In the course of preparing your Proposal, it shall remain your responsibility to ensure that it reaches the address above on or before the deadline. Proposals that are received by UNDP after the deadline indicated above, for whatever reason, shall not be considered for evaluation. If you are submitting your Proposal by email, kindly ensure that they are signed and in the .pdf format, and free from any virus or corrupted files.

Services proposed shall be reviewed and evaluated based on completeness and compliance of the Proposal and responsiveness with the requirements of the RFP and all other annexes providing details of UNDP requirements.

The Proposal that complies with all of the requirements, meets all the evaluation criteria and offers the best value for money shall be selected and awarded the contract. Any offer that does not meet the requirements shall be rejected.

Any discrepancy between the unit price and the total price shall be re-computed by UNDP, and the unit price shall prevail and the total price shall be corrected. If the Service Provider does not accept the final price based on UNDP's re-computation and correction of errors, its Proposal will be rejected.

No price variation due to escalation, inflation, fluctuation in exchange rates, or any other market factors shall be accepted by UNDP after it has received the Proposal. At the time of Award of Contract or Purchase Order, UNDP reserves the right to vary (increase or decrease) the quantity of services and/or goods, by up to a maximum twenty five per cent (25%) of the total offer, without any change in the unit price or other terms and conditions.

Any Contract or Purchase Order that will be issued as a result of this RFP shall be subject to the General Terms and Conditions attached hereto. #### **Description of Requirements**

### Context of the Requirement

Formally launched at the UN Climate Action Summit in September 2019, UNDP's Climate Promise supports more than 100 countries to enhance their Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs) under the Paris Agreement. Delivered in collaboration with a wide variety of partners, and as UNDP's contribution to the NDC Partnership, the Climate Promise is world's largest offer of support for the enhancement of climate pledges. The Climate Promise provides support to help countries take bold action to reduce emissions, increase resilience to climate impacts and support sustainable development priorities. Under the Climate Promise, UNDP is leveraging its extensive climate change portfolio, its Country Office network and global policy services to provide thematic technical support to countries, and ensure that NDCs are fully aligned with national sustainable development priorities. UNDP advocates for an inclusive approach to ensure ownership of climate actions across government and society, advance equality, and strengthen social and environmental sustainability.

Arising from the Paris Agreement and Katowice outcomes, Parties noted in their decisions that gender responsive implementation and means of implementation of climate policy and action can enable Parties to raise NDC ambition, as well as enhance gender equality, and just transition of the workforce, and create decent work and quality jobs in accordance with nationally defined development priorities. Under the Lima Work Programme, Parties have been requested to appoint and provide support for a national gender and climate change focal point for climate negotiations, implementation and monitoring. South Africa has already taken first steps in appointing both the focal point for gender and Action for Climate Empowerment (ACE) as mandated by UNFCCC.

As a signatory to the UNFCCC, South Africa is working on the process of developing its second NDC for submission before COP26, which has now been postponed to November 2021. South Africa will conduct public consultation on the draft NDC before it is approved by cabinet, and implementation of the NDC in South Africa will cut across all spheres of government and stakeholders, and the focus of this project is to building institutional, staff capacities and raising awareness with regard to gender mainstreaming in climate actions.

The support provided to South Africa's UNFCCC Focal Point (Department of Environment, Forestry and Fisheries, DEFF) will ensure that gender equality aspects are factored into the NDC processes by leveraging analysis, strengthening institutional mechanisms, ensuring gender-responsive climate actions and disseminating best practices to enhance national-level capacities through the implementation of activities outlined in the Climate Promise workplan for South Africa.

The focus of this TOR is therefore on the implementation of activities that aims to ensure gender mainstreaming in climate action and in support of South Africa's NDC enhancement that is gender responsive. The direct and indirect outputs and outcomes of the deliverables in the TOR aims to integrate gender considerations into adaptation,

mitigation, capacity-building, awareness-raising, technology and finance policies, plans and actions. Gender analysis to be undertaken in the key NDC sectors will unlock the country's understanding of the different roles of women and men, the power and decision-making dynamics and who has access to and control of resources in a particular sector, or to understand more broadly how climate change measures may affect them differently. The deliverables of this TOR will improve tracking in relation to the implementation and reporting on gender related mandates under the UNFCCC and to materialise implementation aspects hereto using national systems.

As such, a Climate Promise South Africa workplan has been developed by DEFF and UNDP. To conduct activities in the workplan, a highly experienced Service Provider consisting of a multidisciplinary team of one project leader/principal specialist and a maximum of four experts, is being sought for appointment by UNDP.

#### Brief Description of the Required Services<sup>1</sup>

The overarching purpose of this TOR, and its deliverables, is to contribute to institutional and staff engagement capacities of relevant provincial and national sector departments on climate change and gender mainstreaming, as well as development of Gender and climate change action plans. This will enable provincial and national sector departments to develop gender action plans to ensure that mainstreaming of climate change is considered across the board.

The Service Provider will help facilitate, accelerate, and keep track of the gender mainstreaming effort under the Climate Promise project. The concept of 'training-by-doing' will be practised, and the advantage of this approach is that quality work is achieved at a faster pace, and will help the UNFCCC Focal Point and its primary stakeholders to retain actionable knowledge that can be re-applied systemically. This will result in a more robust, more people-centric, and more inclusive NDC in South Africa, across areas of climate change adaptation and mitigation.

The broad deliverables and processes associated with this TOR are:

- Development of a gender responsive, and hence more ambitious and enhanced NDC;
- Building political will and societal ownership of gender mainstreaming in climate action and key NDC sectors at national and sub-national levels;
- Conducting training programmes and awareness raising activities to build gender mainstreaming capacity;
- Ensuring that South Africa actively and equally engages men and women in NDC implementation and in decision making processes; and

Ensuring an inclusive approach in national climate strategies and actions
