GENERAL PROVISIONS 1. Introduction Bidders shall adhere to all the requirements of this ITB, including any amendments made in writing by UNDP. UNDP is under no obligation to award a contract to any Bidder as a result of this ITB. 1.3 UNDP reserves the right to cancel the procurement process at any stage without any liability of any kind for UNDP, upon notice to the bidders or publication of cancellation notice on UNDP website. As part of the bid, it is desired that the Bidder registers at the United 1.4 Nations Global Marketplace (UNGM) website (www.ungm.org). The Bidder may still submit a bid even if not registered with the UNGM. However, if the Bidder is selected for contract award, the Bidder must register on the UNGM prior to contract signature. 2. 7. Language	7.1	The Bid, as well as any and all related correspondence exchanged by the Bidder and UNDP, shall be written in the language (s) specified in the BDS.

Documents Establishing the Eligibility and Qualifications of the Bidder	9.1	The Bidder shall furnish documentary evidence of its status as an eligible and qualified vendor, using the Forms provided under Section 6 and providing documents required in those forms. In order to award a contract to a Bidder, its qualifications must be documented to UNDP's satisfaction.		
10. Technical Bid Format and Content	10.1	The Bidder is required to submit a Technical Bid using the Standard Forms and templates provided in Section 6 of the ITB. Samples of items, when required as per Section 5, shall be provided within the time specified and unless otherwise specified by the Purchaser, at no expense to the UNDP. If Bid Security is 12.2 required by the ITB but is not found in the Bid, the offer shall be rejected. If the Bid Security amount or its validity period is found to be less than 12.3 what is required by UNDP, UNDP shall reject the Bid. 12.4 In the event an electronic submission is allowed in the BDS, Bidders shall include a copy of the Bid Security in their bid and the original of the Bid Security must be sent via courier or hand delivery as per the instructions in BDS. The Bid Security may be forfeited by UNDP, and the Bid rejected, in the event of any, or combination, of the following conditions: a) If the Bidder withdraws its offer during the period of the Bid Validity specified in the BDS, or; b) In the event the successful Bidder fails: to sign the Contract after UNDP has issued an award; or to furnish the Performance Security, insurances, or other documents that UNDP may require as a condition precedent to the effectivity of the contract that may be awarded to the Bidder. 13. Currencies All prices shall be quoted in the currency or currencies indicated in 13.1 the BDS. Where Bids are quoted in different currencies, for the purposes of comparison of all Bids: a) UNDP will convert the currency quoted in the Bid into the UNDP preferred currency, in accordance with the prevailing UN operational rate of exchange on the last day of submission of Bids; and b) In the event that UNDP selects a Bid for award that is quoted in a currency different from the preferred currency in the BDS, UNDP shall reserve the right to award the contract in the currency of UNDP's preference, using the conversion method specified above. 14. Joint Venture. 14.1 If the Bidder is a group of legal entities that will form or have formed a Consortium or Joint Venture (JV), Consortium or Association for the Bid, they shall confirm in their Bid that : (i) they have designated one party to act as Association a lead entity, duly vested with authority to legally bind the members of the JV, Consortium or Association jointly and severally, which shall be evidenced by a duly notarized Agreement among the legal entities, and submitted with the Bid; and (ii) if they are awarded the contract, the contract shall be entered into, by and between UNDP and the designated lead entity, who shall be acting for and on behalf of all the member entities comprising the joint venture. After the Deadline for Submission of Bid, the lead entity identified to represent the JV, Consortium or Association shall not be altered without the prior written consent of UNDP. The lead entity and the member entities of the JV, Consortium or 14.3 Association shall abide by the provisions of Clause 9 herein in respect

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of submitting only one Bid. All entities that comprise the JV, Consortium or Association shall be subject to the eligibility and qualification assessment by UNDP. Bids submitted by two (2) or more Bidders shall all be rejected if they 15.2 are found to have any of the following: a) they have at least one controlling partner, director or shareholder in common; or b) any one of them receive or have received any direct or indirect subsidy from the other/s; or c) they have the same legal representative for purposes of this ITB; d) they have a relationship with each other, directly or through common third parties, that puts them in a position to have access to information about, or influence on the Bid of another Bidder regarding this ITB process; e) they are subcontractors to each other's Bid, or a subcontractor to one Bid also submits another Bid under its name as lead Bidder; or some key personnel proposed to be in the team of one Bidder participates in more than one Bid received for this ITB process. This condition relating to the personnel, does not apply to subcontractors being included in more than one Bid. 16. Bid Validity Period Bids shall remain valid for the period specified in the BDS, 16.1 commencing on the Deadline for Submission of Bids. No verbal statement made during the conference shall modify the terms and conditions of the ITB, unless specifically incorporated in the Minutes of the Bidder's Conference or issued/posted as an amendment to ITB.

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c. SUBMISSION AND OPENING OF BIDS

22. Submission 22.1 The Bidder shall submit a duly signed and complete Bid comprising the documents and forms in accordance with requirements in the BDS. The Price Schedule shall be submitted together with the Technical Bid. Bid can be delivered either personally, by courier, or by electronic method of transmission as specified in the BDS. 22.2 The Bid shall be signed by the Bidder or person(s) duly authorized to commit the Bidder. The authorization shall be communicated through a document evidencing such authorization issued by the legal representative of the bidding entity, or a Power of Attorney,

accompanying the Bid.

22.3 Bidders must be aware that the mere act of submission of a Bid, in and of itself, implies that the Bidder fully accepts the UNDP General Contract Terms and Conditions.

Hard copy (manual) submission

- 22.4 Hard copy (manual) submission by courier or hand delivery allowed or specified in the BDS shall be governed as follows:
 - a) The signed Bid shall be marked "Original", and its copies marked "Copy" as appropriate. The number of copies is indicated in the BDS. All copies shall be made from the signed original only. If there are discrepancies between the original and the copies, the original shall prevail.
 - (b) The Technical Bid and Price Schedule must be sealed and submitted together in an envelope, which_shall:
 - i. Bear the name of the Bidder;
 - ii. Be addressed to UNDP as specified in the BDS; and
 - iii. Bear a warning not to open before the time and date for Bid opening as specified in the BDS.

1. Preface

This document sets out the statement of work to Secure Contracting Services to Establish and Refurbish a specialized court in Nablus Court building for the benefit of cases of Violence Against Women and One Stop Center in Nablus for use by the Palestinian Civil Police in Nablus Police Station. The implementation will be managed and supervised by the United Nations Development Programme / Programme of Assistance to the Palestinian People "UNDP/PAPP" (the Client) and financed by the UN Women.

2. Introduction

Violence, especially against women and girls, is a worldwide systematic human rights violation that has increased. Globally, 243 million women and girls aged 15 to 49 have suffered sexual and/or physical violence by an intimate partner in the last year. In the West Bank and Gaza Strip, one in three women experienced violence by their husbands, and 44 per cent of girls aged 12 to 17 years old have been subjected to physical violence, according to a study by the Central Bureau of Statistics.

About 37% of women who ever been married were exposed to one form of violence by their husbands; 29.9% in the West Bank compared to 51.1% in Gaza Strip. The rate of those who were exposed to psychological violence "at least for one time" among those women out of violated women was 58.36%, 55.1% were exposed to economical violence, 54.8 were exposed to social violence, 23.5% were exposed to physical violence and 11.8 were exposed to sexual violence.

Two third of women who were exposed to violence prefer silence and refuge to household as a second choice; 30.2 % of exposed women who were ever married and were exposed to violence by their husbands have had recourse to the house of one of the brothers or sisters and 65.3% preferred to remain silent regarding the act of violence that were practiced against them by their husbands, while the rate of women who have been exposed to violence and headed to women institutions or centers soliciting advise did not exceed 0.7%

The right of women and girls to live free from violence is a fundamental principle of international human rights low established by the universal and regional human rights systems and goes hand in

hand with legal duties relating to eradicating violence and discrimination. These duties are based on the fundamental right to equality, non-discrimination, life and physical integrity.

In this context, UN Women within SAWASYA II programme plans to support the High Judicial Council (HJC) to establish and refurbish a specialized court in Nablus Courthouse building, for the benefit of violence against women (VAW) program and the use of VAW specialized judges to ensure effective victim protection during the legal process, through free legal aid and support in court, not having to meet the defendant when appearing in court, and providing complete privacy to encourage the women subjected to violence to get their rights by law through the court.

3. Objectives

The projects aim to provide access to justice for the women subjected to violence in the community of Nablus Governorate.

4. Description of the projects:

4.1 Nablus Courthouse:

The building of Nablus courthouse consists of three floors (ground, first and second) and a basement that used as a parking and partially for archiving issues. To establish a special court that will deal with the cases of violence against women, new modifications should be done in the three floors (ground, first and second) to accommodate the facilities of the court and to provide high privacy level for the victims. As the targeted rooms are used for archiving purposes now, an intervention will be done in the parking (basement) to establish archive department instead of the four rooms, in addition to supply and install archive mobile. The interventions are summarized as follows:

1) Ground floor:

- Rehabilitating the side entrance that is used by judges to ensure it is accessible for women survivors
 of violence, including women with disability;
- Inserting a partition at the entrance to ensure privacy for cases that enter the court;
- Installing all necessary protection systems based on the needs of the court, such as cameras, fire alarm, fire-fighting system, etc.;

2) The first floor:

- Construct a partition at the entrance of the floor to ensure privacy of women heading to the court;
- Rehabilitation of the two agreed upon rooms, including supplying offices and furniture, as required by the court team in coordination with Un Women and UNDP/PAPP.
- Build a partition at the entrance of the two rooms (made of wood and glass) to be used as reception and waiting area;
- Rehabilitating the bathroom and kitchen
- Installing the required systems such as access control, surveillance, fire alarm, firefighting, airconditioning and ventilation, public announce and voice alarm, etc.;

3) The second floor:

- Build a partition at the entrance of the floor to ensure privacy of women heading to the court;
- Rehabilitation of the two agreed upon rooms, including procuring offices and furniture, as required as required by the court team in coordination with Un Women;
- Adding a partition at the entrance of the two rooms (made of wood and glass) to be used as a waiting area;
- Rehabilitating the bathroom and kitchen.
- Installing the required systems such as access control, surveillance, fire alarm, firefighting, airconditioning and ventilation, public announce and voice alarm etc.;

4) Basement (Parking) floor:

- 1. Rehabilitation of a space with an area of about 150m2 to be used as an archive
- 2. Refurbishing 2 halls including inserting partitions, doors etc.
- 3. Installing the required systems such as access control, surveillance, fire alarm, firefighting, air-conditioning and ventilation, public announce and voice alarm etc.;

4.2 Nablus One Stop Center:

The center locates in a second floor in building of Palestinian Mail near the Police Station, the area of the building is about 250m2. The refurbishment includes amongst others the installment of partitions to prepare rooms; 2 interview rooms (one for children, one for women), 1 medical examination room (for forensic doctors and nurses), 4 sleeping rooms with shower room attached to it (one for women, one for juvenile, one for policewomen, one for policemen), 3 offices (one for the police, one for the social worker, and one for the prosecutor), children's playroom, reception area and WCs (one for women, one for men and one for disabled). In addition to that, the scope of the work would include the supplying and installing of an elevator.

5. Type of Works: the works in both projects include but not limited to the following:

- ✓ Demolition works which include but not limited to partitions, removing of ground and walls tiles, windows, metal and wooden doors, opening in concrete and block wall to create new doors, exists for ducts, removing of all of the existing electromechanical works,...etc.
- ✓ Concrete works which include concrete for the foundation of the elevator, ramps and external works.
- ✓ Stones and concrete hollow blocks to create the required partitions and close the specified openings.
- ✓ Metal works which include steel to construct the structure of the elevator, doors, and aluminium windows.
- ✓ Plastering for the new block works.

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- ✓ Tilling including ground tiles, walls tiles, ramps, stairs land and stairs.
- ✓ Carpentry works including doors and cabinets.
- ✓ False ceiling and gypsum board internal partitions.
- ✓ Painting of internal walls, gypsum boards partitions and the old corridors in the courthouse.
- ✓ Electrical works including lighting system, power system, wiring, distribution boards, telecommunication system, grounding and bonding systems, access control system, surveillance system, fire alarm system,...etc.
- ✓ Mechanical works including toilets, sinks, wash basins, drainage system, water pipes, tanks, water collectors, firefighting system, VRF system, ventilation system, ..etc.
- ✓ External works including canopies, ramps and stairs
- ✓ Supplying the required furniture to operate the court.
- ✓ Supplying and installing elevator in the One Stop Center

Additional Precautions:

- ✓ The construction and rehabilitation works will be carried out within the premises of a functional building. Therefore, extra precautions and measures are required by the contractor to ensure the safety and security of all individuals inside and around the building. It is also emphasized that both construction and rehabilitation works shall not by any means interfere with, disturb, or interrupt the daily activities in the existing buildings, or endanger the safety of the employees and visitors.
- ✓ The contractor shall visit the project site to become familiar with the conditions and nature of the work area, the structures, the vicinity, and the free space available for maneuvering, performing the work and for storing the construction material. In general, the contractor should become familiar with all the conditions and circumstances which may affect the way he will perform his work.
- ✓ The prices quoted by the contractors in the bill of quantities, following their visit to the site, shall be considered to include all what is required to carry out the work under the local conditions, including the foreseeable and unforeseeable expenses that will be required to complete the work according to the contract and to the satisfaction of the Engineer. Moreover, the contractor must take into consideration that some works will be performed outside normal working hours, and that he/she is required to adapt approved methods of operation to mitigate noise and dust pollution.

2) WORKMANSHIP:

The contractor has to engage competent workers to achieve the workmanship stated in the tender documents. It is expected that best local practices be utilized in case no specific workmanship is identified.

3) DRAWINGS:

- a) The contractor has to abide to any additional detail or general drawings issued by the engineer and will be considered as part of the contract.
- b) The contractor shall carry out onsite survey works and develop detailed shop drawings for all works and submit for the Engineer's approval. No activity can be started unless engineer approves relevant shop drawing.
- c) The contractor should submit three copies of the shop drawings a week ahead of required approval. In case of changes required, the contractor will resubmit the drawings with changes and obtain approval before execution of works.
- **4)** As-Built Drawings:

The contractor is responsible to submit as-built drawings before the preliminary handing over in four (4) hard copies A1 size and four (4) CDs. They should show all details (architectural, structural,

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mechanical, and electrical along with services routes, trenches, manholes, levels, etc)

In case the contractor fails to deliver the As-built drawings and/or technical reports (including all rates for undelivered reports as quoted in the original bill) as required and to the satisfaction of the UNDP engineer, then UNDP shall deduct the sum of USD 5.000 from the dues of the contractor.

- **5)** (if needed) The contractor shall construct all mock-ups and provide samples as specified and as required in the contract documents at his own cost and expense.
- 6) Discrepancies and mistakes in tender documents:
- a) In case there is discrepancy in the tender documents, the UNDP Engineer will verify the correct specification of any item in the tendering stage.
- b) In case there is missing information in the contract documents or discrepancy or review and approval of the engineer, improper description of details of the items, it doesn't relieve the contractor from carrying out the item in the most correct manner as if identified and properly described in the original tender documents.
- c) The contractor has to acknowledge the engineer in case of omission, discrepancy or mistakes in the tender documents in the tendering stage and price according to the engineer's answer.
 - d) In the case of an inconsistency between Drawings and Specifications or within either Document, not clarified by addendum, the better quality or greater quantity of Work shall be provided in accordance with the UNDP Engineer's interpretation.

7) INSPECTION OF SITE:

The contractor is deemed to have visited and investigated the site and identified all site conditions in terms of ground nature, accessibility to site, availability of services like water & electricity and all factors affecting execution of work activities before submitting his offer. All such factors are deemed to be taken into consideration while pricing.

8) SUB-CONTRACTORS:

Sub- contractors are dealt with according to General Conditions of Contract. The main contractor should submit to the Engineer; the certified agreement between him and the subcontractor prior to commencement of the work.

9) EQUIVALENCE AND ENGINEER'S INSTRUCTION:

Wherever equivalence and Engineers' instruction are mentioned within the contract documents, they are interpreted to be dealt with and /or executed according to the consent of the engineer.

10) SITE MEETINGS:

Periodical site meetings will be carried out and the contractor or duly authorized delegate should attend the meetings.

11) TESTING:

The contractor at his own expenses shall provide any test as requested by the Engineer's Representative for any materials supplied, installed, or stored in the site according to the stipulated tests in the general specifications. The contractor has to secure devices and equipment that are necessary to test sanitary and electrical works as requested by the Engineer.

12) SPECIFICATIONS:

Contractor has to comply fully with the specifications and codes specified in the tender documents. In case there is no clear or missing specification of items, it is deemed that the contractor has based his prices on high quality materials and best practice in implementation.

13) TAKE OFF QUANTITIES AND PRICING:

a) Description of items

The tender documents are complementary and self-explanatory and what is deemed necessary in one is deemed necessary in all. Accordingly, the item specification is not limited to item description in the bill of quantity but rather to the tender documents as a whole.

b) Quantities
