancy is meant for a team of two consultants, one Lead (international) and one Assistant (national). UNDP will sign separate contracts with each of the two consultants.
- The Consultants will report to the UNDP Ghana's Deputy Resident Representative. On a day to day basis, they will liaise with the EGH, the GCF Readiness Project Coordinator and the NDA.
- Payments will be made upon satisfactory delivery of output and acceptance and confirmation from UNDP on output delivered.

## IV. LOGISTICS AND ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT TO PROSPECT IC

- The Consultants will be given access to relevant information necessary for execution of the tasks under this assignment;
- The Consultants will be responsible for providing their own working station (i.e. laptop, internet, phone, etc.) and must have access to reliable internet connection.
- UNDP will handle the organization of the physical stakeholder consultations in collaboration with EGH and the consultants. All in-person meetings will be organized while strictly adhering to COVID-19 safety protocols in line with national guidelines.

### **V. DURATION OF THE WORK**

## VI. REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS OF THE ORGANIZATION

The EWP will be prepared by 1 international consultant, who will be the team lead for this work to be supported by a nationally recruited consultant. The team leader is expected to meet the following qualifications:

### **Experience of the Lead Consultant**

- Advanced Degree (Masters or a PhD) in Natural Sciences, Climate Change, Climate Policy, Natural Resource Management or any other relevant field
- Minimum 10 years' relevant work experience in climate change adaptation or mitigation, climate change financing in developing countries;
- Prior work experience in climate change mitigation or adaptation in relation to work on NDCs or GCF country programmes or similar in developing countries
- Experience of GCF's evolving project portfolio and similar multi-year work programmes (or EWPs) for accredited entities is preferable.
- Good communication skills both written and oral (English).

## **Functional Competencies:**

- Comprehensive understanding of GCF processes and functional requirements
- A track record of delivering successful consultancy service in a timely manner
- Ability to multi-task and have good time management skills
- Strong analytical aptitude, communication and presentation expertise.

## **Core Competencies:**

- Demonstrates integrity by modeling the UN's values and ethical standards;
- Promotes the vision, mission, and strategic goals of UNDP;
- Displays cultural, gender, religion, race, nationality and age sensitivity and adaptability;
- Treats all people fairly without favoritism; and
- Fulfills all obligations to gender sensitivity and zero tolerance for sexual harassment

#### VII. EVALUATION CRITERIA

The technical proposal shall demonstrate clearly how the Consultant intends to carry out the assignment. The detailed implementation plan will include an outline of the implementation strategy, conceptual framework and approach, as well as monitoring and reporting framework/format.

The financial proposal shall specify a total lump sum amount, and payment terms around specific and measurable (qualitative and quantitative) deliverables (i.e. whether payments fall in instalments or upon completion of the entire contract). Payments are based upon output, i.e. upon delivery of the services specified in the TOR. In order to assist the requesting unit in the comparison of financial proposals, the financial proposal will include a breakdown of this lump sum amount (especially professional fees and any others applicable cost). Any anticipated local travel costs will be included in the proposal of the national consultant.

The Consultant will be evaluated based on a cumulative analysis taking into consideration the combination of the qualifications, experience and competencies. A two-stage procedure is utilized in evaluating the proposals, with evaluation of the technical proposals prior to any price proposal being considered and compared. The Financial Proposals will be considered only for proposals that passed or attained the minimum technical score in the evaluation of the Technical Proposals. The technical proposals are evaluated on the basis of its responsiveness to the TOR.

For proposals to be considered technically compliant, the average technical evaluation score must exceed the minimum as show below.
