2. Project Description

The Government is currently implementing the second National Disability Strategic Plan (NDSP2) 2019–2023, aimed at empowering and ensuring the inclusion of persons with disabilities. During its inception phase, the government reviewed lessons learned from the previous National Disability Strategic Plan, including the lack of leveraging public financial mechanisms and awareness around disability inclusion in cross-cutting thematic programmes and policy solutions. The NDSP2 is recognized by the country as a roadmap to advance the rights of persons with disabilities and the United Nations Country Team (UNCT) in Cambodia has an opportunity to address the gaps and missing links in line with the Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities and the UN framework for the immediate socio-economic response to COVID-19 (UN Cambodia SERF). The COVID-19 response measures by UNCT would enable and highlight the importance of disability inclusion to address existing challenges as well as advocate for 'building back better' in line with the 2030 Agenda.

Building on evidence-based analysis of COVID-19 on persons with disabilities and the national recovery plan, the UN will advance risk-mitigation and early warning mechanisms to protect the most marginalized groups of persons with disabilities. The UNCT will promote disability inclusive sustainable development that contributes to recovering better, increase engagement with organization of persons with disabilities (OPDs) across thematic areas of UN programmes and ensure strengthened governmental commitment.

The UNCT submitted the Expression of Interest (EOI) for the UN Partnership on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (UNPRPD) round 4 in September 2020, and it was accepted to work on the full project proposal early this year. Given that the full proposal must be developed based on the recommendations and key findings of the Situation Analysis of COVID-19 and Recovery Plan in consultation with relevant key stakeholders including OPDs, government's relevant ministries, UN agencies and CSOs to ensure the proposal is well designed, developed and met the emerging issues in Cambodia of particular relevant to disabilities, and the rights of the persons with disabilities.

3. Scope of Work

The assignment aims to develop the full proposal for the UNCT Cambodia to be able to submit the full-fledged proposal to the UNPRPD Secretariat on 30 May 2021.

The assignment will be expected to:

- Conduct a desk review of all the relevant project documents (including approved Expression of Interest of UNPRPD, Inception Phase of UNPRPD, COVID-19 Situation Analysis, COVID-19 recovery plan, UNPRPD strategic operational framework 2020-2025, etc.), relevant documents of the Royal Government of Cambodia (RGC), and UN framework for the immediate socio-economic response to COVID-19.
- Conduct consultation with interested UN agencies in participating the proposal to identify the key areas, insights and recommendations that will respond to the disability inclusive development agenda as well as the purpose of the UNPDPD's strategic framework.
- Design methodology and tools to perform data collection including consultation/coordination with relevant stakeholders through a number of workshops, meetings and focus group discussions/ face to face/ virtually (taking into account of COVID-19 situation) or in-depth interviews with relevant stakeholders such as OPDs, CSOs, PWDs, UNCT and government ministries, private sector?, who might be involving in the project development. The Human Rights-Based Approach (HRBA)¹ shall be part of the methodology.
- Conduct a workshop to validate the situational analysis to ensure the key recommendations and findings are prioritized into the full-fledged proposal.
- Develop a first draft of the full proposal based on the template provided by the UNPRPD Secretariat.
- Finalize the full proposal of UN Joint Programme that meets the requirements of UNPRPD.
- Join and facilitate the meetings on the progress of the proposal in a regular basis and perform other tasks as required by the UNCT's proposal development working group.
