I. BACKGROUND

The Global Maritime Crime Programme (GMCP) of UNODC supports member states to respond to maritime crime challenges including increase the operational capacity of member states, enhance information-sharing mechanisms and provide frontline support in developing policy designed to counter maritime crime.

There are a multitude of ready and able maritime law enforcement entities to help respond to these current and evolving challenges. However, it found out that information regarding maritime crime happened in the border area between Indonesia and Philippine particularly in the border area between North Sulawesi Province of Indonesia and Zamboanga of Philippine is lacking.

In order to provide near real time information for decision and policy makers at relevant maritime agencies at the HQ in Jakarta, GMCP of UNODC plans to conduct information gathering exercise on the ground particularly in the border area between North Sulawesi of Indonesia and Zamboanga of Philippine. The information collected will be used as well internally for GMCP to prioritize works, change current strategies and design future responses.

Furthermore, the information collected will be used to support current Sulu and Celebes Seas Contact Group meeting which meet periodically to discuss current threats in the area, share information and plan join operations when necessary. Sulu and Celebes Seas Contact Group meeting is a mechanism supported by GMCP involving relevant maritime agencies from Indonesia, Malaysia and the Philippine.

II. SCOPE OF WORK, ACTIVITIES, AND DELIVERABLES

Scope of Work

The maritime crime scenario in Southeast Asia particularly in the border area is complex. The region is, by geographic nature, a maritime region. Historic licit routes for trade are used similarly for criminal intention including trafficking of drugs and precursors, weapons, persons and contraband. Armed robbery at sea and to a lesser degree kidnaping for ransom continue to plague the region – particularly in the border area.

The information collected will be useful not only for Indonesian maritime stakeholders but also for GMCP of UNODC particularly since the information will be used to support current activity supported by GMCP, the Sulu and Celebes Seas contact group meetings.

Specific task to be performed by the national consultant:

Under the supervision of Mr. Shanaka Jayasekara, Programme Coordinator UNODC of GMCP for Southeast Asia and the Pacific and overall supervision of the Country Manager of Indonesia, the consultant will carry out the following activities:

• Collect information on maritime crime happened in North Sulawesi Province of Indonesia, including but not limited to trafficking of drugs and precursors, weapons, persons and contraband as well as armed robbery. Information collected also includes: (i) modus operandi used by the criminals, (ii) volume of drugs or goods

smuggled into Indonesia from Philippine or vice versa, (iii) profile of the criminals, (iv) route used by the criminals and (v) identification of vessel types used by criminals. The information will be collected from open sources, including local newspaper, local radio, local television and on-line media based in the district/province.

• Compile a report on the findings that will be shared to GMCP of UNODC every two months.

Expected Outputs and Deliverables

- Information gathering on maritime crime happened in North Sulawesi Province of Indonesia from open sources available particularly from local media both printed and electronic is conducted.
- Report regarding maritime crime in North Sulawesi Province is submitted every two months in Bahasa Indonesia and English.

III. WORKING ARRANGEMENTS

Institutional Arrangement

The consultant will perform his/her work under the supervision of the Regional Programme Coordinator of Southeast Asia and the Pacific of the Global Maritime Crime Programme of UNODC. In addition, the UNODC Country Manager of Indonesia will provide overall guidance and supervision to the consultant. Additional support will be provided under the guidance of National Programme Officer of Global Maritime Crime Programme.
